

## HOUSE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

REQUESTING THE DEPARTMENT OF HUMAN SERVICES MED-QUEST DIVISION TO EXPAND THE TYPES OF QUALIFIED PROVIDERS ALLOWED TO PROVIDE LACTATION CONSULTANT SERVICES FOR THE MEDICAID POPULATION IN THE STATE.

WHEREAS, according to the Centers for Disease Control and 1 Prevention, breastfeeding has health benefits for babies and 2 mothers, as breast milk provides a baby with ideal nutrition, 3 supports growth and development, and can also help protect the 4 baby and mother against certain illnesses and diseases; and 5 6 WHEREAS, the American Academy of Pediatrics recommends 7 8 exclusive breastfeeding for about six months then continued breastfeeding while introducing complementary foods until a 9 child is twelve months or older; and 10 11 WHEREAS, the Patient Protection and Affordable Care Act, 12 Public Law 111-148, includes guidelines for coverage of 13 14 breastfeeding support and counseling; and 15 WHEREAS, a lactation consultant is a certified health 16 professional who specializes in the clinical management of 17 breastfeeding and is trained to assist mothers in preventing and 18 solving breastfeeding difficulties, such as sore nipples and low 19 20 milk supply; and 21 22 WHEREAS, lactation consultants commonly work in hospitals, physician or midwife practices, public health programs, and 23 private practice; and 24 25 WHEREAS, lactation consultants in the United States are 26

26 WHEREAS, lactation consultants in the United States are
27 often nurses, midwives, nurse practitioners, dietitians, and
28 other healthcare professionals who have obtained additional



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certification through the International Board of Lactation 1 Consultant Examiners; and 2 3 WHEREAS, Hawaii's QUEST Integration Program, which provides 4 5 eligible low-income adults and children access to health and medical coverage through managed care plans, does not currently 6 7 allow all qualified providers who have obtained International Board of Lactation Consultant Examiners certification to provide 8 lactation consultant services; and 9 10 11 WHEREAS, Hawaii's Medicaid population would greatly benefit from increased access to lactation consultant services to assist 12 breastfeeding mothers; now, therefore, 13 14 15 BE IT RESOLVED by the House of Representatives of the Thirty-second Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular 16 17 Session of 2023, the Senate concurring, that the Department of Human Services Med-QUEST Division is requested to expand the 18 types of qualified providers allowed to provide lactation 19 20 consultant services for the Medicaid population in the State; 21 and 22 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that to expand the types of 23 qualified providers, the Department of Human Services Med-QUEST 24 Division is requested to take any steps necessary to obtain 25 necessary approvals, create internal processes, and credential 26 appropriate providers who have obtained International Board of 27 28 Lactation Consultant Examiners certification; and 29 30 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Department of Human Services Med-OUEST Division is requested to submit a report to 31 the Legislature on the steps taken and progress made in 32 33 expanding the types of providers who can provide lactation consultant services no later than twenty days prior to the 34 convening of the Regular Session of 2024; and 35 36 37 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this Concurrent Resolution be transmitted to the Director of Human 38 Services, Director of Health, and Administrator of the Med-QUEST 39 Division. 40 41 42



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
