## HOUSE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

URGING THE REAL ESTATE COMMISSION TO DEVELOP POLICIES AND PROGRAMS TO INFORM AND EDUCATE CONDOMINIUM ASSOCIATION OWNERS AND BOARD MEMBERS OF CERTAIN MATTERS TO PROMOTE THE EFFICIENT ADMINISTRATION OF CONDOMINIUM ASSOCIATIONS.

1 WHEREAS, the unit owners of a condominium comprise its 2 association and have duties and powers outlined in section 3 514B-104, Hawaii Revised Statutes (HRS), and must comply with 4 their association's governing declaration, bylaws, house rules, 5 and policies; and

7 WHEREAS, each year, association unit owners elect board 8 members to manage their condominium's operations; pay 9 assessments for the operation, repair, and maintenance of their 10 condominiums; and fund reserves for deferred maintenance; and 11

12 WHEREAS, boards of condominium associations are governed by 13 chapter 514B, HRS, requiring that they follow their 14 association's governing documents in managing condominium 15 operations; repairing and maintaining their condominiums; 16 assessing unit owners when needed; and facilitating capital 17 improvements; and

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19 WHEREAS, as condominiums age, repair and maintenance costs 20 also increase, which may impact association unit owners through 21 increased maintenance fees and special assessments; and 22

WHEREAS, the imposition of increased maintenance fees and special assessments can create discord and conflict between the association unit owners and their boards and managing agents, resulting in frustration, hostility, and dissension; and

28 WHEREAS, section 514B-71, HRS, requires the Real Estate 29 Commission--a commission administratively attached to the 30 Department of Commerce and Consumer Affairs that has oversight 31 of condominiums--to establish the Condominium Education Trust

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1 Fund to promote, among other things, education and research in condominium management, the improvement and more efficient 2 administration of associations, and the expeditious and 3 inexpensive resolution of association disputes; now, therefore, 4 5 BE IT RESOLVED by the House of Representatives of the 6 Thirty-second Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular 7 Session of 2023, the Senate concurring, that the Real Estate 8 9 Commission is urged to develop policies and programs to inform and educate condominium association unit owners and board 10 11 members of the following: the second second the second second second second 12 13 (1) Effective condominium governance practices, including 14 the importance of maintaining open and frequent communication; 15 16 The purpose of governing documents and how they guide 17 (2) condominium management; 18 19 (3) The respective obligations of unit owners and board 20 : <u>;</u>; members; it is the share of the 21 22 (4) The interplay between regular assessments, reserves, 23 capital improvements, and special assessments; 24 25 (5) Any other matters related to the effective 26 - . » \* : 27 administration of associations; and 28 (6) Dispute resolution processes, including the mechanics 29 30 of mediation and arbitration; and 31 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Real Estate Commission is 32 requested to use the Condominium Education Trust Fund for the 33 purposes of developing the educational policies and programs 34 requested herein; and 35 - -. 36 .
