A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO THE STATE FOUNDATION ON CULTURE AND THE ARTS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECTION 1. Chapter 9, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is amended
2	by adding two new sections to be appropriately designated and to
3	read as follows:
4	"§9- Art in private places and performing arts
5	committee. (a) There is established an art in private places
6	and performing arts committee to be placed in the state
7	foundation on culture and the arts for administrative purposes.
8	(b) The art in private places and performing arts
9	committee shall consist of the following members:
10	(1) The executive director of the state foundation on
11	culture and the arts, or their designee, who shall
12	serve as chairperson;
13	(2) The chairpersons of the senate and house of
14	representatives standing committees whose purview is
15	culture and the arts; and
16	(3) Two members who represent the performing arts
17	community.

1	<u>(c)</u>	The art in private places and performing arts
2	committee	shall establish the art in private places pilot
3	program a	nd performing arts pilot program, under which the
4	committee	shall:
5	(1)	Oversee the implementation of the art in private
6		places program;
7	(2)	Solicit proposals for performing arts grants;
8	(3)	Review grant proposals and select proposals
9		appropriate for funding; and
10	(4)	Evaluate outcomes of grant proposals.
11	(d)	The art in private places and performing arts
12	committee	shall submit annual reports of:
13	(1)	The status of the art in private places program and
14		the revenue generated from the program; and
15	(2)	Funded performing arts proposals and the outcomes of
16		each event,
17	to the leg	gislature no later than twenty days prior to the
18	convening	of each regular session beginning with the regular
19	session of	E 2024.

1	<u>§9-</u>	Performing arts special account. (a) There is
2	establish	ed in the state treasury the performing arts special
3	account i	nto which shall be deposited:
4	(1)	Revenues from performing arts pilot program;
5	(2)	Gifts, grants, and other funds for performing arts
6		accepted by the foundation;
7	(3)	Appropriations by the legislature to the performing
8		arts special account; and
9	(4)	All interest and revenues or receipts derived by the
10		foundation from performing arts events, including:
11		(A) Rents, fees, and charges for the use of
12		facilities;
13		(B) Concession agreements and other use agreements;
14		and
15		(C) Revenues generated from agreements to record
16		performances negotiated by the foundation.
17	Moneys in	the account shall be used for the coordination,
18	planning,	promotion, marketing, and execution of performing arts
19	events; p	rovided that not more than per cent shall be used
20	for admin	istrative expenses."

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1	SECTION 2. Chapter 9, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is amended
2	by amending the title of part III to read as follows:
3	"[+]PART III.[+] ART IN PUBLIC PLACES AND RELOCATABLE WORKS of
4	[+] ART [+] PROGRAMS, PERFORMING ARTS, AND STATE ART MUSEUM"
5	SECTION 3. Section 9-21, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
6	amended to read as follows:
7	"[+]§9-21[+] Purpose. The foundation shall administer the
8	art in public places and relocatable works of art programs,
9	pursuant to section 103-8.5, the performing arts pilot program,
10	and the state art museum to achieve the following purposes:
11	(1) Replace in public state buildings the natural beauty
12	displaced in construction with works of art expressive
13	of the State's cultural, creative, and traditional
14	arts of its various ethnic groups;
15	(2) Support, promote, and recognize excellence of the
16	State's diverse cultural, creative, and traditional
17	artists; [and]
18	(3) Create, display, and maintain in public places and the
19	state art museum a collection of works of art that:
20	(A) Represents the diversity and excellence of the
21	State's artistic expression; and

1	(B) Provides to all the citizens of the State the
2	fullest possible access to the highest quality
3	aesthetic and educational experiences
4	available[-]; and
5	(4) Coordinate, plan, promote, market, and execute the
6	performing arts program.
7	As used in this part, "performing arts" include arts or
8	skills that are intended to be performed before an audience
9	including, dance, singing, musical performances, and theatre."
10	SECTION 4. There is appropriated out of the general
11	revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ or so
12	much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2023-2024 and
13	the same sum or so much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal
14	year 2024-2025 to the state foundation on culture and the arts
15	for:
16	(1) The art in private places and performing arts pilot
17	programs; provided that for purposes of this
18	paragraph, "private places" means non-state owned
19	publicly accessible areas and city and county
20	buildings; and

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- 1 (2) The establishment of one full-time equivalent (1.0
- 2 FTE) permanent position.
- 3 The sums appropriated shall be expended by the state
- 4 foundation on culture and the arts for the purposes of this Act.
- 5 SECTION 5. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
- 6 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.
- 7 SECTION 6. This Act shall take effect on June 30, 3000.

Description:

Establishes the Art in Private Places and Performing Arts Committee to establish the Art in Private Places and Performing Arts Pilot Programs to select, review, and fund grant proposals for performing arts events. Clarifies the scope of the State Foundation on Culture and the Arts' responsibilities to include administration of the Performing Arts Pilot Program. Appropriates funds to the state foundation on culture and the arts for the Art in Private Places and Performing Arts Pilot Programs and to establish one position for the State Foundation on Culture and the Arts. Requires annual reports to the Legislature. Effective 6/30/3000. (SD1)

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
