HOUSE RESOLUTION

REQUESTING THE DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH TO CONVENE AN ORAL HEALTH TASK FORCE TO REVIEW INFORMATION ON THE STATUS OF ORAL HEALTH IN THE STATE AND MAKE RECOMMENDATIONS TO IMPROVE ORAL HEALTH INFRASTRUCTURE IN HAWAII.

1 WHEREAS, the State is unable to meet the dental public health needs of its residents; and 2 3 4 WHEREAS, the adult Medicaid population in the State has limited access to dental care; and 5 6 WHEREAS, statewide emergency department data analyzed from 7 8 calendar years 2016-2020 shows that a significant number of the State's adult Medicaid population use emergency facilities as 9 their "dental care home", which is an ineffective method of 10 dental care and a misuse of resources; and 11 12 13 WHEREAS, in 2021, approximately 42,000 people of all ages and all types of health insurance were served by federally 14 qualified health centers for dental care needs; and 15 16 17 WHEREAS, while the Department of Health operates five small dental clinics that serve individuals who are elderly, blind, 18 intellectually disabled, developmentally disabled, and mentally 19 ill, the clinics are all located in the City and County of 20 Honolulu; and 21 22 23 WHEREAS, the State does not operate dental clinics to serve similar populations on the neighbor islands; and 24 25 26 WHEREAS, while there are over 288,000 adults with Medicaid 27 dental benefits, there is a lack of dental providers for this population, with only three hundred thirty-nine dentists who 28 29 currently accept and treat adults on Medicaid; and 30



1 WHEREAS, only eleven percent of the State's dental 2 providers serve one hundred or more persons who receive Medicaid 3 assistance; and 4 5 WHEREAS, while the Legislature allocated over \$25,000,000 6 in 2022 to reinstate adult Medicaid dental benefits, there is a 7 concern that the current oral health infrastructure is insufficient to deliver oral health services to those most in 8 9 need; now, therefore, 10 BE IT RESOLVED by the House of Representatives of the 11 Thirty-second Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular 12 Session of 2023, that the Department of Health is requested to 13 convene an Oral Health Task Force to review information on the 14 status of oral health in the State and make recommendations to 15 16 improve oral health infrastructure in Hawaii; and 17 18 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the task force is requested to 19 comprise the following members: 20 21 (1)One representative of the Family Health Services 22 Division of the Department of Health, to be appointed 23 by the Director of Health; 24 (2) One representative of the Developmental Disabilities 25 Division of the Department Of Health, to be appointed 26 27 by the Director of Health; 28 29 (3) One representative of the Med-QUEST Division of the 30 Department of Human Services, to be appointed by the 31 Director of Human Services: 32 (4) One representative of the Student Services Branch of 33 34 the Department of Education, to be appointed by the 35 Superintendent of Education; 36 37 (5) One representative of the Hawaii Oral Health 38 Coalition, to be appointed by the President of the 39 Senate; 40
