

A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO NATIVE HAWAIIAN HEALTH.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that according to the 2 United States Department of Health and Human Services Office of 3 Minority Health, in 2014, people of Native Hawaiian and Pacific 4 Islander ethnicity were ten per cent more likely to be diagnosed 5 with coronary heart disease than non-Hispanic white individuals. 6 The Office of Minority Health has also noted that in comparison 7 to other ethnic groups, Native Hawaiians and Pacific Islanders 8 have higher rates of smoking, alcohol consumption, and obesity; 9 less access to cancer prevention and control programs; and a 10 tuberculosis rate that in 2019 was thirty-seven times higher 11 than the rate for non-Hispanic whites. Additionally, the 12 leading causes of death among Native Hawaiians include cancer, 13 heart disease, unintentional injuries, stroke, and diabetes. 14 The legislature also finds that as of March 2021, Native 15 Hawaiians and Pacific Islanders had the highest per capita 16 coronavirus disease 2019 (COVID-19) death rate in eighteen of

twenty states reporting deaths on this population group. Yet,

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1 researchers at the University of California, Irvine program in
2 public health found that Native Hawaiian and Pacific Islander
3 communities currently receive a fraction of the resources that
4 they need to contain COVID-19 outbreaks and address other health
5 problems, in part due to persisting socioeconomic inequalities
6 and gaps in community data.

7 The legislature further finds that Senate Resolution No. 8 60, S.D.1, Regular Session of 2014, created a Native Hawaiian 9 health task force to make recommendations about pathways for 10 improving the health of native Hawaiians. The goal of the task 11 force was to articulate priority areas to advance health equity 12 for Native Hawaiians and, in turn, elevate the health of 13 Hawaii's entire population. The task force's work was 14 community- and land-focused, emphasized Native Hawaiian values 15 and aspirations, and recognized past efforts toward improving 16 the health status of Native Hawaiians. One of the task force's 17 key recommendations was to establish an office of Native 18 Hawaiian health within the department of health to advance the 19 social, physical, psychological, and emotional health of Native 20 Hawaiian and Pacific Islander communities.

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1	Acco	rdingly, the purpose of this Act is to uplift the	
2	health and	d welfare of the Hawaiian community by creating an	
3	office of	Native Hawaiian health within the department of	
4	health.		
5	SECTION 2. Chapter 321, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is		
6	amended by adding a new section to be appropriately designated		
7	and to read as follows:		
8	" <u>§32</u>	1- Office of Native Hawaiian health. (a) There is	
9	establish	ed an office of Native Hawaiian health that shall be	
10	administr	atively attached to the department of health.	
11	(b)	The mission of the office of Native Hawaiian health	
12	shall be to:		
13	(1)	Serve as the department of health's focal point for	
14		Native Hawaiian health equity by ensuring the	
15		development of plans, strategies, actions, and	
16		programs to address the health disparities experienced	
17		by Native Hawaiians;	
18	(2)	Create relevant metrics, collect data, track, and	
19		report on significant health disparities and trends	
20		affecting Native Hawaiians;	

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1	(3)	Seek funding and support for Native Hawaiian health
2		services presently being delivered by governmental and
3		nongovernmental agencies, including but not limited to
4		federally qualified health centers, Papa Ola Lokahi,
5		Native Hawaiian Health Centers, and other qualified
6		agencies presently funded under the federal Native
7		Hawaiian Health Care Act of 1988; and
8	(4)	Pursue additional funding and support for research
9		regarding Native Hawaiian health disparities,
10		including but not limited to research being conducted
11		by the University of Hawaii John A. Burns school of
12		medicine.
13	(c)	No later than twenty days prior to the convening of
14	each regu	lar session, the office of Native Hawaiian health shall
15	submit an	annual report to the legislature regarding the State's
16	progress	toward eliminating health disparities among Native
17	Hawaiians	, including recommendations and any proposed
18	legislati	on to improve health outcomes for Native Hawaiians."
19	SECT	ION 3. There is appropriated out of the general
20	revenues	of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$500,000 or so much
21	thereof a	s may be necessary for fiscal year 2023-2024 and the



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1	same sum or so much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year				
2	2024-2025 for the establishment of the office of Native Hawaiian				
3	health.				
4	The sums appropriated shall be expended by the department				
5	of health for the purposes of this Act.				
6	SECTION 4. New statutory material is underscored.				
7	SECTION 5. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2023.
