HOUSE RESOLUTION

URGING THE HAWAII TOURISM AUTHORITY, IN CONSULTATION WITH THE OFFICE OF ENTERPRISE TECHNOLOGY SERVICES, TO CONDUCT A STUDY ON THE SOCIAL AND SAFETY IMPACTS OF GEOTAGGING.

1 WHEREAS, geotagging is the process of appending geographic 2 coordinates to media based on the location of a mobile device; and 3 4 WHEREAS, geotagging provides helpful insight into consumer 5 6 activity by allowing users to share the location where a video or picture was taken or where the user is currently located; and 7 8 9 WHEREAS, geotagging also allows organizations to analyze where and how consumers interact with brands, thereby allowing 10 crganizations to provide specialized offers and messaging; and 11 12 WHEREAS, although geotagging allows a user to easily share 13 their location or where they visited with others, there are 14 unintended consequences of geotagging; and 15 16 17 WHEREAS, geotagging is one of the many contributing factors cf overtourism, a major problem for the State as the increase in 18 the number of visitors each year takes a toll on the State's 19 20 natural resources; and 21 22 WHEREAS, geotagging can attract a large number of visitors to locations that simply do not have the infrastructure needed 23 to support large numbers of visitors; and 24 25 WHEREAS, not only does this affect natural resources that 26 27 cannot support the influx of visitors, it also creates safety 28 concerns; and 29 WHEREAS, despite the potentially positive consumer, 30 marketing, and social benefits of geotagging, other impacts of 31 geotagging have yet to be studied in depth and need to be better 32

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understood to address the probable social and safety impacts of 1 the continued or expanded use of geotagging; now, therefore, 2 3 BE IT RESOLVED by the House of Representatives of the 4 Thirty-second Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular 5 Session of 2023, that the Hawaii Tourism Authority, in 6 consultation with the Office of Enterprise Technology Services, 7 is urged to conduct a study of the social and safety impacts of 8 9 geotagging in the State; and 10 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Hawaii Tourism Authority is 11 urged to submit a report of its findings and recommendations, 12 including any proposed legislation, to the Legislature no later 13 than twenty days prior to the convening of the Regular Session 14 of 2024; and 15 16 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this 17 18 Resolution be transmitted to the President and Chief Executive Officer of the Hawaii Tourism Authority and Chief Information 19 Officer of the Office of Enterprise Technology Services. 20 21 22 23
