A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO CHILD AND ADOLESCENT MENTAL HEALTH.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that there is a need to
- 2 improve mental health crisis intervention for at-risk youths in
- 3 the community by expanding existing crisis response services to
- 4 provide trauma-informed engagement within the system and
- 5 individual training in trauma-informed care. These expanded
- 6 services may reduce the risk of harm to youths; promote safety
- 7 for youths in home, school, and community settings; reduce the
- 8 use of emergency facilities, acute psychiatric hospitals, and
- 9 other out-of-home placements for youths; increase supports
- 10 available to youths and families to maintain placement and
- 11 improve quality of life; and provide trauma-informed care and
- 12 ongoing support to youths and families in the community.
- 13 The purpose of this Act is to establish, and appropriate
- 14 funds for, a child and adolescent crisis mobile outreach team
- 15 pilot program on Oahu to provide additional support and
- 16 expansion of services for existing crisis response services.

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I	SECTION 2. (a) There is established a child and
2	adolescent crisis mobile outreach team pilot program within the
3	child and adolescent mental health division of the department of
4	health to expand and support existing crisis response services
5	and programs for at-risk youths on Oahu. The crisis mobile
6	outreach team pilot program shall begin on January 1, 2024.
7	(b) The crisis mobile outreach team pilot program shall,
8	to the extent practicable within available resources, provide
9	the following services:
10	(1) Crisis prevention with community collaboration and
11	community program development;
12	(2) Face-to-face intervention within one hour of a request
13	for intervention;
14	(3) Crisis de-escalation and assessment; and
15	(4) Stabilization of up to eight weeks including:
16	(A) Connecting youths to community supports and
17	services;
18	(B) In-home clinical support for youths and families;
19	(C) Connection with higher level support if
20	determined necessary; and

- 3 (c) The child and adolescent mental health division of the
- 4 department of health shall submit a report to the legislature,
- 5 no later than twenty days prior to the convening of the regular
- 6 session of 2025, with findings and recommendations arising from
- 7 the child and adolescent crisis mobile outreach team pilot
- 8 program, including any proposed legislation and a recommendation
- 9 as to whether the pilot program should be extended.
- (d) The child and adolescent crisis mobile outreach team
 pilot program shall end on December 31, 2025.
- 12 SECTION 3. There is appropriated out of the general
- 13 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$1,780,000 or so much
- 14 thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2023-2024 and the
- 15 same sum or so much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year
- 16 2024-2025 to establish a crisis mobile outreach team pilot
- 17 program to expand existing crisis response services and for the
- 18 hiring and training of mental health professionals with trauma-
- 19 informed training and experience working with youth.
- The sums appropriated shall be expended by the department
- 21 of health for the purposes of this Act.

1 SECTION 4. This Act shall take effect on June 30, 3000.
