A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO FLOODING.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that a number of roads 2 that are accessible to the public are privately owned. Many of 3 these roads are in older communities, have not been improved in 4 years, and are in dire need of upgrades. During heavy rains and 5 periods of king tides, these roads are often flooded. The 6 floods result in significant economic damage to surrounding 7 residences and businesses. The legislature also finds that the 8 counties are often reluctant to make or provide funding for 9 improvements to these roads, as the counties believe that 10 assuming those responsibilities will result in county liability 11 for accidents or torts that may subsequently occur on those 12 roads.

13 The legislature further finds that these private roads are 14 often heavily used by first responders to respond to emergencies 15 and by school buses for the transportation of students to and 16 from school. Accordingly, the legislature finds supporting the

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1 maintenance and upkeep of these private roads is in the public 2 interest. 3 The purpose of this Act is to: 4 (1)Appropriate moneys as grants-in-aid to the several 5 counties for the mitigation of flood risks on 6 privately-owned roads; and 7 (2) Provide that the appropriation or expenditure of 8 moneys pursuant to the Act shall not be construed to 9 establish a duty of care or grounds for liability for 10 the State or the several counties. 11 SECTION 2. The appropriation or expenditure of moneys 12 pursuant to the Act shall not be construed to establish a duty 13 of care or grounds for liability for the State or the several 14 counties. SECTION 3. There is appropriated out of the general 15 16 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ or so 17 much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2023-2024 and 18 the same sum or so much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal 19 year 2024-2025 as a grant-in-aid for the mitigation of flood 20 risks on privately-owned roads that are open to public traffic 21 within the island of Oahu.

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1	The sums appropriated shall be expended by the city and
2	county of Honolulu for the purposes of this Act.
3	SECTION 4. There is appropriated out of the general
4	revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ or so
5	much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2023-2024 and
6	the same sum or so much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal
7	year 2024-2025 as a grant-in-aid for the mitigation of flood
8	risks on privately-owned roads that are open to public traffic
9	within the island of Hawaii.
10	The sums appropriated shall be expended by the county of
11	Hawaii for the purposes of this Act.
12	SECTION 5. There is appropriated out of the general
13	revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ or so
14	much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2023-2024 and
15	the same sum or so much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal
16	year 2024-2025 as a grant-in-aid for the mitigation of flood
17	risks on privately-owned roads that are open to public traffic
18	within the islands of Maui, Molokai, and Lanai.
19	The sums appropriated shall be expended by the county of
20	Maui for the purposes of this Act.

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1	SECTION 6. There is appropriated out of the general
2	revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ or so
3	much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2023-2024 and
4	the same sum or so much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal
5	year 2024-2025 as a grant-in-aid for the mitigation of flood
6	risks on privately-owned roads that are open to public traffic
7	within the island of Kauai.
8	The sums appropriated shall be expended by the county of
9	Kauai for the purposes of this Act.
10	SECTION 7. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 3000.
