## HOUSE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

REQUESTING THE DEPARTMENT OF HUMAN SERVICES MED-QUEST DIVISION, IN COLLABORATION WITH THE DEPARTMENT OF COMMERCE AND CONSUMER AFFAIRS, TO EXPAND THE TYPES OF QUALIFIED PROVIDERS ALLOWED TO PROVIDE LACTATION CONSULTANT SERVICES FOR THE MEDICAID POPULATION IN THE STATE.

1 WHEREAS, according to the Centers for Disease Control and 2 Prevention, breastfeeding has health benefits for babies and mothers, as breast milk provides a baby with ideal nutrition, 3 supports growth and development, and can also help protect the 4 baby and mother against certain illnesses and diseases; and 5 6 7 WHEREAS, the American Academy of Pediatrics recommends 8 exclusive breastfeeding for about six months then continued breastfeeding while introducing complementary foods until a 9 child is twelve months or older; and 10 11 WHEREAS, the Patient Protection and Affordable Care Act, 12 Public Law 111-148, includes guidelines for coverage of 13 breastfeeding support and counseling; and 14 15 WHEREAS, a lactation consultant is a certified health 16 17 professional who specializes in the clinical management of breastfeeding and is trained to assist mothers in preventing and 18 19 solving breastfeeding difficulties, such as sore nipples and low 20 milk supply; and 21 WHEREAS, lactation consultants commonly work in hospitals, 22 physician or midwife practices, public health programs, and 23 private practice; and 24 25 WHEREAS, lactation consultants in the United States are 26 often nurses, midwives, nurse practitioners, dietitians, and 27 other healthcare professionals who have obtained additional 28

certification through the International Board of Lactation 1 2 Consultant Examiners or operate as Certified Lactation 3 Counselors; and 4 5 WHEREAS, Hawaii's QUEST Integration Program, which provides 6 eligible low-income adults and children access to health and medical coverage through managed care plans, does not currently 7 allow all qualified providers who have obtained International 8 Board of Lactation Consultant Examiners certification or a 9 Certified Lactation Counselor certification from the Academy of 10 11 Lactation Policy and Practice to provide lactation consultant services; and 12 13 14 WHEREAS, Hawaii's Medicaid population would greatly benefit 15 from increased access to lactation consultant services to assist 16 breastfeeding mothers; now, therefore, 17 18 BE IT RESOLVED by the House of Representatives of the 19 Thirty-second Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 2023, the Senate concurring, that the Department of 20 Human Services Med-QUEST Division, in collaboration with the 21 22 Department of Commerce and Consumer Affairs, is requested to expand the types of qualified providers allowed to provide 23 24 lactation consultant services for the Medicaid population in the State; and 25 26 27 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Department of Human 28 Services Med-QUEST Division is requested to take any steps necessary to obtain necessary approvals, create internal 29 processes, and expand access to appropriate providers who have 30 obtained International Board of Lactation Consultant Examiners 31 certification; and 32 33 34 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Department of Human Services Med-QUEST Division is requested to submit a report to 35 the Legislature on the steps taken and progress made in 36 expanding the types of providers who can provide lactation 37 consultant services no later than twenty days prior to the 38 39 convening of the Regular Session of 2024; and 40
