HOUSE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

REQUESTING THE HAWAII STATE CENTER FOR NURSING TO CONVENE A WORKING GROUP TO STUDY THE POTENTIAL IMPACTS TO THE STATE OF JOINING THE MULTI-STATE NURSE LICENSURE COMPACT.

1 WHEREAS, according to the federal Bureau of Labor Statistics' Employment Projections 2021-2031, the registered 2 nurse workforce is expected to grow from 3,130,600 registered 3 nurses in 2021 to 3,326,000 registered nurses in 2031, which is 4 5 an increase of 195,400 registered nurses or 6.2 percent; and 6 7 WHEREAS, the federal Bureau of Labor Statistics also 8 projects the average annual number of openings for registered nurses from 2021 through 2031, after factoring in retirements 9 and workforce exits, to be 203,200 openings per year; and 10 11 WHEREAS, according to the Hawaii State Center for Nursing, 12 there are 15,072 licensed registered nurses who live and 13 practice in the State; and 14 15 16 WHEREAS, according to the Healthcare Association of Hawaii's 2022 Healthcare Workforce Initiative Report, there were 17 approximately 1,000 unfilled registered nurse positions in the 18 19 State; and 20 WHEREAS, during and following the emergence of the COVID-19 21 pandemic, hospitals, nursing facilities, and other health care 22 practices faced nursing shortages, which continue to exist; and 23 24 WHEREAS, shortages in the local nursing workforce require 25 26 health care facilities to recruit traveling nurses, which can be 27 costlier than hiring a local workforce; and 28 29 WHEREAS, the State and health care systems have invested 30 and continue to invest in growing the local nursing and health

care professional workforce through expanded educational 1 opportunities, incentives, and other investments; and 2 3 WHEREAS, as of January 2023, there were 39 states that are 4 members of the multi-state Nurse Licensure Compact; and 5 6 7 WHEREAS, the Nurse Licensure Compact would enable nurses to 8 practice in person or provide telenursing services to patients 9 located across the country without having to obtain additional 10 licenses; and 11 12 WHEREAS, the Nurse Licensure Compact would allow a nurse to work across state borders and provide vital services in the 13 event of disaster; and 14 15 16 WHEREAS, the Nurse Licensure Compact would also allow 17 military spouse nurses to seamlessly continue working without having to obtain new licenses each time they relocate, thus 18 19 expanding the nursing workforce; and 20 21 WHEREAS, according to the Hawaii State Center for Nursing, 16 percent of registered nurses plan to retire in the next five 22 23 years; now, therefore, 24 25 BE IT RESOLVED by the House of Representatives of the Thirty-second Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular 26 Session of 2023, the Senate concurring, that the Hawaii State 27 28 Center for Nursing is requested to convene a working group to 29 study the potential impacts to the State of joining the multistate Nurse Licensure Compact; and 30 31 32 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the working group is requested 33 to consist of the following members: 34 (1)The Director of the Hawaii State Center for Nursing, 35 or the Director's designee, who shall serve as 36 chairperson of the working group; 37 38 39 (2) The Director of Commerce and Consumer Affairs, or the Director's designee; 40 41 (3) A representative of the Regulated Industries 42 43 Complaints Office of the Department of Commerce and
