A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO TRANSPORTATION.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that the department of 2 transportation manages and spends more taxpayer dollars than 3 nearly any other state agency. Most departments of 4 transportation throughout the country have robust mechanisms to 5 ensure funds are best spent, including publicly transparent 6 processes to evaluate, select, and track projects; oversight 7 commissions of expert stakeholders to independently monitor, 8 evaluate, and provide guidance to the department and 9 policymakers; and regular robust reporting that meaningfully 10 measures and assesses overall progress toward public policy 11 goals.

Accordingly, the purpose of this Act is to help the department of transportation improve transportation outcomes by establishing mechanisms enabling better transparency and accountability for transportation efforts by:

16 (1) Requiring transparency in transportation project
17 evaluation, selection, and tracking; and

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1	(2)	Adding to the membership and mission of the state
2		highway safety council to make the council an
3		independently led group of expert stakeholders that
4		may review the department of transportation's efforts
5		to ensure transparency and provide guidance to the
6		department and legislature to help achieve state goals
7		and outcomes.
8	SECT	ION 2. Section 286-5, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
9	amended t	o read as follows:
10	"§28	6-5 State highway safety council. (a) There is
11	establish	ed the Hawaii highway safety council. [The director of
12	transport	ation shall serve as its chairperson.] The council
13	shall be	chaired on an annually rotating basis between the
14	chairpers	ons of the respective committees of the house of
15	represent	atives and senate having jurisdiction over
16	transport	ation, or their designees. [The] In addition to the
17	chairpers	on of the house of representatives standing committee
18	having ju	risdiction over transportation, the chairperson of the
19	senate st	anding committee having jurisdiction over
20	transport	ation, the following or their designated
21	represent	atives shall be members of the council: the chief

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1	justice,	the attorney general, the director of health, the
2	superinte	ndent of education, the chairperson of the state public
3	<u>charter</u> s	chool commission, executive director of the state
4	public ch	arter school commission, the president of the
5	Universit	y of Hawaii, the chairperson of the University of

11	county hi	ghway safety councils established under section 286-6,
12	and not m	ore than [twenty] <u>twelve</u> other persons who shall be
13	appointed	by the governor for a three-year term as follows:
14	(1)	One member from an organization representing senior
15		citizens;
16	(2)	One member from an organization representing
17		bicyclists;
18	(3)	One member from an organization having a focus on
19		micro-mobility;
20	(4)	One member from an organization having a focus on
21		transportation, planning, and improvement;



1	<u>(5)</u>	One member from an organization having a focus on
2		reducing the cost of transportation for low-income
3		communities;
4	(6)	One member from an organization representing labor and
5		construction;
6	(7)	One member from an organization representing trucking
7		and cargo carriers;
8	(8)	One member from an organization having a focus on the
9		electrification of transportation;
10	(9)	One member from an organization having a focus on
11		expanding trees and foliage and reducing urban heat;
12	(10)	One member from an organization representing the
13		automobile manufacturing industry; and
14	(11)	Up to two members on the basis of their interest in
15		[highway] transportation safety[-] and related state
16		goals.
17	(b)	The state highway safety council shall [advise]:
18	(1)	Review programs, projects, plans, and strategies
19		related to improving safety in ground transportation
20		in the department of transportation;

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1	(2)	Ensure transparency and oversight in programs,
2		projects, decisions, and spending related to ground
3		transportation in the department of transportation;
4	(3)	Establish metrics and benchmarks for the department of
5		transportation to ensure progress on state goals
6		related to ground transportation, safety, and other
7		related goals;
8	(4)	Review projects in development and make
9		recommendations for how each might be improved, if
10		warranted, to better meet state goals, before project
11		plans and designs are finalized;
12	(5)	Provide direction to the department of transportation
13		and make recommendations to the legislature as
14		necessary to ensure progress on state goals related to
15		ground transportation, safety, and other related
16		goals;
17	(6)	Advise the governor, legislature, and public on
18		matters relating to the programs [and], activities,
19		projects, outcomes, and recommendations of the State
20		in the field of [highway] transportation safety[\pm];
21		and

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1	(7) Submit an annual report to the department of
2	transportation that reflects the work,
3	responsibilities, and recommendations of the council.
4	(c) The members of the council shall serve without pay but
5	shall be entitled to reimbursement for necessary expenses while
6	attending meetings and while in discharge of their duties."
7	SECTION 3. Members of the state highway safety council who
8	are appointed and serving on the council prior to the effective
9	date of this Act shall continue to serve any remaining time left
10	in their terms; provided that their respective expertise aligns
11	with the council membership requirements pursuant to this Act.
12	SECTION 4. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
13	and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.
14	SECTION 5. This Act shall take effect on June 30, 3000.
