A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO EDUCATION.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that books and other
- 2 instructional materials are needed in alternate accessible
- 3 formats for use by elementary and secondary school students who
- 4 are unable to use print as their primary learning media. The
- 5 federal Individuals with Disabilities Education Improvement Act
- 6 of 2004, P.L. 108-446, made important changes to the law,
- 7 including the establishment of the National Instructional
- 8 Materials Accessibility Standard and the National Instructional
- 9 Materials Access Center, which serves as a central repository
- 10 for files formatted in accordance with the National
- 11 Instructional Materials Accessibility Standard and as a conduit
- 12 for the distribution of those files to schools.
- 13 The legislature further finds that existing state law
- 14 pertaining to instructional materials for exceptional children
- 15 directs publishers to meet requirements that are now out of date
- 16 and undesirable due to advances in technology. Thus, a revision
- 17 is necessary to harmonize existing state law with the existing

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- 1 federal law and practice, including technological advancements
- 2 that make more instructional materials available in appropriate
- 3 accessible formats.
- 4 Accordingly, the purpose of this Act is to:
- 5 (1) Provide for the timely availability of accessible
- 6 instructional materials and technology for eligible
- 7 students; and
- **8** (2) Ensure that such materials are distributed to eligible
- 9 students in accordance with the federal Individuals
- 10 with Disabilities Education Act, as amended, and the
- federal Copyright Act of 1976, as amended.
- 12 SECTION 2. Section 302A-442.5, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 13 amended to read as follows:
- 14 "§302A-442.5 Instructional materials; exceptional
- 15 children. (a) Whenever used in this section, unless a
- 16 different meaning clearly appears from the context:
- "Accessible format" has the same meaning as in section
- 18 121(d)(1) of the federal Copyright Act of 1976 (17 U.S.C.
- 19 121(d)(1)), as amended.
- "Accessible instructional materials" means print
- 21 instructional materials provided to eligible students in the

1	accessible	format most appropriate to the needs of each eligible
2	student.	
3	<u>"</u> Assi	stive technology device" has the same meaning as in
4	section 60	2(1) of the federal Individuals with Disabilities
5	Education	Act (20 U.S.C. 1401(1)), as amended.
6	"Assi	stive technology service" has the same meaning as in
7	section 602(2) of the federal Individuals with Disabilities	
8	Education .	Act (20 U.S.C. 1401(2)), as amended.
9	"Braille" means the system of reading and writing through	
10	touch commonly known as standard English braille.	
11	"Eligible student" means an elementary or secondary school	
12	student who:	
13	(1)	Is eligible for services under the federal Individuals
14		with Disabilities Education Act, as amended;
15	(2)	Is approved as an eligible person, as defined in
16		section 121(d)(3) of the federal Copyright Act of 1976
17		(17 U.S.C. 121(d)(3)), as amended; and
18	(3)	Attends a department school, a private school under
19		chapter 302C, a public charter school under chapter
20		302D, or an approved alternative education program
21		under section 302A-1132(a)(5).

1 "National Instructional Materials Access Center" means the center established pursuant to section 674(e) of the federal 2 3 Individuals with Disabilities Education Act (20 U.S.C. 1474(e)), 4 as amended. 5 "National Instructional Materials Accessibility Standard" 6 has the same meaning as in section 674(e)(3)(B) of the federal 7 Individuals with Disabilities Education Act (20 U.S.C. 8 1474(e)(3)(B)), as amended. 9 "Print instructional materials" means printed textbooks and 10 related printed core materials that are written and published 11 primarily for use in elementary school and secondary school instruction by students in the classroom. 12 13 "Technology mediated instruction" means learning that is 14 aided or entirely accomplished through the use of computer-based 15 technology. 16 [All publishers of textbooks and instructional 17 materials sold to the State or any public school shall furnish 18 computer diskettes for literary subjects in the American 19 Standard Code for Information Interchange from which braille 20 versions can be produced. Publishers shall also furnish 21 computer diskettes in American Standard Code for Information

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1	interchange for nonliterary subjects including natural sciences,
2	computer science, mathematics, and music when braille specialty
3	code translation software is available.] In accordance with
4	section 612(a)(23) of the federal Individuals with Disabilities
5	Education Act (20 U.S.C. 1412(a)(23)), as amended, the State
6	adopts the United States Secretary of Education's National
7	Instructional Materials Accessibility Standard as in effect on
8	the effective date of Act , Session Laws of Hawaii 2023, and
9	as may be subsequently revised. The department shall coordinate
10	with the National Instructional Materials Access Center to
11	obtain the benefits of this service.
12	(c) [This section shall not apply to publishers of
13	textbooks and instructional materials written in the Hawaiian
14	language.] The department, as part of any print instructional
15	materials adoption process, procurement contract, or other
16	practice or instrument used for purchase of print instructional
17	materials, including digital materials, shall:
18	(1) Obtain instructional materials from the publisher or
19	other source that are in, or can be rendered in, the
20	appropriate accessible format for the eligible student
21	using the instructional material; or

1	(2)	If the needed instructional materials cannot be
2		obtained in the eligible student's appropriate
3		accessible format, the department shall enter into a
4		written contract with the publisher of the print
5		instructional materials to require the publisher to
6		prepare and, on or before delivery of the print
7		instructional materials, provide to the National
8		Instructional Materials Access Center electronic files
9		containing the contents of the print instructional
10		materials using the National Instructional Materials
11		Accessibility Standard.
12	(d)	The department shall obtain accessible instructional
13	materials	for eligible students attending any department school
14	and, to t	he maximum extent allowed, assist any private school
15	under cha	pter 302C, public charter school under chapter 302D, or
16	eligible	student enrolled in an approved alternative education
17	program p	ursuant to section 302A-1132(a)(5), to obtain
18	instructi	onal materials in accessible formats when the
19	departmen	t receives a request from the school or program;
20	provided	that the department shall not be liable for the expense
21	of any in	structional materials obtained other than the expense

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1	for instructional materials obtained for eligible students
2	attending department schools.
3	(e) Each eligible student shall receive accessible
4	instructional materials without regard to whether the accessible
5	instructional materials have been purchased in accordance with
6	subsection (c). Eligible students shall receive accessible
7	instructional materials at the same time the corresponding print
8	instructional materials are provided to all other students in
9	the classroom, including any assistive technology device and
10	assistive technology service to be provided in advance and
11	needed for the eligible student to use the accessible
12	instructional materials.
13	(f) Technology shall be provided to each eligible student
14	receiving technology mediated instruction, including any
15	assistive technology device and assistive technology service
16	needed for the technology to be accessible to and usable by the
17	eligible student.
18	(g) The individualized education program for an eligible
19	<pre>student shall:</pre>

(1) Contain information sufficient to document approval of

the student as an eligible person, as defined in

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1		section 121(d)(3) of the federal Copyright Act of 1976
2		(17 U.S.C. 121(d)(3)), as amended;
3	(2)	<pre>Identify:</pre>
4		(A) The print instruction materials to be used by the
5		students without disabilities;
6		(B) All accessible formats of the instructional
7		materials; and
8		(C) The services and instruction to be provided to
9		convert the print instructional materials into
10		accessible instructional materials and enable the
11		eligible student to use the instructional
12		materials in one or more accessible formats
13		usable by the eligible student;
14	(3)	If the eligible student is blind and receiving
15		instruction in braille or the use of braille, ensure
16		that instructional materials are provided in braille
17		and may be used by the eligible student in addition to
18		other accessible formats available;
19	(4)	List any assistive technology device and assistive
20		technology service needed for the eligible student to
21		use accessible instructional materials and technology

1		mediated instruction, including timely and appropriate
2		instruction to enable the eligible student to use the
3		technology to access age-appropriate content
4		independently;
5	(5)	Ensure that any assistive technology device or
6		assistive technology service used for accessible
7		instructional materials is available for use by the
8		eligible student in school, at home, and in other
9		settings to the same extent that print instructional
10		materials are available to other students; and
11	(6)	Identify and provide technology to be used by an
12		eligible student when receiving technology mediated
13		instruction, including any assistive technology device
14		and assistive technology service needed for the
15		technology to be accessible to and usable by the
16		eligible student."
17	SECT	ION 3. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
18	and stric	ken. New statutory material is underscored.
19	SECT	ION 4. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 3000.
