
A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO CHILD CARE.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that in the first quarter
2 of fiscal year 2022-2023, more than fifteen thousand families
3 received child care connection Hawaii subsidies to help them
4 afford care for children ages six weeks to thirteen years. The
5 legislature also finds that families face the greatest
6 difficulty finding child care when children are infants and
7 toddlers due to the shortage of child care providers caring for
8 those age groups. The legislature further finds that child care
9 providers can be disrupted and face possible closure when their
10 operating costs are funded by tuition fees because their
11 revenues depend upon ever-changing enrollment figures.

12 Accordingly, the purpose of this Act is to:

13 (1) Establish a two-year infant and toddler child care
14 contracted slots pilot program to develop and
15 implement procedures to subsidize child care slots in
16 licensed infant and toddler child care settings; and



1 (2) Appropriate funds for the infant and toddler child
2 care contracted slots pilot program.

3 SECTION 2. (a) The department of human services shall
4 establish and implement a two-year infant and toddler child care
5 contracted slots pilot program no later than six months after
6 the effective date of this Act.

7 (b) The department of human services shall develop
8 standards, policies, and procedures to contract directly with
9 child care providers to serve child care connection Hawaii
10 families.

11 (c) The pilot program shall, at a minimum, meet the
12 following requirements:

13 (1) The pilot program shall provide infant and toddler
14 slots in licensed infant and toddler child care
15 centers and registered family child care homes;

16 (2) The pilot program shall provide for at least one
17 hundred slots with at least one slot contracted for on
18 each of the islands of Hawaii, Kauai, Maui, Molokai,
19 and Oahu; and

20 (3) Contracts with child care providers shall last a
21 minimum of two years.



1 (d) The department of human services may contract with a
2 service provider in accordance with chapter 103D, Hawaii Revised
3 Statutes, to operate the infant and toddler child care
4 contracted slots pilot program.

5 SECTION 3. (a) The department of human services shall
6 submit annual reports on the development and implementation of
7 the infant and toddler child care contracted slots pilot
8 program, including impacts to child care provider stability,
9 family satisfaction, and any proposed legislation, to the
10 legislature no later than twenty days prior to the convening of
11 the regular sessions of 2024, 2025, and 2026.

12 (b) The department of human services shall submit a final
13 report on the infant and toddler child care contracted slots
14 pilot program, including impacts to child care provider
15 stability, family satisfaction, and any proposed legislation, to
16 the legislature no later than twenty days prior to the convening
17 of the regular session of 2027.

18 SECTION 4. There is appropriated out of the general
19 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ or so
20 much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2023-2024 and
21 the same sum or so much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal


1 year 2024-2025 for the infant and toddler child care contracted
2 slots pilot program established by section 2 of this Act.

3 The sums appropriated shall be expended by the department
4 of human services for the purposes of this Act.

5 SECTION 5. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2023, and
6 shall be repealed on June 30, 2026.
