A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO EDUCATION.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that it is important to
- 2 continue to support the incorporation of trauma-informed
- 3 education in the State's public education system. Trauma-
- 4 informed education involves mental health education for
- 5 students, teachers, staff, parents, and community members; adds
- 6 a flexible, responsive, and measured strategy for addressing
- 7 trauma; and is an important component to the department of
- 8 education's multi-tier system of supports.
- 9 In 2021, the legislature established a trauma-informed
- 10 education program in the windward district, which built upon the
- 11 work of Compassionate Ko'olaupoko. Compassionate Ko'olaupoko has
- 12 brought together schools, community groups, businesses, and
- 13 community members to envision what a trauma-informed community
- 14 would look like. The legislature also appropriated funds for
- 15 two positions to expand trauma-informed education and care in
- 16 the Koʻolaupoko region. Over the past year, there have been
- 17 numerous students, faculty, and community members who have been

- 1 positively impacted by this trauma-informed education program.
- 2 Through the trauma-informed education program, educators and
- 3 other school faculty have received training on trauma awareness
- 4 and have learned skills to recognize behavior that results from
- 5 exposure to trauma. Consequently, students and families have
- 6 been able to engage in culturally informed, place-based
- 7 restorative practices.
- 8 The purpose of this Act is to formally establish the
- 9 trauma-informed education pilot program in the Castle-Kahuku and
- 10 Kailua-Kalaheo complex areas and appropriate funds for positions
- 11 for the program.
- 12 SECTION 2. There is established within the department of
- 13 education a trauma-informed education pilot program at the
- 14 Castle-Kahuku and Kailua-Kalaheo complex areas, which shall
- 15 include and be a continuation of the existing trauma-informed
- 16 education pilot program in the department of education for those
- 17 complex areas.
- 18 SECTION 3. There is appropriated out of the general
- 19 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ or so
- 20 much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2023-2024 and
- 21 the same sum or so much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal

6	(6)	Assist the district education specialist in hosting		
7		advisory council meetings as needed in order to		
8		provide culturally attuned, trauma-responsive		
9		information that is helpful to the community; and		
10	(7)	Perform other related duties as required or assigned.		
11	The	sums appropriated shall be expended by the department		
12	of educat	ion for the purposes of this Act.		
13	SECT	ION 4. There is appropriated out of the general		
14	revenues	of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ or so

9	(3)	Provide leadership and administrative oversight for
10		the compassionate Ko'olaupoko coalition, including the
11		development and delivery of activities that ensure
12		that the goals and objectives of the designated funds
13		are achieved and engaging stakeholders;
14	(4)	Support meetings to advance projects and programs;
15		provide technical assistance on designated priorities,
16		and collaborate with internal staff and external
17		groups, state and federal agencies, and business or
18		professional associations;
19	(5)	Execute fiscal, personnel, and contract transactions
20		in a timely manner; oversee project budgets and
21		ensures full, proper, and compliant utilization of

1		resources; and gather and analyzes all interim, annual
2		progress, and expenditure reports to ensure compliance
3		with appropriate laws, policies, procedures, and grant
4		terms and conditions;
5	(6)	Coordinate the collection of and provides
6		administrative, fiscal, and programmatic information
7		for testimony, reports, and presentations to various
8		audiences, including but not limited to the
9		legislature and board of education;
10	(7)	Adhere to all procurement rules, regulations, and
11		contractual requirements of the department of
12		education and state and federal entities;
13	(8)	Assist in the hosting of advisory council meetings as
14		needed in order to provide culturally attuned, trauma-
15		responsive information that is helpful to the
16		community; and
17	(9)	Perform other related duties as required or assigned.
18	The s	sums appropriated shall be expended by the department
19	of educati	ion for the purposes of this Act.
20	SECT	ION 5. This Act shall take effect on June 30, 3000.
