#### A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO SUSTAINABLE AGRICULTURE.

#### BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that the use of cover
- 2 crops, green manure, and compost increases agricultural
- 3 productivity and aligns with the State's integrated
- 4 sustainability goals. Plants used for this purpose, including
- 5 grasses, legumes, and forbs, add nutrients to the soil, act as
- 6 windbreaks, assist with water retention, provide habitats for
- 7 beneficial insects, and help prevent soil erosion.
- 8 The legislature further finds that it is in the interest of
- 9 the State to incentivize the use of management practices that
- 10 enhance the quality and sustainability of Hawaii's agricultural
- 11 lands.
- 12 The purpose of this Act is to clarify Act 312, Session Laws
- 13 of Hawaii 2022, which established a cover crop reimbursement
- 14 pilot program to reimburse farming operations in the State for
- 15 the costs of acquiring cover crop seeds, green manure, or
- 16 compost.

1	SECTION 2. Act 312, Session Laws of Hawaii 2022, section
2	2, is amended as follows:
3	1. By amending subsection (b) to read:
4	"(b) Each application for cost reimbursement shall be
5	submitted on a form furnished by the department of agriculture
6	and shall be accompanied by documentation of the costs of items
7	purchased, pursuant to subsection (c); provided that:
8	(1) The applicant shall indemnify and hold harmless the
9	State and its officers, agents, and employees from all
10	claims arising out of or resulting from the cover crop
11	seeds, green manure, or compost purchased; [and]
12	(2) The department of agriculture may request the
13	applicant to provide additional information for the
14	purposes of verifying the volume of cover crop seeds,
15	green manure, or compost purchased[-];
16	(3) Applications for grants shall be made to the
17	department of agriculture and contain such information
18	as the department of agriculture shall require. At a
19	minimum, the applicant shall show:
20	(A) The name of the requesting entity or individual;
21	(B) The purpose for the grant;

1		<u>(C)</u>	The service to be supported by the grant;
2		<u>(D)</u>	The target group to be benefited;
3		<u>(E)</u>	The cost of the grant; and
4		<u>(F)</u>	That the grant shall be used for activities that
5			are consistent with the purposes of this program;
6	(4)	Gran	ts shall only be awarded if:
7		(A)	The applicant has applied for or received all
8			applicable licenses and permits, when such is
9			required to conduct the activities or provide the
10			services for which a grant is awarded;
11		<u>(B)</u>	The applicant agrees to comply with applicable
12			federal, state, and county laws;
13		(C)	The grant is not used for purposes of
14			entertainment or perquisites;
15		(D)	All activities and improvements undertaken with
16			funds received comply with all applicable
17			federal, state, and county statutes and
18			ordinances, including applicable building codes
19			and agency rules; and

1	(E) The applicant procures sufficient insurance to
2	provide indemnification if requested to do so by
3	the department of agriculture;
4 (5)	To receive a grant, an applicant shall:
5	(A) <u>Be:</u>
6	(i) A for-profit entity incorporated under the
7	laws of the State;
8	(ii) A nonprofit community-based organization
9	determined to be exempt from federal income
10	taxation by the Internal Revenue Service;
11	(iii) A cooperative association; or
12	(iv) An individual, who in the department of
13	agriculture's determination, is able to
14	provide the services or activities proposed
15	in the application for a grant;
16	(B) In the case of a nonprofit organization, have a
17	governing board whose members have no material
18	conflict of interest and serve without
19	compensation, have bylaws or policies that
20	describe the manner in which business is
21	conducted and policies relating to nepotism and

1			management of potential conflict of interest
2			situations, and not employ or contract with two
3			or more members of a family or kin of the first
4			or second degree of consanguinity unless
5			specifically permitted by the department of
6			agriculture;
7		<u>(C)</u>	Agree to make available to the department of
8			agriculture all records the applicant may have
9			relating to the operation of the applicant's
10			activity, business, or enterprise to allow the
11			department of agriculture to monitor the
12			applicant's compliance with the purpose of this
13			program; and
14		(D)	Establish, to the satisfaction of the department
15			of agriculture, that sufficient funds are
16			available for the effective operation of the
17			activity, business, or enterprise for the purpose
18			for which the grant is awarded;
19	<u>(6)</u>	Ever	y grant shall be:

I	(A)	monitored by the department of agriculture to				
2		ensure compliance with this program and the				
3		purposes and intent of the grant; and				
4	(B)	Evaluated annually to determine whether the grant				
5		attained the intended results in the manner				
6		contemplated; and				
7	<u>(7)</u> Gran	ts made by the department of agriculture under				
8	this	Act may be made without regard to chapters 103D				
9	and	103F, Hawaii Revised Statutes."				
10	2. By amending subsection (e) to read:					
11	"(e) The department of agriculture shall convene a review					
12	panel to be placed within the department of agriculture					
13	comprising knowledgeable representatives from the department of					
14	agriculture, University of Hawaii at Manoa college of tropical					
15	agriculture and human resources, and industry organizations.					
16	The review panel shall screen and rate applicants on the quality					
17	and appropriate use of their cover crops and green manure and					
18	their composti	ng practices. The department shall aggregate the				
19	total reimbursement applications pursuant to this section and					
20	distribute the available moneys based on a ranking scale as					
21	determined by	the review panel; provided that a higher-ranked				

- 1 applicant shall receive a higher rate of reimbursement than a
- 2 lower-ranked applicant."
- 3 SECTION 3. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
- 4 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.
- 5 SECTION 4. This Act shall take effect on June 30, 3000.
