HOUSE RESOLUTION

URGING THE JUDICIAL BRANCH OF THE STATE OF HAWAII TO UTILIZE ACT 277 OF THE 2019 LEGISLATIVE SESSION IN LIEU OF NO CASH BAIL.

WHEREAS, the inability to post bail has caused overcrowding 1 in our prison system, affecting upwards of 50% of pretrial 2 3 detainees; and 4 5 WHEREAS, Hawaii taxpayers pay over \$250 per day per prisoner; and 6 7 8 WHEREAS, calls for reforming the bail system continue to be 9 a topic of frequent discussion, with the Hawaii State 10 Legislature addressing the matter with the passage of SB192 in 2019, later becoming Act 277; and 11 12 13 WHEREAS, Act 277, now included in the Hawaii Revised Statutes as §804-9.5, authorizes for defendants to be released 14 15 on unsecured financial bonds under certain circumstances; and 16 17 WHEREAS, the implementation of this statute has been slow at best, and even without seeing its efficacy, has already been 18 19 overshadowed by attempts to pass more extreme policies, such as no cash bail; and 20 21 22 WHEREAS, Hawaii Revised Statutes §804-9.5 offers 23 financially challenged defendants, following careful consideration of factors including prior criminal record, 24 25 employment, family relationships, and the results of a pretrial risk assessment, the ability to be released on an unsecured bond 26 27 for all or part of the bond amount; and 28 29 WHEREAS, Hawaii Revised Statutes §804-9.5 allows for 30 defendants to sign a promissory note (IOU) for release, for which their bond obligation will be absolved upon their court 31

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1 appearance, and if they fail to appear, would then become liable for the bond amount; and 2 3

WHEREAS, Hawaii Revised Statutes §804-9.5 has thus already 4 authorized our courts to implement a "no cash bail" system, 5 taking financial and safety considerations in mind, without 6 7 needing to legislate more sweeping measures; now, therefore, 8

9 BE IT RESOLVED by the House of Representatives of the 10 Thirty-second Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 2023, that this body urges the Judicial Branch of the 11 12 State of Hawaii to implement \$804-9.5 in cases where the release of an economically challenged defendant on unsecured bond would 13 14 alleviate our prison population concerns and save taxpayers 15 money without endangering the public; and 16

17 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this 18 Resolution be transmitted to the Supreme Court of Hawaii, the State of Hawaii Judiciary System, the Prosecuting Attorney of 19 each of the four counties, members of the Hawaii State House of 20 21 Representatives, and members of the Hawaii State Senate.
