
HOUSE RESOLUTION

REQUESTING THE DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH TO CONVENE A WORKING GROUP TO REVIEW AND UPDATE THE RELEVANT CHAPTERS OF THE HAWAII REVISED STATUTES THAT RELATE TO MENTAL HEALTH AND INVOLUNTARY TRANSPORT, EXAMINATION, HOSPITALIZATION, AND TREATMENT, INCLUDING ASSISTED COMMUNITY TREATMENT.

1 WHEREAS, the chapters of the Hawaii Revised Statutes
2 relating to mental health and involuntary transport,
3 examination, hospitalization, and treatment have been amended in
4 a piecemeal manner over the past several decades, which has led
5 to some lack in clarity and inconsistencies; and
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7 WHEREAS, periodically reviewing the Hawaii Revised Statutes
8 would be helpful to advance the overall goal of improving mental
9 health, including for those unable to help themselves; now,
10 therefore,
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12 BE IT RESOLVED by the House of Representatives of the
13 Thirty-second Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular
14 Session of 2023, that the Department of Health is requested to
15 convene a working group to review and update the relevant
16 chapters of the Hawaii Revised Statutes that relate to mental
17 health and involuntary transport, examination, hospitalization,
18 and treatment, including assisted community treatment; and
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20 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the working group is requested
21 make recommendations for statutory revisions that focus on those
22 chapters relevant to mental health-related voluntary assessment,
23 care, and treatment; and
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25 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the working group is requested
26 to include the following members:
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28 (1) The Director of Health, or the Director's designee;
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- 1 (2) The Attorney General, or the Attorney General's
2 designee;
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- 4 (3) A representative from the Department of Health, Adult
5 Mental Health Division;
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- 7 (4) A representative from the Department of Public Safety;
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- 9 (5) A representative of the Judiciary, to be selected by
10 the Chief Justice;
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- 12 (6) A representative from the Prosecutor's Office from
13 each county, to be selected by the respective
14 Prosecutor of each county;

- 16 (7) A member of the Senate Standing Committee with primary
17 jurisdiction over Health and Human Services; and
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- 19 (8) A member of the House of Representatives Standing
20 Committee with primary jurisdiction over Health and
21 Homelessness; and
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23 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the working group is requested
24 to invite other individuals with relevant experience and
25 expertise to be members of the working group, including:

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- 27 (1) Psychologists or social workers;
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- 29 (2) Psychiatrists;
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- 31 (3) Representatives from residential treatment programs;
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- 33 (4) Representatives from mental health advocacy groups;

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- 36 (5) Any other representatives the working group deems
37 necessary; and
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39 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the working group is requested
40 to select a chairperson from amongst its members; and
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
