HOUSE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

REQUESTING THE BOARD OF EDUCATION AND DEPARTMENT OF EDUCATION TO INTEGRATE THE DOCUMENTARY FILM "WATERMAN" INTO MIDDLE AND INTERMEDIATE SCHOOL CURRICULUM.

WHEREAS, the people of Hawaii descend from a long and 1 storied path of heroes who embody strength, courage, integrity, 2 determination, and humility; and 3 4 WHEREAS, many of these heroes in the stories of old Hawaii 5 survived tremendous trials by adhering to long-held values of 6 7 aloha, perseverance, and teamwork; and 8 9 WHEREAS, the youth of today have become increasingly unfamiliar with these lessons as they drift farther from the 10 ancient stories and traditional storylines of what qualities 11 enhance the intrinsic values of ohana (family) and hard work, 12 upon both of which they should model their behavior; and 13 14 WHEREAS, youth in Hawaii have been inundated with modern 15 distractions such as social media, smartphones, and drug use, 16 and these distractions affect their physical and mental health, 17 causing a shift in whom they idolize and admire; and 18 19 WHEREAS, behavioralists and mental health therapists 20 recognize that in their most impressionable ages, children often 21 model their goals and behaviors after those they most admire; 22 23 and 24 WHEREAS, a contemporary Hawaiian legend, Duke Paoa Kahinu 25 Mokoe Hulikohola Kahanamoku, who was a five-time Olympic 26 medalist in swimming, a pioneer in surfing, and the true 27 Hawaiian ambassador of aloha was also a role model from which 28 children should derive value; and 29 30 WHEREAS, an extremely engaging documentary film entitled 31 "Waterman" highlights the life, times, and challenges of Duke 32



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Kahanamoku as a young Native Hawaiian immersed in the western 1 world while faithfully retaining his qualities of aloha; and 2 3 WHEREAS, "Waterman" was recently showcased to an audience 4 , of legislators, community leaders, and school officials in hopes 5 that they could recognize the intrinsic value of the documentary 6 in shaping the perspectives, values, and goals of children; and 7 8 WHEREAS, "Waterman" was received with an overwhelmingly 9 positive response and it was determined that the movie's 10 efficacy to affect positive change might best be impactful in 11 the years encompassing middle and intermediate school; and 12 13 14 WHEREAS, it was also a unanimous decision that to create the greatest positive impact on children, middle and 15 intermediate students should watch "Waterman" in a movie 16 theater, creating an experience that the students will never 17 forget; and 18 19 WHEREAS, producers David Ulich and Dr. Steven Ungerleider 20 of Sidewinder Films have agreed to allow free access to 21 "Waterman" in hopes that it could be broadly integrated into the 22 middle and intermediate school curriculum and shown 23 comprehensively to students as a coordinated effort to improve 24 the local self-perception, self-esteem, self-worth, and self-25 respect of children throughout Hawaii; now therefore, 26 27 BE IT RESOLVED by the House of Representatives of the 28 Thirty-second Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular 29 30 Session of 2023, the Senate concurring, that the Board of Education and Department of Education are urged to integrate 31 into the middle and intermediate school curriculum a component 32 that involves the "Waterman" film to help provide a strong role 33 model for a population of children who have so few heroes to 34 embrace; and 35 36 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Department of Education is 37 38 urged to closely coordinate with the necessary agencies and stakeholders to provide participating students with 39 transportation to movie theaters to bring middle and 40 intermediate school students together to experience the film; 41 and 42
