A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO SUSTAINABLE LAND USE.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	PART I
2	SECTION 1. The legislature finds that multiple climate and
3	sustainability statutory targets have been enacted in the State,
4	including developing at least 22,500 affordable rental housing
5	units, doubling food production, increasing food exports,
6	requiring the department of education and university of Hawaii
7	to become net-zero in energy use, requiring that all of the
8	electricity generated in Hawaii come from renewable sources,
9	sequestering more atmospheric carbon and greenhouse gases,
10	requiring all state and county facilities to use reclaimed
11	water, and requiring the mandatory upgrade of all cesspools.
12	The legislature recognizes that with the recent expansion
13	of the office of planning and sustainable development through
14	Act 45, Session Laws of Hawaii 2020, and Acts 152 and 153,
15	Session Laws of Hawaii 2021, the office of planning and
16	sustainable development functionally serves as the State's

- 1 centralized coordinating agency to lead efforts in thoughtful
- 2 and environmentally sustainable land use policies.
- 3 The legislature further finds that the State lacks a plan
- 4 integrating the various goals and studies, especially on the use
- 5 of agricultural lands. An integrated plan would help to address
- 6 recent events and public opposition to affordable housing
- 7 projects and renewable energy projects on agricultural land.
- 8 The purpose of this Act is to require the office of
- 9 planning and sustainable development to develop an integrated
- 10 land use plan that incorporates the various environmental
- 11 studies and will serve as a guide for planning and decision
- 12 making on the use of agricultural lands.
- 13 SECTION 2. Chapter 226, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 14 amended by adding a new part to be appropriately designated and
- 15 to read as follows:
- 16 "PART . INTEGRATED LAND USE PLAN
- 17 §226- Integrated land use plan; generally. (a) The
- 18 office shall publish an integrated land use plan for
- 19 agricultural districts.
- (b) The purpose of the integrated land use plan shall be
- 21 to develop land use data that can lead to planning and

- 1 decision-making for the competing uses of land within an
- 2 agricultural district, and to determine the feasibility and land
- 3 use needs to meet the State's climate, sustainability, and
- 4 housing statutory targets, while accounting for the additional
- 5 climate adaptation and land use needs for the potential movement
- 6 away and managed retreat from at-risk land parcels.
- 7 (c) The integrated land use plan shall incorporate the
- 8 recommendations of the Hawaii 2050 sustainability plan, the
- 9 Hawaii sea level rise vulnerability and adaptation report, the
- 10 feasibility and implications of managed retreat strategies for
- 11 vulnerable coastal areas report, and the other climate,
- 12 sustainability, and housing statutory targets, as needed.
- (d) The integrated land use plan shall also include
- 14 recommendations for each county.
- 15 (e) The development of the integrated land use plan shall
- 16 follow the procedures specified in this part.
- 17 §226- Integrated land use plan; develop definitive data
- 18 and update state functional plans. (a) The office shall
- 19 develop definitive data on the amount of land required to meet
- 20 the goals of identifying competing uses by compiling and
- 21 analyzing existing data from the various government entities,



- 1 including the department of agriculture; department of
- 2 transportation; department of land and natural resources;
- 3 department of business, economic development, and tourism;
- 4 Hawaii state energy office; Hawaii housing finance and
- 5 development corporation; public utilities commission; and the
- 6 counties. Secondary input shall be sought from the university
- 7 of Hawaii, utility companies, nonprofit agricultural
- 8 organizations, the agricultural community, and other
- 9 organizations or entities deemed appropriate by the office.
- 10 (b) The state functional plan on:
- 11 (1) Energy shall be updated by the Hawaii state energy
- 12 office;
- 13 (2) Agriculture shall be updated by the department of
- 14 agriculture to align with Act 151, Session Laws of
- 15 Hawaii 2019;
- 16 (3) Conservation shall be updated by the department of
- 17 land and natural resources;
- 18 (4) Transportation shall be updated by the department of
- transportation to align with the Hawaii highways
- climate adaptation action plan; and

- (5) Tourism shall be updated by the Hawaii tourism
 authority.
- 3 (c) The updates required by subsection (b) shall include:
- 4 (1) The removal of outdated agricultural economic
- 5 language;
- 6 (2) Amendments to align the respective plan with
 7 twenty-first century climate and sustainability
 8 statutory targets; and
- 9 (3) Amendments to align the respective plan with the 10 Hawaii 2050 sustainability plan.
- 11 (d) The departments and agencies shall comply with
 12 section 226-55 and work in partnership with the office and
 13 stakeholders in updating their respective state functional
 14 plans.
- 15 §226- Integrated land use plan; outreach and plan
 16 submission. (a) The office shall conduct outreach to ensure
 17 county and community input and acceptance.
- (b) Once the initial compilation of data is completed, the office shall analyze the available acreage in each county along with the potential impacts for the proposed changes.

1 The office shall submit the integrated land use plan (c) to the legislature and the land use commission no later than 2 twenty days prior to the regular session of 2026 and shall 3 submit updates to the integrated land use plan every ten years 4 5 thereafter. Integrated land use plan; county updates. 6 **§226**county shall update its respective general plan, community 7 8 plans, and other land use project proposals to conform to the 9 integrated land use plan and updated state functional plans." 10 SECTION 3. The office of planning and sustainable development shall submit a report no later than twenty days 11 prior to the regular session of 2025 on the progress of 12 developing the definitive data and the various functional plan 13 14 updates. 15 SECTION 4. There is appropriated out of the general 16 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$530,000 or so much 17 thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2023-2024 for four 18 planner V (4.0 FTE) positions, one administrative support staff personnel (1.0 FTE) position, computers, office supplies, 19 **20** travel, and other expenses for the office of planning and

- 1 sustainable development to develop definitive data and submit a
- 2 report.
- 3 The sum appropriated shall be expended by the office of
- 4 planning and sustainable development for the purposes of this
- 5 Act.
- 6 SECTION 5. There is appropriated out of the general
- 7 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$750,000 or so much
- 8 thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2023-2024 and the
- 9 same sum or so much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year
- 10 2024-2025 to update the various state functional plans to be
- 11 allocated as follows:
- 12 (1) \$150,000 to the Hawaii state energy office;
- 13 (2) \$150,000 to the department of agriculture;
- 14 (3) \$150,000 to the department of land and natural
- resources;
- 16 (4) \$150,000 to the department of transportation; and
- 17 (5) \$150,000 to the Hawaii tourism authority;
- 18 The sums appropriated shall be expended by each department
- 19 or agency for the purposes of this Act.
- 20 SECTION 6. There is appropriated out of the general
- 21 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$1,215,000 or so much



- 1 thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2024-2025 for four
- 2 planner V (4.0 FTE) positions, one administrative support staff
- 3 personnel (1.0 FTE) position, one geographic information systems
- 4 specialist (1.0 FTE) position, one public communications and
- 5 outreach specialist (1.0 FTE) position, computers, office
- 6 supplies, publication costs, website and multimedia public
- 7 outreach, management and service fees, and travel costs.
- 8 The sum appropriated shall be expended by the office of
- 9 planning and sustainable development for the purposes of this
- 10 Act.
- 11 SECTION 7. There is appropriated out of the general
- 12 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ or so
- 13 much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2024-2025 to be
- 14 allocated as follows:
- 15 (1) \$ to the county of Hawaii;
- 16 (2) \$ to the county of Kauai;
- 17 (3) \$ to the county of Maui; and
- 18 (4) \$ to the city and county of Honolulu,
- 19 to update their general plans, community plans, and other land
- 20 use project proposals.

- 1 The sum appropriated shall be expended by each county for
- 2 the purposes of this Act.
- 3 SECTION 8. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2023.
