HOUSE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

URGING THE UNITED STATES CONGRESS TO ENACT LEGISLATION EXEMPTING FROM THE JONES ACT ALL MARINE CARGO SHIPMENTS TO AND FROM THE STATE OF HAWAII.

1 WHEREAS, the Merchant Marine Act of 1920, commonly known as 2 the Jones Act, requires among other things, that all goods that 3 are shipped within the United States be transported by United States-flagged vessels that are primarily operated by United 4 States citizens; and 5 6 WHEREAS, Hawaii is an archipelago and thus much of Hawaii's 7 inter- or intra-state cargo shipments require marine 8 transportation and are therefore subject to the Jones Act; and 9 10 11 WHEREAS, Hawaii consistently ranks as the state with the 12 highest cost of living; and 13 14 WHEREAS, each year, the Jones Act costs the State an estimated \$1,200,000,000, and Hawaii families an estimated 15 \$1,800; and 16 17 18 WHEREAS, exempting Hawaii from the Jones Act may 19 significantly reduce the cost of living in Hawaii; now, therefore, 20 21 22 BE IT RESOLVED by the House of Representatives of the 23 Thirty-second Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 2023, the Senate concurring, that the United States 24 25 Congress is urged to enact legislation exempting from the Jones Act all marine cargo shipments to and from the State of Hawaii; 26 27 and 28 29 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this Concurrent Resolution be transmitted to the Majority Leader of 30
