A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO THE OFFICE OF HAWAIIAN AFFAIRS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The purpose of this Act is to clarify the
- 2 purpose of the working group established by Act 226, Session
- 3 Laws of Hawaii 2022, by specifying that the working group shall
- 4 be a temporary public land trust working group and will be
- 5 placed within the office of the governor for administrative
- 6 purposes only. The working group shall have the primary,
- 7 special purpose of compiling a definitive inventory of the lands
- 8 that comprise the public land trust described in section 4, and
- 9 referred to in article XII, section 6, of the Hawaii State
- 10 Constitution. The legislature intends that this inventory will
- 11 be the basis for future legislation to determine the income and
- 12 proceeds from the pro rata portion of the public land trust
- 13 under article XII, section 6, of the Hawaii State Constitution
- 14 for expenditure by the office of Hawaiian affairs for the
- 15 betterment of the conditions of native Hawaiians.
- 16 SECTION 2. Act 226, Session Laws of Hawaii 2022, is
- 17 amended by amending section 3 to read as follows:

1	"SEC	TION 3. (a) There is established in the office of the	
2	governor	for administrative purposes only a temporary public	
3	land trust working group to:		
4	(1)	[Account for] Have the primary special purpose of	
5		compiling an inventory of all ceded lands in the	
6		public land trust [inventory];	
7	(2)	Account for all income and proceeds from the public	
8		land trust; and	
9	(3)	Subsequently determine the twenty per cent pro rata	
10		share of income and proceeds from the public land	
11		trust due annually to the office of Hawaiian affairs	
12		for the betterment of the conditions of Native	
13		Hawaiians.	
14	The worki	ng group shall use its reasonable best efforts to	
15	complete	the inventory within twenty-four months of the	
16	effective	date of Act , Session Laws of Hawaii 2023.	
17	(b)	The working group shall [be comprised of] comprise six	
18	members,	[three] one of whom [three] shall be appointed by the	
19	governor <u>,</u>	one of whom shall be appointed by the speaker of the	
20	house of	representatives, one of whom shall be appointed by the	

- 1 president of the senate, and three of whom shall be appointed by
- 2 the office of Hawaiian affairs board of trustees.
- 3 (c) The working group, with the cooperation of any
- 4 department or agency that uses, manages, or receives income,
- 5 proceeds, or any other funds derived from the public land trust,
- 6 shall prepare and submit a report of its findings and
- 7 recommendations, including any proposed legislation and the
- 8 amount it determines for the annual amount of the twenty per
- 9 cent pro rata share of income and proceeds from the public land
- 10 trust, to the legislature.
- (d) The office of Hawaiian affairs shall provide any
- 12 necessary administrative support, including preparation of the
- 13 report required by subsection (c), to the working group.
- (e) All state agencies shall identify and provide full
- 15 cooperation and access to information requested by the working
- 16 group regarding all lands under the agency's ownership or
- 17 control, whether the land is owned by the agency in fee or set
- 18 aside by executive order, to the extent required by the working
- 19 group to fulfill its purpose of identifying all lands in the
- 20 public land trust inventory.

1	(f) The office of Hawaiian affairs shall provide the	
2	working group with a comprehensive list of all parcels of land	
3	that the office of Hawaiian affairs believes:	
4	(1) Are required to be included in the public land trust	
5	inventory; and	
6	(2) Constitute crown lands that should be included in the	
7	public land trust inventory.	
8	(g) The members of the working group shall appoint,	
9	without regard to chapters 76 and 89, Hawaii Revised Statutes,	
10	an executive director who shall serve at the pleasure of the	
11	working group. The executive director shall oversee the day-to-	
12	day operations of the working group and perform other functions	
13	as directed by the working group, including procuring any	
14	professional and other services necessary to complete the	
15	inventory of the public land trust. The executive director's	
16	salary shall be determined by the working group.	
17	(h) The working group may employ, without regard to	
18	chapters 76 and 89, Hawaii Revised Statutes, and at its pleasure	
19	dismiss, other persons whom the working group deems necessary	
20	for the performance of its functions. The working group may fix	

- 1 the compensation of any persons employed pursuant to this
- 2 subsection.
- 3 (i) The working group shall submit an annual report on the
- 4 progress of its work to the legislature no later than twenty
- 5 days prior to the convening of each regular session. The
- 6 working group shall further submit interim progress reports to
- 7 the legislature, office of Hawaiian affairs, and governor by the
- 8 close of each fiscal quarter."
- 9 SECTION 3. There is appropriated out of the general
- 10 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ or so
- 11 much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2023-2024 and
- 12 the same sum or so much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal
- 13 year 2024-2025 to carry out the purposes of this Act, including
- 14 the hiring of necessary staff, purchasing of equipment, and
- 15 procurement of professional and other services.
- 16 The sums appropriated shall be expended by the office of
- 17 the governor for the purposes of this Act.
- 18 SECTION 4. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
- 19 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.
- 20 SECTION 5. This Act shall take effect upon its approval;
- 21 provided that section 3 shall take effect on July 1, 2023.

Office of Hawaiian Affairs; Temporary Public Land Trust Working Group; Office of the Governor; Public Land Trust Inventory; Appropriation

Description:

Clarifies that the working group established by Act 226, Session Laws of Hawaii 2022, is a temporary public land trust working group within the Office of the Governor for administrative purposes only. Provides that the working group's primary special purpose shall be to compile a definitive inventory of public land trust lands. Amends the composition of the working group and authorizes the working group to hire staff. Appropriates funds. (SD1)
