## HOUSE RESOLUTION

REQUESTING THE DEPARTMENT OF ACCOUNTING AND GENERAL SERVICES TO PROVIDE MENSTRUAL PRODUCTS AT NO COST IN STATE BUILDINGS UNDER THE JURISDICTION OF THE DEPARTMENT OF ACCOUNTING AND GENERAL SERVICES THAT ARE OPEN TO THE PUBLIC AND CONTAIN PUBLIC RESTROOMS.

WHEREAS, period poverty has negative effects on a person's 1 2 ability to meet basic necessities, gender equality, access to education and employment, and public health; and 3 4 5 WHEREAS, a growing number of menstruating girls, women, and gender-diverse persons are at risk due to the absence of readily 6 7 available aid and financial support; and 8 9 WHEREAS, period poverty and menstrual inequity result directly from socioeconomic, gender, and racial injustices, as 10 recognized in the November 2021 report co-authored by the Hawaii 11 12 State Commission on the Status of Women and Mai'i Movement Hawai'i: and 13 14 WHEREAS, the report noted that the State's exceptionally 15 16 high cost of living and wage gap for women specifically 17 exacerbate period poverty, with nearly thirty percent of respondents reporting that they or a household member 18 experienced difficulty obtaining menstrual products, with cost 19 20 being the most cited reason; and 21 WHEREAS, recent data collected by the United States Census 22 Bureau for the Household Pulse Survey indicated 43.8 percent of 23 Hawaii households reported struggling to pay for usual household 24 25 expenses in the last seven days; and 26 27 WHEREAS, viewed within the context of many families' 28 struggles to pay for living expenses, the ongoing need to purchase menstrual products for approximately forty years 29

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1 consumes a disproportionate amount of the menstruating person's financial resources compared to a non-menstruating person; and 2 3 4 WHEREAS, providing free menstrual products in public 5 buildings would reduce health risks, alleviate the burden of 6 period poverty, and protect the dignity of all menstruating 7 people; and 8 9 WHEREAS, access to free menstrual products would also ensure inclusive and equitable access to public facilities, 10 reduce barriers faced by residents and visitors to state 11 buildings in meeting basic needs, and promote greater menstrual 12 equity in the State; now, therefore, 13 14 15 BE IT RESOLVED by the House of Representatives of the Thirty-second Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular 16 17 Session of 2023, that the Department of Accounting and General 18 Services is requested to help members of the public, regardless 19 of their gender or biology, have access to essential hygiene 20 products by providing menstrual products at no cost in state 21 buildings under the jurisdiction of the Department of Accounting and General Services that are open to the public and contain 22 23 public restrooms; and 24 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Department of Accounting 25 and General Services is requested to maintain a stock of 26 27 menstrual products, free of charge, in every women's restroom and every gender-neutral restroom of a state building under the 28 29 jurisdiction of the Department of Accounting and General 30 Services that is open to the public and contains a public restroom; and 31 32 33 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Department of Accounting 34 and General Services is requested to install in each of these restrooms a dispenser or similar device for the provision of 35 free menstrual products; and 36 37 38 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that, if a state building has no gender-neutral restroom, the Department of Accounting and 39 General Services is requested to provide free menstrual products 40 in at least one men's restroom of that state building and place 41

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signage in the remaining men's restrooms of that state building to indicate the location of free menstrual products; and BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that a certified copy of this Resolution be transmitted to the Comptroller.
