A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO SAFE ROUTES TO SCHOOL.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 The legislature finds that transforming SECTION 1. 2 Hawaii's surface transportation systems and infrastructure to 3 prioritize walking, rolling, bicycling, and public transit is at 4 the nexus of the State's commitments to public health, public 5 safety, economic vitality, and environmental sustainability. 6 The most important component of this transformation is ensuring 7 that every child in Hawaii enjoys the infrastructure, social support, confidence, and skills to walk, roll, bike, or bus to 8 9 school.

10 The legislature further finds that ensuring safe routes to school for every keiki will not only protect our most vulnerable 11 12 road users, but also serve as a long-term investment in the 13 future of transportation in the State. However, the legislature 14 recognizes that decades of automobile-centric planning and 15 development have created formidable barriers to this 16 transformation. These barriers include a lack of complete, 17 safe, and comfortable bike and pedestrian networks; burdensome



1 and complicated funding mechanisms for safe routes to school 2 programs and community engagement; a lack of a state safe routes 3 to school plan that creates performance measures, goals, 4 strategies, and accountability; and a lack of coordination of 5 safe routes to school promotion among state and county agencies 6 and community-based organizations. Accordingly, the purpose of this Act is to: 7 8 (1)Establish the safe routes to school advisory committee 9 to develop a comprehensive statewide safe routes to 10 school plan to advise the State on strategies to 11 ensure that each child in the State is able to safely 12 bike, walk, roll, or bus to that child's respective 13 school; and 14 (2) Appropriate moneys for the department of 15 transportation to hire additional staffing, including 16 one full-time equivalent (1.0 FTE) safe routes to 17 school program coordinator, procure facilities and 18 equipment necessary to support the safe routes to 19 school advisory committee, and match federal funding 20 for sidewalks.

14	(6)	The county safe routes to school program coordinator
15		for the county of Kauai;
16	(7)	The county safe routes to school program coordinator
17		for the county of Hawaii;
18	(8)	The county safe routes to school program coordinator
19		for the county of Maui;
20	(9)	One representative from each metropolitan planning
21		organization in the State;



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1	(10)	A representative of the Papa Ola Lokahi Transportation
2		Equity Working Group;
3	(11)	A representative of Hawaii Bicycling League;
4	(12)	A representative of Hawaii Public Health Institute;
5	(13)	A representative of the Statewide Safe Routes to
6		School Coalition; and
7	(14)	Any other individuals that the safe routes to school
8		advisory committee deems appropriate.
9	(f)	The term of each member of the safe routes to school
10	advisory	committee shall be four years; provided that of the
11	members i	nitially appointed, members shall serve for
12	four year	s, members shall serve for three
13	years,	members shall serve for two years, and the
14	remaining	members shall serve for one year.
15	<u>(g)</u>	The safe routes to school advisory committee shall:
16	(1)	Meet no less than monthly to review the State's
17		progress in implementing the State's safe routes to
18		school program; and
19	(2)	Make recommendations to the department of
20		transportation no less than biannually;



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1	provided	that the safe routes to school advisory committee may
2	meet and	make recommendations to the department of
3	transport	ation at additional times as a majority of the members
4	of the sa	fe routes to school advisory committee deems necessary.
5	(h)	The members of the safe routes to school advisory
6	committee	shall serve without compensation but shall be
7	reimburse	d for expenses, including travel expenses, necessary
8	for the p	erformance of their duties."
9	SECT	ION 3. There is appropriated out of the general
10	revenues	of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ or so much
11	thereof a	s may be necessary for fiscal year 2023-2024 and the
12	same sum	or so much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year
13	2024-2025	for the department of transportation to:
14	(1)	Hire additional staffing, including one full-time
15		equivalent (1.0 FTE) safe routes to school program
16		coordinator position;
17	(2)	Procure any facilities and equipment necessary to
18		support the safe routes to school advisory committee;
19		and
20	(3)	Match any federal funds received by the State for
21		costs related to sidewalks.



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1	The sums appropriated shall be expended by the department
2	of transportation for the purposes of this Act.
