A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO SUSTAINABLE LAND USE.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that multiple climate and sustainability statutory targets have been enacted in the State, 2 3 including developing at least 22,500 affordable rental housing units, doubling food production, increasing food exports, 4 requiring the department of education and University of Hawaii 5 to become net-zero in energy use, requiring that all of the 6 7 electricity generated in Hawaii come from renewable sources, sequestering more atmospheric carbon and greenhouse gases, 8 requiring all state and county facilities to use reclaimed 9 10 water, and requiring the mandatory upgrade of all cesspools.

11 The legislature recognizes that with the recent expansion 12 of the office of planning and sustainable development through 13 Act 45, Session Laws of Hawaii 2020, and Acts 152 and 153, 14 Session Laws of Hawaii 2021, the office of planning and 15 sustainable development functionally serves as the State's 16 centralized coordinating agency to lead efforts in thoughtful, 17 climate-adaptive and sustainable land use policies.



1 The legislature further finds that the State lacks a plan
2 that integrates the various goals and studies, especially on the
3 use of agricultural lands. An integrated study would help to
4 address recent events and public opposition to affordable
5 housing projects and renewable energy projects on agricultural
6 land.

7 The purpose of this Act is to require the office of 8 planning and sustainable development to develop an integrated 9 land use study that incorporates the various studies to serve as 10 a guide for planning and decision making on the use of 11 agricultural lands.

SECTION 2. Chapter 226, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is amended by adding three new sections to part II to be appropriately designated and to read as follows:

15 "<u>§226-</u> Integrated land use study; generally. (a) The

16 office shall publish an integrated land use study for

17 agricultural districts.

18 (b) The purpose of the integrated land use study shall be
19 to:



1	(1) Develop land use data that can be used for planning				
2	and decision-making for the competing uses of land				
3	within an agricultural district; and				
4	(2) Determine the feasibility and land use needs to meet				
5	the State's climate, sustainability, and housing				
6	statutory targets,				
7	while accounting for the additional climate adaptation and land				
8	use needs for the potential movement away and managed retreat				
9	from at-risk land parcels.				
10	(c) The integrated land use study shall incorporate the				
11	recommendations of the Hawaii 2050 sustainability plan pursuant				
12	to section 226-65; the Hawaii sea level rise vulnerability and				
13	adaptation report pursuant to section 225P-3; the feasibility				
14	and implications of managed retreat strategies for vulnerable				
15	coastal areas report; and the State's climate, sustainability,				
16	and housing statutory targets, as needed. The integrated land				
17	use study shall also give consideration to the 2022 state land				
18	use review of districts, Hawaii state plan update phase one, and				
19	the soil classification study required pursuant to Act 189,				
20	Session Laws of Hawaii 2022.				



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1	(d) The integrated land use study shall include					
2	recommendations for each county.					
3	(e) The development of the integrated land use study shall					
4	follow the procedures specified in this part.					
5	<u>§226-</u> Integrated land use study; develop definitive					
6	data and update state functional plans. (a) The office shall					
7	develop definitive data on the amount of land required to meet					
8	the goals of identifying competing uses by compiling and					
9	analyzing existing data from various government entities,					
10	including the department of agriculture; department of					
11	transportation; department of land and natural resources;					
12	department of business, economic development, and tourism;					
13	Hawaii state energy office; Hawaii housing finance and					
14	development corporation; public utilities commission; and the					
15	counties. Secondary input shall be sought from the University					
16	of Hawaii, utility companies, nonprofit agricultural					
17	organizations, the agricultural community, and other					
18	organizations or entities deemed appropriate by the office.					
19	(b) The state functional plan on:					
20	(1) Energy shall be updated by the Hawaii state energy					
21	office;					

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1	(2)	Agriculture shall be updated by the department of		
2		agriculture to align with Act 151, Session Laws of		
3		Hawaii 2019;		
4	<u>(3)</u>	Transportation shall be updated by the department of		
5		transportation to align with the Hawaii highways		
6		climate adaptation action plan; and		
7	7 (4) Tourism shall be updated by the Hawaii tourism			
8	·	authority to align with the destination management		
9		action plans.		
10	<u>(c)</u>	The updates required by subsection (b) shall include:		
11	(1)	The removal of outdated agricultural economic		
12		provisions;		
13	(2)	Amendments to align the respective plans with the		
14		State's twenty-first century climate and		
15		sustainability statutory targets;		
16	(3)	Amendments to align the respective plans with the		
17		Hawaii 2050 sustainability plan; and		
18	(4)	Amendments to align with the Hawaii state plan update,		
19		phase one.		
20	(d)	The departments and agencies shall comply with		
21	section 2	26-55 and work in partnership with the office and		



1	stakeholders in updating their respective state functional
2	plans.
3	<u>§226-</u> Integrated land use study; outreach and plan
4	submission. (a) The office shall conduct outreach to ensure
5	county and community input and acceptance.
6	(b) Once the initial compilation of data is completed, the
7	office shall analyze the available acreage in each county along
8	with the potential impacts for the proposed changes.
9	(c) The office shall submit the integrated land use study
10	to the legislature and the land use commission no later than
11	twenty days prior to the convening of the regular session of
12	2026 and shall submit updates of the integrated land use study
13	every ten years thereafter."
14	SECTION 3. The office of planning and sustainable
15	development shall submit a report to the legislature no later
16	than twenty days prior to the convening of the regular session
17	of 2025 on the progress of developing definitive data and the
18	various functional plan updates.
19	SECTION 4. There is appropriated out of the general
20	revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ or so
21	much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2023-2024 for



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1 the establishment of four full-time equivalent (4.0 FTE) planner
2 V positions; one full-time equivalent (1.0 FTE) administrative
3 support staff personnel position; and one full-time equivalent
4 (1.0 FTE) geographic information systems specialist position;
5 and computers, office supplies, travel, and other expenses for
6 the office of planning and sustainable development to develop
7 definitive data and submit a report.

8 The sum appropriated shall be expended by the office of
9 planning and sustainable development for the purposes of this
10 Act.

SECTION 5. There is appropriated out of the general revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ or so much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2023-2024 and the same sum or so much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2024-2025 to update the various state functional plans; provided that the moneys shall be allocated as follows:

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1 (5) \$ to the Hawaii tourism authority. 2 The sums appropriated shall be expended by each respective 3 department or agency for the purposes of this Act. 4 SECTION 6. There is appropriated out of the general 5 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ or so much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2024-2025 for 6 7 the establishment of four full-time equivalent (4.0 FTE) planner 8 V positions; one full-time equivalent (1.0 FTE) administrative 9 support staff personnel position; one full-time equivalent (1.0 10 FTE) geographic information systems specialist position; and one 11 full-time equivalent (1.0 FTE) public communications and 12 outreach specialist position; and computers, office supplies, 13 publication costs, website and multimedia public outreach, 14 management and service fees, and travel costs. 15 The sum appropriated shall be expended by the office of 16 planning and sustainable development for the purposes of this 17 Act.

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SECTION 8. This Act shall take effect on June 30, 3000.
