HOUSE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

REQUESTING THE BOARD OF EDUCATION, IN PARTNERSHIP WITH THE DEPARTMENT OF EDUCATION, TO PRODUCE A REPORT ON INCREASING ACCESS TO TUTORING SERVICES WITHIN AND OUTSIDE OF HAWAII'S K-12 PUBLIC SCHOOLS.

WHEREAS, Hawaii's public schools, administrators, teachers, 1 2 personnel, and, most importantly, students are still in a state 3 of vulnerability and recovery amidst the aftermath of the COVID-19 pandemic's academic and social-emotional impacts; and 4 5 WHEREAS, although Hawaii's students have demonstrated 6 admirable resilience over the past three years despite these 7 challenges, student achievement in math and reading has not 8 9 recovered to pre-pandemic levels; and 10 11 WHEREAS, federal relief dollars associated with COVID-19 recovery are still available and unassigned, and may be used 12 13 flexibly to assist in mitigating learning loss and social-emotional learning gaps for students in K-12 public 14 schools; and 15 16 WHEREAS, more than forty percent of school districts and 17 18 charter schools across the country plan to utilized federal COVID-19 relief monies to fund tutoring programs that will close 19 gaps in reading and mathematics caused by COVID-19 related 20 21 learning loss; and 22 23 WHEREAS, as of July 2022, nearly \$3,000,000,000 of COVID-19 24 relief funds across the country have been allocated to math and reading tutoring programs; and 25 26 27 WHEREAS, the United States Department of Education approved Hawaii's COVID-19 relief plan in 2021, which included high 28



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dosage and individualized tutoring programs for students 1 2 enrolled in Hawaii public schools; and 3 4 WHEREAS, research consistently shows that high dosage 5 tutoring is one of the most effective ways to increase student achievement; and 6 7 8 WHEREAS, providing tutoring to Hawaii's students will minimize learning loss and stimulate student academic growth; 9 10 now, therefore, 11 BE IT RESOLVED by the House of Representatives of the 12 13 Thirty-second Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 2023, the Senate concurring, that the Board of 14 15 Education is requested to produce a report, in partnership with the Department of Education, on increasing access to tutoring 16 17 services within and outside of Hawaii's K-12 public schools; and 18 19 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that in preparing the report, the 20 Board of Education is requested to: 21 22 Assess student access and equity regarding tutoring (1)services in the Hawaii public school system; 23 24 25 (2) Assess the remaining amount of COVID-19 relief funds 26 allotted via the federal Coronavirus Aid, Relief, and 27 Economic Security Act, federal Elementary and 28 Secondary School Emergency Relief Fund, and federal 29 American Rescue Plan for tutoring purposes; 30 (3) 31 Recommend methods to support schools' efforts to engage the community and hire in-person tutors where 32 33 possible with tutoring sessions occurring on campus 34 and during school hours, with individualized virtual 35 tutoring available in the event that there is not 36 enough staff for full in-person tutoring; 37 38 (4) Articulate how funds can be prioritized for schools 39 that serve predominantly low-income populations, 40 especially schools that qualify for Title I funding, in rural or remote areas that may struggle to find in-41



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1 person tutors and onsite school interventionists and 2 for schools experiencing academic distress; 3 4 (5) Include how students not attending a school described 5 in paragraph (4) but who still require assistance to recover from COVID-19 related learning loss, including 6 7 students with special needs, can access tutoring; and 8 (6) Include an examination of how a fund or reimbursement 9 10 process could be established for students to access 11 private tutoring in the event that their school is not 12 offering an on-campus or virtual program; and 13 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Board of Education is 14 15 requested to submit the report, including any findings, 16 recommendations, and proposed legislation, to the Legislature no later than twenty days prior to the convening of the Regular 17 18 Session of 2024; and 19 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this 20 21 Concurrent Resolution be transmitted to the Governor, Chairperson of the Board of Education, and Superintendent of 22 23 Education. 24 25 26 OFFERED BY:



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
