A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO MENTAL HEALTH.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECTION 1. The legislature finds that there is great					
2	demand for high-quality mental health practitioners. This need					
3	is especially acute as the State continues to deal with the					
4	effects of the coronavirus disease 2019 pandemic. More than					
5	twenty states have addressed the critical need for mental health					
6	practitioners by authorizing provisional licenses for some					
7	mental health practitioners in training.					
8	Accordingly, the purpose of this Act is to expand access to					
9	mental health services in the State by:					
10	(1) Establishing provisional or associate-level licensure					
11	requirements and reimbursement allowances for certain					
12	mental health practitioners in training; and					
13	(2) Allowing psychologist license applicants to sit for					
14	the licensing examination before completing other					
15	requirements.

2	SECTION 2. Chapter 451J, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is					
3	amended by adding a new section to be appropriately designated					
4	and to read as follows:

6	family therapist; services reimbursable. (a) Upon application					
7	and the payment of applicable fees, the department shall grant a					
8	provisional license as an associate marriage and family					
9	therapist to a person who:					
10	(1) Has completed a master's degree or doctoral degree					
11	from an accredited educational institution in marriag					
12	and family therapy, or an allied field related to the					
13	practice of mental health counseling, that includes or					
14	is supplemented by graduate level course work					
15	comprising a minimum of thirty-three semester hours,					
16	or forty-four quarter hours, in the following course					
17	areas:					
18	(A) Marriage and family studiesnine semester or

20	(B) Marriage and family therapy studiesnine					
21	semester or twelve quarter hours;					



1		(C) Human developmentnine semester or twelve
2		quarter hours;
3		(D) Ethical and professional studiesthree semester
4		or four quarter hours; and
5		(E) Researchthree semester or four quarter hours;
6	(2)	Has completed a one-year practicum with three hundred
7		hours of supervised client contact;
8	(3)	Has passed the National Marriage and Family Therapy
9		Exam in accordance with section 451J-8; and
10	(4)	Engages in practice as an associate marriage and
11		family therapist under the clinical supervision of a
12		licensed marriage and family therapist during the
13		period of time necessary to fulfill the requirements
14		for licensure as a marriage and family therapist
15		pursuant to section 451J-7; provided that the
16		supervising licensed marriage and family therapist
17		shall be in good standing with the department.
18	(b)	Each provisional license shall include the name and
19	title of	the supervising licensed marriage and family therapist
20	<u>or therap</u>	ists described in subsection (a)(4). A provisional
21	licensee	or licensed associate marriage and family therapist may



1	only practice marriage and family therapy under the direct				
2	supervision of a licensed marriage and family therapist.				
3	(c) A provisional license issued pursuant to this section				
4	shall be valid for one year from the date of issuance and may be				
5	renewed for an additional one-year period if needed to fulfill				
6	the requirements for licensure as a marriage and family				
7	therapist pursuant to section 451J-7.				
8	(d) Services provided by a supervised licensed associate				
9	marriage and family therapist shall be eligible for insurance				
10	reimbursement if:				
11	(1) The supervising licensed marriage and family				
12	therapist's services are eligible for reimbursement as				
13	a contracted provider; and				
14	(2) The billed rate for the licensed associate marriage				
15	and family therapist is commensurate with the				
16	requisite level of training."

4	Clinical supervision may include direct observation by the			
5	qualified supervisor of the provision of marriage and family			
6	therapy services."			
7	3. By repealing the definition of "marriage and family			
8	therapy intern."			
9	[""Marriage-and family therapy intern" means a person who			
10	has completed all educational requirements stipulated in section			
11	451J-7(1)(A) and who is currently earning supervised clinical			
12	experience in marriage and family therapy under clinical			
13	supervision."]			
14	SECTION 4. Section 451J-3, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is			
15	amended to read as follows:			
16	"\$451J-3 Powers and duties of the director. In addition			
17	to any other powers and duties authorized by law, the director			
18				
	may:			
19	(1) Examine and approve the qualifications of all			
20	applicants under this chapter, and issue a license to			
21	each successful applicant granting permission to use

The department shall 10 11 investigate and prosecute any individual using the title of 12 marriage and family therapist [or], licensed marriage and family therapist, associate marriage and family therapist, or licensed 13 associate marriage and family therapist without being properly 14 licensed as a marriage and family therapist [-] or associate 15 16 marriage and family therapist. Any person who violates this section shall be subject to a fine of not more than \$1,000 per 17 violation. Each day's violation shall be deemed a separate 18 19 offense. Any action taken to impose or collect the fine imposed 20 under this section shall be a civil action."



SECTION 6. Section 451J-6, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 1 2 amended to read as follows: "\$451J-6 Exemptions. (a) Licensure shall not be required 3 4 of: 5 A person doing work within the scope of practice or (1) duties of the person's profession that overlaps with 6 7 the practice of marriage and family therapy; provided 8 the person does not purport to be a marriage and 9 family therapist [or], licensed marriage and family therapist[+], associate marriage and family therapist, 10 11 or licensed associate marriage and family therapist; 12 or 13 (2) Any student enrolled in an accredited educational 14 institution in a recognized program of study leading toward attainment of a graduate degree in marriage and 15 16 family therapy or other professional field; provided 17 that the student's activities and services are part of 18 a prescribed course of study supervised by the 19 educational institution and the student is identified 20 by an appropriate title including but not limited to 21 "marriage and family therapy student or trainee",



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1 "clinical psychology student or trainee", "clinical 2 social work student or trainee", or any title which 3 clearly indicates training status [; -or (3) Any individual who uses the title marriage and family 4 5 therapy-intern for the purpose of-obtaining clinical 6 experience in accordance with section 451J-7(3)]. 7 Nothing in this chapter shall be construed to prevent (b) qualified members of other licensed professions as defined by 8 9 any law, rule, or the department, including but not limited to social workers, psychologists, registered nurses, or physicians, 10 from doing or advertising that they assist or treat individuals, 11 12 couples, or families consistent with the accepted standards of 13 their respective licensed professions; provided that no person, 14 unless the person is licensed as a marriage and family therapist $[\tau]$ or associate marriage and family therapist, shall 15 16 use the title of marriage and family therapist [or], licensed marriage and family therapist [-], associate marriage and family 17 therapist, or licensed associate marriage and family therapist." 18 19 SECTION 7. Section 451J-9, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 20 amended to read as follows:

No person licensed as a marriage and family therapist $[\tau]$ or associate marriage and family therapist, nor any 7 8 of the person's employees or associates, shall be required to disclose any information that the person may have acquired in 9 10 rendering marriage and family therapy services except in the 11 following circumstances: 12 (1) As required by law; 13 (2) To prevent a clear and immediate danger to a person or 14 persons; (3) In the course of a civil, criminal, or disciplinary 15 16 action arising from the therapy where the therapist is 17 a defendant; (4) In a criminal proceeding where the client is a 18 19 defendant and the use of the privilege would violate 20 the defendant's right to a compulsory process of the



1		right to present testimony and witnesses in the
2		defendant's own behalf;
3	(5)	In accordance with the terms of a client's previously
4		written waiver of the privilege; or
5	(6)	Where more than one person in a family jointly
6		receives therapy and each family member who is legally
7		competent executes a written waiver; in that instance,
8		a marriage and family therapist or associate marriage
9		and family therapist may disclose information received
10		from any family member in accordance with the terms of
11		the person's waiver."
12	SECT	ION 10. Section 451J-13, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
13	amended to	o read as follows:
14	"[+]:	§451J-13[]] Therapist prohibited from testifying in
15	alimony an	nd divorce actions. If both parties to a marriage have
16	obtained r	marriage and family therapy by a licensed marriage and
17	family the	erapist[$ au$] or licensed associate marriage and family
18	therapist,	the therapist shall be prohibited from testifying in
19	an alimony	y or divorce action concerning information acquired in
20	the course	e of therapy. This section shall not apply to custody
21	actions wh	nether or not part of a divorce proceeding."

2		research design and methods; statistical
3		analysis; principles, practice, and application
4		of needs assessment; and program evaluation;
5	<u>(I)</u>	Professional orientation and ethics, including
6		the history of the helping profession;
7		professional roles and functions; ethical
8		standards; confidentiality; professional
9		organizations; and the public policy process,
10		including advocacy on behalf of the profession
11		and its clientele; and
12	(J)	At least two academic terms of supervised mental
13		health practicum intern experience for graduate
14		credit of at least six semester hours, or ten

Each day of 20 each violation shall constitute a separate offense. Any action



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1 taken to impose or collect the fine imposed under this section 2 shall be a civil action." 3 SECTION 15. In that instance, a mental health 14 counselor or associate mental health counselor may 15 disclose information from any person in accordance 16 with that person's waiver; or 17 (5) In the course of a disciplinary action or pursuant to 18 a duly authorized subpoena issued by the department." 19 SECTION 19.
