A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO EMERGENCY MEDICAL RESPONSE.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that in critical medical
- 2 emergencies, each minute matters. Long-term injury, brain
- 3 damage, and even death can occur within just a few minutes in
- 4 some types of emergencies. Whether it is a student choking or a
- 5 teacher experiencing cardiac arrest, help provided within four
- 6 minutes, rather than eight minutes, can save a life.
- 7 The legislature further finds that while the department of
- 8 education currently has basic emergency response guidance, there
- 9 is a gap between the guidance provided to "administer first aid"
- 10 and the training and preparedness of personnel in the case of an
- 11 unforeseen critical medical emergency.
- Accordingly, the purpose of this Act is to supplement the
- 13 department of education's emergency procedures guide,
- 14 RS 10-0431, by requiring that each public school's
- 15 administration and public charter school's administration
- 16 appoint any member of the staff to be a critical emergency
- 17 response team member.

1	SECT	ION 2. Chapter 302A, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
2	amended b	y adding a new section to part III, subpart F, to be
3	appropria	tely designated and to read as follows:
4	" <u>§30</u>	2A- Critical emergency response. (a) Each public
5	school sh	all establish a critical emergency response team that
6	shall con	sist of critical emergency response team members.
7	(b)	Each critical emergency response team member shall:
8	(1)	Maintain active certifications in first aid,
9		cardiopulmonary resuscitation, and automated external
10		defibrillator from organizations approved by the
11		department; provided that any certification more than
12		two years old shall not be valid for purposes of this
13		paragraph; and
14	(2)	Respond in good faith when activated.
15	<u>(c)</u>	For purposes of this section:
16	"Cri	tical emergency" means a situation in which a person is
17	<u>in immedi</u>	ate danger of loss of life, including from cardiac
18	arrest, c	hoking, or uncontrolled bleeding.
19	<u>"Fir</u>	st aid" means lifesaving help given in a critical
20	emergency	, including providing abdominal thrusts when someone is
21	choking,	performing cardiopulmonary resuscitation when someone

1	is unconscious and does not have a pulse, or applying pressure	
2	or a tourniquet in an uncontrolled bleeding."	
3	SECTION 3. Chapter 302D, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is	
4	amended by adding a new section to be appropriately designated	
5	and to read as follows:	
6	"§302D- Critical emergency response. (a) Each public	
7	charter school shall establish a critical emergency response	
8	team that shall consist of critical emergency response team	
9	members.	
10	(b) Each critical emergency response team member shall:	
11	(1) Maintain active certifications in first aid,	
12	cardiopulmonary resuscitation, and automated external	
13	defibrillator from organizations approved by the	
14	department; provided that any certification more than	
15	two years old shall not be valid for purposes of this	
16	paragraph; and	
17	(2) Respond in good faith when activated.	
18	(c) For purposes of this section:	
19	"Critical emergency" means a situation in which a person is	
20	in immediate danger of loss of life, including from cardiac	
21	arrest, choking, or uncontrolled bleeding.	

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1	"First aid" means lifesaving help given in a critical
2	emergency, including providing abdominal thrusts when someone is
3	choking, performing cardiopulmonary resuscitation when someone
4	is unconscious and does not have a pulse, or applying pressure
5	or a tourniquet in an uncontrolled bleeding."
6	SECTION 4. There is appropriated out of the general
7	revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ or so
8	much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2023-2024 and
9	the same sum or so much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal
10	year 2024-2025 for public schools to implement critical
11	emergency response teams.
12	The sums appropriated shall be expended by the department
13	of education for the purposes of this Act.
14	SECTION 5. There is appropriated out of the general
15	revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ or so
16	much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2023-2024 and
17	the same sum or so much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal
18	year 2024-2025 for public charter schools to implement critical
19	emergency response teams.

The sums appropriated shall be expended by the state public

charter school commission for the purposes of this Act.

- 2 SECTION 7. This Act shall take effect on June 30, 3000.
