

A BILL FOR AN ACT

PROPOSING AMENDMENTS TO THE CONSTITUTION OF THE STATE OF HAWAII RELATING TO PUBLIC EDUCATION.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

SECTION 1. The legislature finds Hawaii is the only state in the nation where a single department of education and a single statewide board run all public schools in the state. All other states have school systems broken down into districts within the state, each with their own separate board of education. Hawaii's centralized school board and school system is unlike any other state.

8 The legislature finds that a centralized school system 9 comes with several drawbacks. For example, every public school, 10 regardless of the differences between them, are required to 11 follow the same set of state regulations and guidelines as it 12 relates to education. This system also leaves little room for 13 flexibility in introducing new teaching approaches, or in trying 14 new instructional programming.

15 The legislature finds that entrusting the governance of 16 public schools to citizens elected by their respective

1 communities to oversee their school districts is imperative to a 2 well-functioning school system in the state. With this system in 3 place, elected board members can address the unique education-4 related needs of their respective districts for better tailored 5 improvements in public education. 6 The purpose of this Act is to amend the Constitution of the 7 State of Hawaii to provide for multiple, local school board that 8 are populated with elected board members, in place of the 9 current Board of Education. 10 SECTION 2. Article X, section 2, of the Hawaii 11 Constitution is amended to read as follows: 12 "BOARD OF EDUCATION 13 Section 2. There shall be [a] five [board] boards of 14 education[. The governor shall nominate and, by and with the 15 advice and consent of the senate, appoint the members of the 16 board of education, as provided by law.] composed of members who shall be elected in a nonpartisan manner by qualified voters, as 17 18 provided by law. One board shall cover the entire state, and be 19 composed of members who reside anywhere within the state. The 20 four other boards shall each cover one county area. Each county 21 school board district shall be divided into departmental school

1	districts, as may be provided by law. There shall be at least
2	one member residing in each departmental school district for the
3	county-specific boards of education."
4	SECTION 3. Article XVIII, section 12, of the Hawaii
5	Constitution is amended to read as follows:
6	"BOARD OF EDUCATION TRANSITION
7	Section 12 There shall be a period of transition from the
8	[elected] <u>appointed</u> to the [appointed] <u>elected</u> [board] <u>boards</u> of
9	education, as provided by law."
10	SECTION 3. The question to be printed on the ballot shall
11	be as follows:
12	"Shall the Board of Education be changed from a board
13	appointed by the governor to one statewide board and four
14 ·	countywide boards elected by the qualified voters of the
15	State, as provided by law?"
16	SECTION 4. Constitutional material to be repealed is
17	bracketed and stricken. New constitutional material is
18	underscored.
19	SECTION 5. This amendment shall take effect upon
20	compliance with article XVII, section 3, of the Constitution of
