A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO THE NATURAL ENERGY LABORATORY OF HAWAII AUTHORITY.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. Section 227D-2, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 2 amended by amending subsections (a) and (b) to read as follows:
- 3 "(a) There is established the natural energy laboratory of
- 4 Hawaii authority, which shall be a body corporate and politic
- 5 and an instrumentality and agency of the State. The authority
- 6 shall be placed within the department of business, economic
- 7 development, and tourism for administrative purposes, pursuant
- 8 to section 26-35. The purpose of the natural energy laboratory
- 9 of Hawaii authority shall be to facilitate research $[\tau]$;
- 10 development $[\tau]$; and environmentally responsible and culturally
- 11 appropriate commercialization of natural energy resources and
- 12 ocean-related research, technology, and industry in Hawaii and
- 13 to engage in environmentally responsible and culturally
- 14 appropriate retail, commercial, or tourism activities that will
- 15 financially support that research, development, and
- 16 commercialization at a research and technology park in Hawaii.
- 17 Its duties shall include:

5	(7)	Engaging in retail, commercial, and tourism activities

7		development, and commercialization of natural energy
8		resources in Hawaii; provided that all income derived
9		from these activities shall be deposited in the
10		natural energy laboratory of Hawaii authority special
11		fund[+]; and
12	(8)	Engaging in community outreach and education in west

14		park to promote workforce development in science,
15		technology, engineering, math, and aquaculture
16		industries, including through programs for local
17		educators, students, educational institutions within
18		Hawaii, and state- and county-sponsored community

20	(b)	The governing body of the authority shall consist of a
21	board of	directors having twelve voting members. Three members

from the general public shall be appointed by the governor for 1 2 staggered terms pursuant to section 26-34[, except]; provided that one of these members shall be a resident of the county of 3 Hawaii. The members shall be selected on the basis of their 4 knowledge, interest, and proven expertise in, but not limited 5 to, one or more of the following fields: finance, commerce and 6 7 trade, corporate management, marketing, economics, engineering, 8 energy management, real estate development, property management, aquaculture, [and] ocean science[-], Native Hawaiian cultural 9 10 practices and traditions, conservation, and animal welfare. The 11 chairperson and secretary of the research advisory committee 12 shall serve on the board. The director of business, economic 13 development, and tourism, the chairperson of the board of land 14 and natural resources, the president of the University of 15 Hawaii, the mayor of the county of Hawaii, and an appointed 16 member from the board of the Hawaii technology development 17 corporation, or their designated representatives, shall serve as 18 ex officio, voting members of the board. The tenants of the 19 authority shall elect two members to the board from among the 20 tenants of the authority, of which one member shall serve a twoyear term, and one member shall serve a four-year term. - 1 electing the tenant members, each tenant shall be entitled to
- 2 cast one vote for each member position. The tenant members
- 3 shall be recused from voting on setting lease rents, water
- 4 rates, or utility rates, but may participate in discussions.
- 5 The director of business, economic development, and tourism
- 6 shall serve as the chairperson until such time as a chairperson
- 7 is elected by the board from the membership. The board shall
- 8 elect other officers as it deems necessary."
- 9 SECTION 2. Section 227D-4, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 10 amended to read as follows:
- 11 "[+] \\$227D-4[+] Research advisory committee. The authority
- 12 shall appoint a research advisory committee for the purpose of
- 13 obtaining expert and specialized counsel and advice on matters
- 14 relating to scientific research. The research advisory
- 15 committee shall include a member of the University of Hawaii
- 16 institutional animal care and use committee and may include [as
- 17 members of the committee] officers and employees of any
- 18 government department or agency or members of the scientific
- 19 community; provided that at least two members of the board shall
- 20 be appointed to the research advisory committee. Members of the
- 21 research advisory committee shall elect the chairperson and

- 1 secretary of the committee, who shall serve as members of the
- 2 board. The authority may assign its own staff to aid and assist
- 3 the research advisory committee and may reimburse any member of
- 4 the committee for necessary expenses incurred in the performance
- 5 of the member's work for the authority."
- 6 SECTION 3. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
- 7 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.
- 8 SECTION 4. This Act shall take effect on June 30, 3000;
- 9 provided that the existing members of the natural energy
- 10 laboratory of Hawaii authority shall continue to serve until the
- 11 expiration of their respective terms.
