There is appropriated out of the general 2 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ or so 3 much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2023-2024 and the same sum or so much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal 4 5 year 2024-2025 for the purpose of funding grants for the leave 6 grant pilot program established pursuant to section 1 of this 7 Act. 8 The sums appropriated shall be expended by the department 9 of business, economic development, and tourism for the purposes 10 of this Act. 11 SECTION 3. There is appropriated out of the general 12 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ or so 13 much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2023-2024 and

14 the same sum or so much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal 15 year 2024-2025 for administrative expenses, including personnel 16 wages and salaries, for the leave grant pilot program

17 established pursuant to section 1 of this Act.

18 The sums appropriated shall be expended by the department 19 of business, economic development, and tourism for the purposes 20 of this Act.
