## A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO THE RESEARCH CORPORATION OF THE UNIVERSITY OF HAWAII.

## BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that the research
- 2 corporation of the University of Hawaii, a public
- 3 instrumentality of the State that is administratively attached
- 4 to the University of Hawaii, was established in 1965 for the
- 5 purposes of promoting, encouraging, initiating, developing, and
- 6 conducting scientific research and investigation in all branches
- 7 of learning and disseminating this research and investigation to
- 8 the public.
- 9 To promote cooperative research projects with private firms
- 10 and persons, the legislature at the time granted the research
- 11 corporation of the University of Hawaii flexibility in the
- 12 hiring of its personnel and handling and disbursement of moneys
- 13 by exempting the corporation from state laws relating to
- 14 reimbursement of special funds to the state general fund;
- 15 advertisement for bids and purchases to be made in Hawaii
- 16 whenever public moneys are expended; civil service;

- 1 compensation; and public employment. The legislature finds,
- 2 however, that it is a matter of statewide concern that the
- 3 research corporation of the University of Hawaii has gradually
- 4 expanded its undertakings over the years into areas beyond its
- 5 original eponymous purpose, and the benefits of the exemptions
- 6 from statutory requirements have been extended to apply beyond
- 7 what was originally intended by the legislature. For example,
- 8 the research corporation's current website provides that one of
- 9 its missions is to "support and enhance . . . development" in
- 10 Hawaii.
- 11 The purpose of this Act is to clarify that the purpose of
- 12 the research corporation of the University of Hawaii is to
- 13 promote educational, scientific, and literary pursuits through
- 14 research, training of research personnel, and dissemination of
- 15 knowledge by publication of research findings, and the
- 16 corporation's undertakings shall be limited to acts that are
- 17 reasonably necessary to carry out this purpose.
- 18 SECTION 2. Section 304A-112, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 19 amended to read as follows:
- 20 "[+] §304A-112[+] Contracts for services provided by the
- 21 research corporation of the University of Hawaii. (a)

- 1 Notwithstanding any law to the contrary, when the university
- 2 determines that neither the university nor another state agency
- 3 can more effectively or efficiently accomplish the purposes of
- 4 the sponsored research and training activities, the university
- 5 [shall] may contract with the research corporation of the
- 6 University of Hawaii established under section [+] 304A-3001[+]
- 7 to provide management and other services as described in
- 8 subsection (b) to support the university's research and training
- 9 activities. Contracts by the university with the research
- 10 corporation pursuant to this section shall be limited to
- 11 sponsored research and training projects; except that
- 12 [university projects supported by] funds appropriated by the
- 13 legislature may [also] be contracted to the research corporation
- 14 [pursuant to rules adopted by the board of regents.] for
- 15 purposes of supporting or facilitating sponsored research and
- 16 training activities.
- 17 (b) Management and other support services provided by the
- 18 research corporation pursuant to this section may include:
- 19 (1) The procurement of goods and services;
- 20 (2) Employment of personnel; and

1 The provision of advance funding for research and (3) 2 training contracts and grants. 3 These services may be provided by the corporation to the 4 university without regard to [chapter] chapters 76, 78, 89, or 5 103D. 6 (c) For each state project or program involving the 7 research corporation and each project or program involving the 8 research corporation and a state employee, the university shall 9 notify the exclusive representative of the appropriate 10 bargaining unit to review conformance of positions with 11 exceptions to collective bargaining. The corporation shall not 12 supplant civil service employees and shall obtain approval from 13 the governor on all initial requests for service projects." 14 SECTION 3. Section 304A-3001, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 15 amended by amending subsection (b) to read as follows: 16 "(b) The purposes of the research corporation shall 17 [include, but not be limited to,] be the promotion of [all] 18 educational, scientific, and literary pursuits [by:] through 19 the: 20 (1) [Encouraging, initiating, aiding, developing, and 21 conducting training,] Conduct of research[, and study]

1		in the physical, biological, and social sciences $[\tau]$ :
2		humanities $[\tau]$ ; and all other branches of learning;
3	(2)	[Encouraging and aiding in the education and]
4		Provision of training [of persons for the conduct of
5		the training, investigations, research, and study; ] to
6		individuals engaged in the conduct of research; and
7	[ <del>(3)</del>	Furnishing of means, methods, and agencies by which
8		the training, investigation, research, and study may
9		be conducted;
10	<del>(4)</del>	Assisting in the dissemination of knowledge by
11		establishing, aiding, and maintaining professorships
12		or other staff positions, fellowships, scholarships,
13		publications, and lectures;
14	<del>(5)</del>	Engaging in other means of making the benefits of
15		training, investigations, research, and study
16		available to the public; and
17	<del>(6)</del>	Taking any and all other actions reasonably designed
18		to promote these purposes in the interest of promoting
19		the general welfare of the people of the State.]
20	(3)	Dissemination of knowledge by the publication of
21		research findings."

1	SECT	ION 4. Section 304A-3003, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
2	amended t	o read as follows:
3	"[+]	§304A-3003[] Powers of the research corporation. (a)
4	The resea	rch corporation, under the direction of the board of
5	directors	, shall have the following general powers:
6	(1)	To adopt, amend, and repeal bylaws governing the
7		conduct of its business and the exercise of the powers
8		and performance of duties granted to or imposed upon
9		it by law;
10	(2)	To sell, lease, rent, hold, maintain, use, and operate
11		any property, real, personal, or mixed, tangible or
12		intangible, in accordance with the conditions under
13		which it was received;
14	(3)	To enter into and perform [such] contracts, leases,
15		cooperative agreements, or other transactions with the
16		university or any other agency or political
17		subdivision of the State, any private person, firm,
18		partnership, association, company, or corporation,
19		only [as it may be] when the board of directors
20		determines that doing so is necessary in the conduct
21		of [its] the research corporation's business of

research, training of research personnel, and
publication of research findings, and only on [such]
terms [as it may deem] that the board of directors
deems reasonable and appropriate; provided that the
research corporation shall not obligate any funds of
the State except those that have been appropriated to
it.

Notwithstanding the foregoing, the research corporation may enter into and perform [such] contracts, leases, cooperative agreements, or other transactions with any agency or instrumentality of the United States, a foreign nation, a state, a territory, or a possession, or with any political subdivision thereof, for research, training of research personnel, or publication of research findings, whenever the donating or granting agency or instrumentality determines and documents that the university or any other agency of the State cannot [as effectively and efficiently] accomplish the purposes for which [such] the contracts, leases, cooperative agreements, or other transactions are being entered into; provided

1	that the research corporation shall not obligate any
2	funds of the State except those that have been
3	appropriated to it;

otherwise from private sources only, any property, real, personal, or mixed, intangible or tangible, absolutely or in trust, to be used and disposed of, either the principal or the income therefrom, in accordance with the conditions under which it was received; [except] provided that no gift to the research corporation shall be accepted unless approved [or confirmed] by the board of directors[-] as a gift that is beneficial to the research corporation's business of research, training of research personnel, and publication of research findings.

Notwithstanding the foregoing, the research corporation may receive gifts, grants, or awards from any agency or instrumentality of the United States, a foreign nation, a state, a territory, or a possession, or from any political subdivision thereof, whenever the donating or granting agency or instrumentality

1		determines and documents that the university of any
2		other agency of the State cannot [as effectively and
3		efficiently] accomplish the purposes for which the
4		gifts, grants, or awards are being made[ <del>, except</del> ];
5		provided that no gift to the research corporation
6		shall be accepted unless approved [or confirmed] by
7		the board of directors[+] as a gift that is beneficial
8		to the research corporation's business of research,
9		training of research personnel, and publication of
10		research findings;
11	(5)	To have a corporate seal;
12	(6)	To sue and be sued in its own name;
13	(7)	To serve as trustee or beneficiary under terms of any
14		gift, indenture, or will;
15	(8)	To apply for, take out, receive by purchase or gift,
16		hold, administer, and dispose of copyrights, patent
17		rights, licenses, assignments of inventions,
18		discoveries, processes, and other property $[\tau]$ rights
19		or interests therein, and the income thereof,
20		absolutely or subject to [such] conditions or trusts
21		as may be attached thereto or be imposed thereon, and

1		to obligate itself to perform and execute any and all
2		[such] conditions or trusts;
3	(9)	To conduct research, studies, experiments,
4		investigations, and tests in [all fields of knowledge;
5		to] the physical, biological, and social sciences;
6		humanities; and all other branches of learning;
7	(10)	To promote and develop the scientific and commercial
8		value of inventions, discoveries, and processes; and
9		to make[, publish, and distribute] available to the
10		<pre>public the results thereof;</pre>
11	[ <del>(10)</del> ]	(11) To coordinate and correlate activities and
12		projects of the research corporation with the work of
13		state agencies for the purpose of [relating]
14		correlating research work [to] with the economic
15		development of the State whenever [practical or
16		desirable; the board of directors determines and
17		documents that doing so serves the purposes of the
18		research corporation as described in section
19		304A-3001;
20	[ <del>(11)</del> ]	(12) To stimulate and promote cooperative research
21		projects and activities;

1	[ <del>(12)</del> ]	(13)	To [establish and maintain, or to assist in
2		estal	olishing and maintaining,]:

17	[ <del>(13)</del> ]	(14)	To prepare[, print, or] and publish in any

21		ther	eof, whether it] form, any research finding that

1		belongs to or is the work of any state agency or its
2		employees, [or] the university or [one of] its faculty
3		members or employees, $[\Theta r]$ the research corporation or
4		its employees, or a contractor of the research
5		corporation. The [printing or] preparation and
6		publication of research findings may be accomplished
7		through whatever person, company, or agency is deemed
8		most appropriate by the board of directors; [and]
9	(15)	To retain contracts related to invasive species
10		control and eradication; and
11	[ <del>(14)</del> ]	(16) To do any or all other acts reasonably necessary
12		to carry out the [objects and] purposes of the
13		research corporation [and the university.] described
14		in section 304A-3001.
15	(b)	For the purposes of this section, "research personnel"
16	means any	individual who is classified by the university or the
17	hiring en	tity as a research worker, spends the majority of work
18	hours eng	aged in the conduct of research, and receives
19	compensat	ion as a research worker."
20	SECT	ION 5. Section 304A-3005, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
21	amended t	o read as follows:

1	"§30	4A-3005 Research corporation excepted from certain
2	state law	s. (a) To carry out the purposes [and objectives] of
3	the resea	rch corporation[ <del>, including the conduct of research and</del>
4	training	projects, described in section 304A-3001, the research
5	corporation	on shall be granted flexibility in the hiring of its
6	personnel	and [in] handling and [disbursing] disbursement of
7	moneys by	being excepted from the following state laws:
8	(1)	Sections 36-27 and 36-30, relating to special fund
9		reimbursements to the state general fund;
10	(2)	Chapter 103D, relating to advertising for bids and
11		purchases to be made in Hawaii whenever public moneys
12		are expended; provided that the exception shall not
13		apply to bids and purchases of goods and services that
14		are not used for research, training of research
15		personnel, or publication of research findings;
16	[ <del>-(3)-</del>	Chapter 103D with respect to construction contracts;
17		provided that the exception shall not apply where
18		state funds are used and compliance with chapter 103D
19		is required by a bill enacted by the legislature;
20	<del>(4)</del> ]	(3) Chapter 76, relating to civil service; and
21	[ <del>-(5)-</del> ]	(4) Section 78-1, relating to public employment.

(b) For the purposes of this section, "research personnel" 1 means any individual who is classified by the university or the 2 hiring entity as a research worker, spends the majority of work 3 hours engaged in the conduct of research, and receives 4 5 compensation as a research worker." 6 SECTION 6. Section 304A-3010, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 7 amended to read as follows: 8 "[f] §304A-3010[f] Special account[f]; revolving accounts; internal service orders. (a) Notwithstanding any other law to 9 10 the contrary, the research corporation shall be authorized to 11 set up a special account for depositing moneys received from 12 either public or private contracts, or from private or public 13 grants, awards, or gifts[-] relating to research and training. 14 The provisions of section [+]304A-2003[+] and other laws to the 15 contrary notwithstanding, this special account may be used to 16 receive, disburse, and account for funds of research and 17 training projects of the University of Hawaii, other state 18 agencies, and political subdivisions of the State. All 19 disbursements shall be drawn on the special account upon checks 20 prepared and signed, as approved by the executive director and

some other person authorized by the board of directors.

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1	(b) Any levolving accounts here by the research
2	corporation shall follow all laws governing the body and
3	policies established by the corporation. The research
4	corporation shall also follow administrative procedures, AP
5	12.204, relating to the guidelines and procedures for revolving
6	fund service orders to the research corporation. Within thirty
7	days of the adoption of any amendment to administrative
8	procedures, AP 12.204, by the University of Hawaii and the
9	research corporation, the University of Hawaii shall submit a
10	report to the legislature containing the amended language and a
11	summary of the amendment.
12	(c) All internal service orders and revolving accounts of
13	the research corporation that involve the use of University of
14	Hawaii intramural funds shall be limited to projects relating
15	directly to research and training in which:
16	(1) Much of the operation will lie outside the State; or
17	(2) There is a substantial amount of ship operations,
18	technical shop-type operations, computer services, or
19	involvement with other research corporation projects;
20	and shall be reported to the legislature for financial and
21	mission compliance according to University of Hawaii and

- 1 research corporation policies on a biannual basis. The
- 2 University of Hawaii and the research corporation shall review
- 3 and approve all revolving accounts on an annual basis."
- 4 SECTION 7. If any provision of this Act, or the
- 5 application thereof to any person or circumstance, is held
- 6 invalid, the invalidity does not affect other provisions or
- 7 applications of the Act that can be given effect without the
- 8 invalid provision or application, and to this end the provisions
- 9 of this Act are severable.
- 10 SECTION 8. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
- 11 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.
- 12 SECTION 9. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2023;
- 13 provided that the amendments made to section 304A-3003, Hawaii
- 14 Revised Statutes, by section 4 of this Act shall apply only to
- 15 contracts entered into by the research corporation of the
- 16 University of Hawaii after June 30, 2023.

## Report Title:

Research Corporation of the University of Hawaii; Purpose; Powers; Exemptions; Contracts for Services

## Description:

Clarifies the purpose of the Research Corporation of the University of Hawaii and that its undertakings shall be limited to acts that are reasonably necessary to carry out its purpose. Repeals the requirement that the University of Hawaii contract with the Research Corporation when the University determines that other various agencies cannot more effectively or efficiently accomplish certain research and training activities. Grandfathers existing Research Corporation contracts and requires new contracts be subject to new limitations. Limits the scope of the special account the Research Corporation is authorized to establish. Requires revolving accounts to follow Corporation policies. Limits internal service orders and revolving accounts of the Research Corporation that use University intramural funds to certain projects and requires biannual reports to the Legislature. (SD1)

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
