## HOUSE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

REQUESTING THE GOVERNOR'S COORDINATOR ON HOMELESSNESS TO CONDUCT A STUDY ON THE COST OF PROGRAMS AND SERVICES NECESSARY TO END CHRONIC HOMELESSNESS BY 2030.

1	WHEREAS, homelessness is a persistent public policy and
2	humanitarian concern for Hawaii; and
3	
4	WHEREAS, the 2022 Point-In-Time Count tallied a total of
5	5,973 people experiencing homelessness in the State, with the
6	majority of the people counted living on Oahu at 3,951
7	individuals, followed by Hawai'i County with 837 individuals,
8	Maui County with 741 individuals, and Kaua'i County with 444
9	individuals; and
10	
11	WHEREAS, the 2022 Point-In-Time Count showed an eleven
12	percent decrease in Oahu's total homeless population from 2020,
13	but a slightly higher number of unsheltered individuals living
14	on the streets; and
15	
16	WHEREAS, there was also a significant drop in the number of
17	individuals counted in shelters on Oahu in 2022 as compared to
18	2020, with 1,596 individuals counted in shelters in 2022 and
19	2,102 individuals counted in shelters in 2020; and
20	
21	WHEREAS, the decline in the number of individuals counted
22	in shelters may be attributable to a decrease in statewide bed
23	capacity caused by shelter closures and COVID-19 restrictions;
24	and
25	
26	WHEREAS, statistics show that while Native Hawaiian and
27	Pacific Islander populations make up approximately ten percent
28	of the total population on Oahu, they represent more than
29	thirty-five percent of those experiencing homelessness; and

1 WHEREAS, the current Governor has vowed to prioritize 2 efforts to cut homelessness in half and eliminate chronic homelessness by 2030; now, therefore, 3 4 5 BE IT RESOLVED by the House of Representatives of the Thirty-second Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular 6 7 Session of 2023, the Senate concurring, that the Governor's Coordinator on Homelessness is requested to conduct a study on 8 9 the cost of programs and services necessary to end chronic homelessness by 2030; and 10 11 12 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Governor's Coordinator on 13 Homeless is requested to consider in the study the cost of 14 shelter space, transitional housing, permanent supportive 15 housing, housing assistance, stabilization facilities, substance abuse treatment, health care, mental health services, outreach 16 programming, and other social services necessary to end chronic 17 18 homelessness; and 19 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Governor's Coordinator on 20 Homelessness is requested to consult with other governmental and 21 22 nongovernmental organizations to perform the study, including the Department of Human Services, The Institute for Human 23 Services, Partners In Care, and Hawai'i Appleseed Center for Law 24 & Economic Justice; and 25 26 27 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Governor's Coordinator on 28 Homelessness is requested to submit the results of the study on the cost of ending chronic homelessness by 2030, including any 29 30 findings, recommendations, and proposed legislation, to the 31 Legislature no later than twenty days prior to the convening of the Regular Session of 2024; and 32 33 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this 34 Concurrent Resolution be transmitted to the Governor, Lieutenant 35 36 Governor, Director of Human Services, Governor's Coordinator on Homelessness, Executive Director of the Institute for Human 37 38 Services, Executive Director of Partners In Care, and Executive Director of the Hawai'i Appleseed Center for Law & Economic 39 40 Justice. 41
