A BILL FOR AN ACT

PROPOSING AN AMENDMENT TO ARTICLE III, SECTION 4, OF THE CONSTITUTION OF THE STATE OF HAWAII TO AMEND PROCEDURES TO ELECT LEGISLATORS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that California and 2 Washington have successfully implemented an "open primary top 3 two" process. Under this process, any candidate who receives a 4 majority of votes in a primary election is deemed elected to the 5 seat at the primary election. If no candidate receives a majority in a primary election, this process allows the two 6 7 candidates who receive the highest number of votes in a primary 8 election to advance to the general election, regardless of the 9 political party affiliations of those candidates. The 10 legislature notes that this process allows all voters to vote 11 for their preferred candidates, across political party lines. 12 This gives voters greater freedom in choosing candidates and 13 provides all political candidates with an equal opportunity of 14 advancing to a general election.

Accordingly, the purpose of this Act is to proposeamendments to the Constitution of the State of Hawaii to provide

7	SECTION 2. Article III, section 4, of the Constitution of
8	the State of Hawaii is amended to read as follows:
9	"ELECTION OF MEMBERS; TERM
10	Section 4. Each member of the legislature shall be elected
11	at an election. If [more than one candidate has been nominated]
12	there are two or more candidates for election to a seat in the
13	legislature, [the member occupying that seat] <u>there</u> shall be
14	[elected at] a [general] primary election[-] for that seat. If
15	no candidate receives a majority of the votes cast for that seat
16	in a primary election, the two candidates who receive the
17	highest number of votes in the primary election, regardless of
18	political party affiliation, shall be the only candidates for
19	that seat to advance to the general election, in which the
20	candidate receiving the highest number of votes cast for that
21	seat shall be elected to the seat. If any candidate receives a

1 simple majority of the votes cast for a seat in the primary 2 election, that candidate shall be deemed elected to that seat. 3 If a candidate [nominated] for a seat [at a primary election] in 4 the legislature is unopposed for that seat [at the general 5 election], the candidate shall be deemed elected at the primary 6 election. The term of office of a member of the house of 7 representatives shall be two years and the term of office of a 8 member of the senate shall be four years. The term of a member 9 of the legislature shall begin on the day of the general 10 election at which elected or if elected at a primary election, 11 on the day of the general election immediately following the 12 primary election at which elected. For a member of the house of 13 representatives, the term shall end on the day of the general election immediately following the day the member's term 14 15 commences. For a member of the senate, the term shall end on 16 the day of the second general election immediately following the 17 day the member's term commences."

18 SECTION 3. The question to be printed on the ballot shall
19 be as follows:

20 "Shall the Hawaii State Constitution be amended to provide21 that in an election for a legislative seat, the two candidates

1 who receive the highest number of votes in a primary election, 2 regardless of political party, shall be the only two candidates 3 to advance to a general election; provided that if any candidate 4 receives a simple majority of votes, the candidate shall be 5 deemed elected to that seat at the primary election?" 6 SECTION 4. Constitutional material to be repealed is 7 bracketed and stricken. New constitutional material is 8 underscored. 9 SECTION 5. This amendment shall take effect upon 10 compliance with article XVII, section 3, of the Constitution of 11 the State of Hawaii. 12
