HOUSE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

REQUESTING THE DEPARTMENT OF AGRICULTURE, IN CONSULTATION WITH THE AGRIBUSINESS DEVELOPMENT CORPORATION, TO EXAMINE EXISTING LAWS RELATED TO THE SUGAR AND PINEAPPLE INDUSTRIES AND DETERMINE WHETHER UPDATES SHOULD BE MADE FOR THE UTILIZATION OF DIVERSIFIED CROPS.

WHEREAS, the downsizing of the sugar and pineapple 1 industries presented an unprecedented opportunity for the 2 conversion of agriculture into a dynamic growth industry; and 3 4 WHEREAS, the State is able to use public agricultural lands 5 6 to enhance the local economy, provide employment opportunities, 7 decrease reliance on imported agricultural products, and provide more sources of locally grown food for residents; and 8 9 WHEREAS, a valuable inventory of supporting infrastructure 10 including irrigation systems, roads, drainage systems, 11 processing facilities, workshops, and warehouses that are still 12 largely underutilized was left vacant by the downsizing of the 13 sugar and pineapple industries; and 14 15 WHEREAS, the Agricultural Resource Management Division of 16 the Department of Agriculture administers the development and 17 management of land and water, which are two key ingredients 18 essential to sustaining agricultural operations; and 19 20 WHEREAS, in recognition of Hawaii's limited land and water 21 resources, the Department of Agriculture is charged with 22 preserving these important resources to ensure the viability of 23 Hawaii's diversified agricultural industry; and 24 25 WHEREAS, the Department of Agriculture also operates the 26 State's Agricultural Parks Program under the Agricultural 27 28 Resource Management Division to assist individuals who are

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interested in leasing land for farming ventures by providing 1 irrigation water and reasonably priced farmland with 2 infrastructure and facilities to encourage competition within 3 the industry; and 4 5 -WHEREAS, the Agricultural Development Division of the 6 7 Department of Agriculture is tasked with promoting the economic 8 viability of commercial agriculture in Hawaii by sponsoring joint marketing programs for agricultural products with high 9 revenue growth potentials; facilitating the development and 10 expansion of marketing opportunities for targeted agricultural 11 and processed products; and providing timely, accurate, and 12 useful statistics; and 13 14 WHEREAS, the Agribusiness Development Corporation was 15 16 established in 1994 to facilitate and provide direction for the transition of Hawaii's agriculture industry from the dominance 17 18 of sugar and pineapple to one composed of a diversity of crops; 19 and 20 WHEREAS, the Agribusiness Development Corporation is tasked 21 with coordinating and administering programs to assist 22 agricultural enterprises to facilitate the transition of 23 agricultural infrastructure from plantation operations into 24 other agricultural enterprises, increasing local production of 25 26 agricultural products for local consumption, reducing the State's reliance on imported agricultural products, and 27 28 increasing access to farmland and related infrastructure for 29 small local farmers and cooperatives; now, therefore, 30 31 BE IT RESOLVED by the House of Representatives of the Thirty-second Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular 32 Session of 2023, the Senate concurring, that the Department of 33 34 Agriculture, in consultation with the Agribusiness Development Corporation, is requested to examine existing laws related to 35 36 the sugar and pineapple industries and determine whether updates 37 should be made for the utilization of diversified crops; and 38 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Department of Agriculture 39 is requested to submit a report of its findings and 40 recommendations, including any proposed legislation, to the 41

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 Legislature no later than twenty days prior to the convening of the Regular Session of 2024; and
BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this
Concurrent Resolution be transmitted to the Chairperson of the Board of Agriculture and Executive Director of the Agribusiness
Development Corporation.
