

A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO SOCIAL SERVICES.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that the State provides a 2 personal needs allowance for individuals residing in adult 3 foster homes, adult residential care homes, domiciliary homes, 4 and other long-term care facilities. The personal needs 5 allowance allows recipients to purchase necessary items such as clothing, toiletries, and meals and covers other day-to-day 6 7 living expenses. The legislature further finds that when the 8 federal government first established the needs allowance in 9 1974, the allowance was set at \$25 per month, which was then 10 subsequently increased to \$30 in 1998. In 2007, the legislature 11 enacted Act 96, Session Laws of Hawaii 2007, which increased the 12 monthly needs allowance to \$50 to better accommodate the 13 increase in the cost of living. However, the allowance has not 14 been increased since then. The legislature believes that the 15 personal needs allowance must be increased in order to 16 effectively support individuals residing in long-term care 17 facilities.

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1	Accordingly, the purpose of this Act is to increase the		
2	personal needs allowance from \$50 to \$75.		
3	SECTION 2. Section 346D-4.5, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is		
4	amended to read as follows:		
5	"§346D-4.5 Needs allowance; waiver program individuals.

20	(1	b)	The needs allowance may be administered by the
21	depart	ment	t of human services to pay for clothing and other



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1 personal miscellaneous needs, such as bus fare, personal postage 2 costs, haircuts, and other costs of day-to-day living. 3 (c) The State's supplemental payment for a needs allowance 4 under subsection (a) shall be increased by an amount necessary 5 to bring the allowance up to [\$50] \$75 per month. The payment 6 under this section shall be afforded to an individual notwithstanding that the individual is incapacitated; provided 7 8 that the moneys may be spent on behalf of the client, with a 9 written accounting, by the operator of the residence or 10 facility. 11 (d) The needs allowance is not intended to replace or 12 affect the funds received from the federal supplemental security 13 income program and shall be supplemental to any funds provided 14 to a recipient by the federal supplemental security income 15 program. 16 (e) The operators of facilities listed under subsection 17 (a) shall pay for generic toiletries, including toilet paper, 18 hand soap, and paper towels; linens, including bedding, sheets, 19 blankets, towels, and bath towels; and meals and snacks for 20 outings.

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1	(f) The needs allowance shall apply to persons otherwise
2	eligible to receive monthly income pursuant to state law or
3	rules and federal laws or regulations and is not intended to
4	affect the classifications of, or number of, persons eligible to
5	receive such funds.
6	(g) The department of human services shall perform an
7	annual review of the monthly needs allowance to ensure the
8	allowance provides adequate coverage. The department of human
9	services shall submit a report of corrections or improvements to
10	the monthly needs allowance, including any proposed legislation,
11	to the legislature no later than twenty days prior to the
12	convening of the regular session of 2024, and every session
13	thereafter."
14	SECTION 3. There is appropriated out of the general
15	revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ or so
16	much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2023-2024 and
17	the same sum or so much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal
18	year 2024-2025 to provide a monthly needs allowance to
19	individuals eligible pursuant to section 346D-4.5, Hawaii
20	Revised Statutes.

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The sums appropriated shall be expended by the department
of human services for the purposes of this Act.

3 SECTION 4. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed4 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.

5 SECTION 5. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2023.

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Report Title:

Needs Allowance; Long-term Care Facilities; Appropriation

Description:

Increases the monthly needs allowance from \$50 to \$75. Clarifies that the needs allowance is not intended to replace or affect funds received from the federal supplemental security income program. Requires certain long-term care facility operators to pay for generic toiletries, linens, and meals and snacks. Requires the department of human services to perform an annual review of the needs allowance. Appropriate funds.
