#### A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO EXEMPTIONS FROM CIVIL SERVICE FOR POSITIONS IN THE DEPARTMENT OF HUMAN SERVICES.

#### BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The purpose of this Act is to permanently
- 2 exempt from provisions of civil service the following positions
- 3 in the department of human services: the information technology
- 4 implementation manager, the assistant information technology
- 5 implementation manager, the resource manager, the
- 6 community/project development director, the policy director, the
- 7 special assistant to the director, the limited English
- 8 proficiency project manager/coordinator, and the business
- 9 technology analyst.
- 10 SECTION 2. Section 76-16, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 11 amended by amending subsection (b) to read as follows:
- "(b) The civil service to which this chapter applies shall
- 13 comprise all positions in the State now existing or hereafter
- 14 established and embrace all personal services performed for the
- 15 State, except the following:

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1	(1)	Commissioned and enlisted personnel of the Hawaii
2		National Guard as such, and positions in the Hawaii
3		National Guard that are required by state or federal
4		laws or regulations or orders of the National Guard to
5		be filled from those commissioned or enlisted
6		personnel;

- (2) Positions filled by persons employed by contract where the director of human resources development has certified that the service is special or unique or is essential to the public interest and that, because of circumstances surrounding its fulfillment, personnel to perform the service cannot be obtained through normal civil service recruitment procedures. Any such contract may be for any period not exceeding one year;
- (3) Positions that must be filled without delay to comply with a court order or decree if the director determines that recruitment through normal recruitment civil service procedures would result in delay or noncompliance, such as the Felix-Cayetano consent decree;

1	(4)	Positions filled by the legislature or by either house
2		or any committee thereof;
3	(5)	Employees in the office of the governor and office of
4		the lieutenant governor, and household employees at
5		Washington Place;
6	(6)	Positions filled by popular vote;
7	(7)	Department heads, officers, and members of any board,
8		commission, or other state agency whose appointments
9		are made by the governor or are required by law to be
10		confirmed by the senate;
11	(8)	Judges, referees, receivers, masters, jurors, notaries
12		public, land court examiners, court commissioners, and
13		attorneys appointed by a state court for a special
14		temporary service;
15	(9)	One bailiff for the chief justice of the supreme court
16		who shall have the powers and duties of a court
17		officer and bailiff under section 606-14; one
18		secretary or clerk for each justice of the supreme
19		court, each judge of the intermediate appellate court,
20		and each judge of the circuit court; one secretary for

the judicial council; one deputy administrative

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director of the courts; three law clerks for the chief
justice of the supreme court, two law clerks for each
associate justice of the supreme court and each judge
of the intermediate appellate court, one law clerk for
each judge of the circuit court, two additional law
clerks for the civil administrative judge of the
circuit court of the first circuit, two additional law
clerks for the criminal administrative judge of the
circuit court of the first circuit, one additional law
clerk for the senior judge of the family court of the
first circuit, two additional law clerks for the civil
motions judge of the circuit court of the first
circuit, two additional law clerks for the criminal
motions judge of the circuit court of the first
circuit, and two law clerks for the administrative
judge of the district court of the first circuit; and
one private secretary for the administrative director
of the courts, the deputy administrative director of
the courts, each department head, each deputy or first
assistant, and each additional deputy, or assistant
deputy, or assistant defined in paragraph (16);

9			area superintendents, deputy and assistant
10			superintendents, other certificated personnel,
11			not more than twenty noncertificated
12			administrative, professional, and technical
13			personnel not engaged in instructional work;
14		(B)	Effective July 1, 2003, teaching assistants,
15			educational assistants, bilingual/bicultural
16			school-home assistants, school psychologists,
17			psychological examiners, speech pathologists,
18			athletic health care trainers, alternative school
19			work study assistants, alternative school
20			educational/supportive services specialists,
21			alternative school project coordinators, and

1			communications aides in the department of
2			education;
3		(C)	The special assistant to the state librarian and
4			one secretary for the special assistant to the
5			state librarian; and
6		(D)	Members of the faculty of the University of
7			Hawaii, including research workers, extension
8			agents, personnel engaged in instructional work,
9			and administrative, professional, and technical
10			personnel of the university;
11	(12)	Empl	oyees engaged in special, research, or
12		demo	nstration projects approved by the governor;
13	(13)	(A)	Positions filled by inmates, patients of state
14			institutions, persons with severe physical or
15			mental disabilities participating in the work
16			experience training programs;
17		(B)	Positions filled with students in accordance with
18			guidelines for established state employment
19			programs; and
20		(C)	Positions that provide work experience training
21			or temporary public service employment that are

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1		filled by persons entering the workforce or
2		persons transitioning into other careers under
3		programs such as the federal Workforce Investment
4		Act of 1998, as amended, or the Senior Community
5		Service Employment Program of the Employment and
6		Training Administration of the United States
7		Department of Labor, or under other similar state
8		programs;
9	(14)	A custodian or guide at Iolani Palace, the Royal
10		Mausoleum, and Hulihee Palace;
11	(15)	Positions filled by persons employed on a fee,
12		contract, or piecework basis, who may lawfully perform
13		their duties concurrently with their private business
14		or profession or other private employment and whose
15		duties require only a portion of their time, if it is
16		impracticable to ascertain or anticipate the portion
17		of time to be devoted to the service of the State;
18	(16)	Positions of first deputies or first assistants of
19		each department head appointed under or in the manner
20		provided in section 6, article V, of the Hawaii State
21		Constitution; three additional deputies or assistants

1		either in charge of the highways, harbors, and
2		airports divisions or other functions within the
3		department of transportation as may be assigned by the
4		director of transportation, with the approval of the
5		governor; four additional deputies in the department
6		of health, each in charge of one of the following:
7		behavioral health, environmental health, hospitals,
8		and health resources administration, including other
9		functions within the department as may be assigned by
10		the director of health, with the approval of the
11		governor; two additional deputies in charge of the law
12		enforcement programs, administration, or other
13		functions within the department of law enforcement as
14		may be assigned by the director of law enforcement,
15		with the approval of the governor; an administrative
16		assistant to the state librarian; and an
17		administrative assistant to the superintendent of
18		education;
19	(17)	Positions specifically exempted from this part by any
20		other law; provided that:

1		(A) Any exemption created after July 1, 2014, shall
2		expire three years after its enactment unless
3		affirmatively extended by an act of the
4		legislature; and
5		(B) All of the positions defined by paragraph (9)
6		shall be included in the position classification
7		plan;
8	(18)	Positions in the state foster grandparent program and
9		positions for temporary employment of senior citizens
10		in occupations in which there is a severe personnel
11		shortage or in special projects;
12	(19)	Household employees at the official residence of the
13		president of the University of Hawaii;
14	(20)	Employees in the department of education engaged in
15		the supervision of students during meal periods in the
16		distribution, collection, and counting of meal
17		tickets, and in the cleaning of classrooms after
18		school hours on a less than half-time basis;
19	(21)	Employees hired under the tenant hire program of the
20		Hawaii public housing authority; provided that not
21		more than twenty-six per cent of the authority's

1		workforce in any housing project maintained or
2		operated by the authority shall be hired under the
3		tenant hire program;
4	(22)	Positions of the federally funded expanded food and
5		nutrition program of the University of Hawaii that
6		require the hiring of nutrition program assistants who
7		live in the areas they serve;
8	(23)	Positions filled by persons with severe disabilities
9		who are certified by the state vocational
10		rehabilitation office that they are able to perform
11		safely the duties of the positions;
12	(24)	The sheriff;
13	(25)	A gender and other fairness coordinator hired by the
14		judiciary;
15	(26)	Positions in the Hawaii National Guard youth and adult
16		education programs;
17	(27)	In the state energy office in the department of
18		business, economic development, and tourism, all
19		energy program managers, energy program specialists,
20		energy program assistants, and energy analysts;



1	(28)	Administrative appeals hearing officers in the
2		department of human services;
3	(29)	In the Med-QUEST division of the department of human
4		services, the division administrator, finance officer,
5		health care services branch administrator, medical
6		director, and clinical standards administrator;
7	(30)	In the director's office of the department of human
8		services, the enterprise officer, information security
9		and privacy compliance officer, security and privacy
10		compliance engineer, [and] security and privacy
11		compliance analyst[+], the information technology
12		implementation manager, the assistant information
13		technology implementation manager, the resource
14		manager, the community/project development director,
15		the policy director, the special assistant to the
16		director, and the limited English proficiency project
17		manager/coordinator;
18	(31)	The Alzheimer's disease and related dementia services
19		coordinator in the executive office on aging;
20	(32)	In the Hawaii emergency management agency, the
21		executive officer, public information officer, civil



1		defense administrative officer, branch chiefs, and
2		emergency operations center state warning point
3		personnel; provided that, for state warning point
4		personnel, the director shall determine that
5		recruitment through normal civil service recruitment
6		procedures would result in delay or noncompliance;
7	(33)	The executive director and seven full-time
8		administrative positions of the school facilities
9		authority;
10	(34)	Positions in the Mauna Kea stewardship and oversight
11		authority; [and]
12	[+] (35) [-	] In the office of homeland security of the department
13		of defense, the statewide interoperable communications
14		coordinator[-]; and
15	(36)	In the social services division of the department of
16		human services, the business technology analyst.
17	The	director shall determine the applicability of this
18	section t	o specific positions.
19	Noth	ing in this section shall be deemed to affect the civil
20	service s	tatus of any incumbent as it existed on July 1, 1955."
