
HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES THIRTY-SECOND LEGISLATURE, 2023 STATE OF HAWAII



A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO INFRASTRUCTURE.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that dams and reservoirs 2 are a critical part of Hawaii's infrastructure, providing 3 numerous benefits that the State's communities depend upon. In 4 addition to storing and delivering a reliable source of water 5 for agriculture during dry periods, assisting with flood control during large storms, and helping mitigate erosion and reduce 6 7 sediment runoff to near shore ocean reefs, dams and reservoirs 8 also play an important role in providing drinking water for 9 Hawaii residents.

10 The legislature further finds that the continued 11 availability and operation of dams and reservoirs is extremely 12 important in sustaining the State's water resources and 13 enhancing public safety. By capturing storm water that would 14 otherwise rush to the ocean, reservoirs help recharge the 15 State's groundwater aquifers, which are a primary source for 16 much of Hawaii's drinking water. 1	through the use of hydropower is also another significant		
2	community benefit derived from dams and reservoirs.		
3	The purpose of this Act is to establish a dam and reservoir		
4	working group to ensure and enhance the continued availability		
5	and operation of dams and reservoirs in the State.		
6	SECTION 2. (a) There is established a dam and reservoir		
7	working group, to be placed within the department of land and		
8	natural resources for administrative purposes only.		
9	(b) Without regard to section 26-34, Hawaii Revised		
10	Statutes, the dam and reservoir working group shall consist of		
11	the following members:		
12	(1) The chairperson of the board of land and natural		
13	resources or the chairperson's designee, who shall		
14	serve as the co-chairperson of the working group;		
15	(2) The chairperson of the board of agriculture or the		
16	chairperson's designee, who shall serve as the co-		
17	chairperson of the working group;		
18	(3) The deputy director for water resource management of		
19	the department of land and natural resources or the		
20	deputy director's designee;

1 -	(4)	Two persons appointed by the governor, one of whom
2		shall represent the counties;
3	(5)	One representative from the Hawaii Cattlemen's
4		Council, who shall be invited by the co-chairpersons;
5	(6)	One representative from the Land Use Research
6		Foundation, who shall be invited by the co-
7		chairpersons;
8	(7)	One representative from the Hawaii Farm Bureau, who
9		shall be invited by the co-chairpersons; and
10	(8)	Three owners of dams and reservoirs regulated by the
11		department of land and natural resources, to be
12		selected and invited by the co-chairpersons.
13	Any	vacancies in the working group shall be filled in the
14	manner pr	ovided for in the initial appointments.
15	(c)	The dam and reservoir working group shall:
16	(1)	Review applicable state laws, administrative rules,
17		and operational policies and recommend amendments,
18		modifications, or actions to be taken to ensure and
19		enhance the continued availability and operation of

1 (2)Examine the role dams and reservoirs can play in 2 drought mitigation and the maintenance of a dependable 3 water supply. 4 (d) The dam and reservoir working group shall submit a 5 report of its findings and recommendations, including any 6 proposed legislation, amendments to rules, policy modifications, 7 or other actions, to the legislature no later than twenty days 8 prior to the convening of the regular session of 2024. 9 (e) The members of the working group shall serve without 10 compensation but shall be reimbursed for expenses, including 11 travel expenses, necessary for the performance of their duties. 12 (f) The dam and reservoir working group shall cease to 13 exist on June 30, 2024. 14 SECTION 3. There is appropriated out of the general 15 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ or so 16 much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2023-2024 to 17 support the work of the dam and reservoir working group. 18 The sum appropriated shall be expended by the department of 19 land and natural resources for the purposes of this Act. 20 SECTION 4. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2023. 21
