HOUSE RESOLUTION

REQUESTING THE HAWAI'I TOBACCO QUITLINE TO MAKE PERMANENTLY VISIBLE ON EACH PAGE OF ITS WEBSITE INFORMATION PERTAINING TO THE AVAILABILITY OF INTERPRETATION SERVICES UPON REQUEST.

WHEREAS, the long-term cessation of tobacco and e-cigarette 1 usage is correlated with improved physical and mental health and 2 a longer life expectancy; and 3 4 WHEREAS, the Hawai'i Tobacco Quitline is a free helpline 5 6 service that provides nicotine patches and qum, educational information, and coaching to help smokers guit smoking; and 7 8 9 WHEREAS, the Hawai'i Tobacco Quitline offers interpretation services upon request only; and 10 11 12 WHEREAS, the Hawai'i Tobacco Quitline's website is accessible solely in English and Spanish and lacks information 13 14 pertaining to the availability of interpretation services for 15 other languages; and 16 17 WHEREAS, due to the unique history and geographical 18 location of Hawai'i, the Hawaiian islands are home to a large 19 number of immigrants and their children, many of whom speak languages other than English or Spanish; and 20 21 22 WHEREAS, according to the 2020 Census, 11.4 percent of Hawai'i residents ages five and above speak English at a level 23 below "very well" and, according to a 2016 study conducted by 24 25 the Hawaii State Data Center, 48.8 percent of individuals who speak another language at home speak English less than "very 26 well"; and 27 28 29 WHEREAS, a 2012 study conducted by Thaddeus A. Herzog and Pallav Pokhrel concluded that information and products to assist 30 with smoking cessation may be less known and accessible to 31 Filipino and Native Hawaiian smokers; and 32

1 WHEREAS, according to the Department of Health, twenty-2 seven percent of Native Hawaiians in Hawai'i smoke, nearly double 3 the percentage of other ethnic groups; now, therefore, 4 5 6 BE IT RESOLVED by the House of Representatives of the Thirty-second Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular 7 Session of 2023, that the Hawai'i Tobacco Quitline is requested 8 to make permanently visible on each page of its website 9 information pertaining to the availability of interpretation 10 services upon request; and 11 12 13 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the information displayed be made accessible in Ilocano, Tagalog, Japanese, Korean, 14 Cantonese, Mandarin, and 'Ōlelo Hawai'i; and 15 16 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Hawai'i Tobacco Quitline is 17 requested to consider providing hyperlinks to translated notices 18 19 of availability of free interpretation services in a conspicuous location of each page of it's website, as exemplified by the 20 Hawaii Medical Service Association's website; and 21 22 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this 23 24 Resolution be transmitted to the Director of Health. 25 26 27 28
