## A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO MENTAL HEALTH.

#### BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that mental health 2 conditions are treated in various ways, depending on the 3 condition, and can include medication, therapy, and psychosocial 4 services. Congress, through the Breakthrough Therapies Act, and 5 the United States Food and Drug Administration have indicated that methylenedioxymethamphetamine, commonly known as MDMA, and 6 7 psilocybin will be rescheduled to enable therapeutic use. MDMA 8 and psilocybin have already been granted the United States Food 9 and Drug Administration's breakthrough therapy designation to 10 fast-track research and potential approval, given their efficacy 11 in treating treatment-resistant depression and post-traumatic 12 stress disorder. These treatments, while effective for certain conditions and patients, do not treat all mental health 13 conditions. Research supports the effectiveness of natural and 14 alternative medicines and therapies, such as the use of MDMA, 15 16 psilocybin, and other therapies, as safe and effective ways to

3	The purpose of this Act is to establish the beneficial				
4	treatments advisory council to review, evaluate, and recommend				
5	new medicinal treatments for mental health.				
6	SECTION 2. Chapter 321, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is				
7	amended by addi	ing a new section to part I to be appropriately			
8	designated and	to read as follows:			
9	" <u>§321-</u>	Beneficial treatments advisory council;			
10	established.	(a) There is established within the department			
11	for administrat	tive purposes only, a beneficial treatments			
12	advisory counci	1. The council shall consist of the following			
13	members:				
14	(1) Five	of the members shall be the following ex officio			
15	votir	ng members, or their respective designees:			
16	<u>(A)</u>	The executive director of the office of wellness			
17		and resilience, who shall serve as the			
18		chairperson of the advisory council;			
19	(B)	The attorney general;			
20	(C)	The chairpersons of the senate and house standing			
21		committees whose purviews include health; and			



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1		<u>(D)</u>	The chairperson of the Hawaii state council on
2			mental health; and
3	(2)	Four	of the members shall be appointed pursuant to
4		sect	ion 26-34 and shall consist of:
5		(A)	A physician who is duly licensed pursuant to
6			chapter 453 or an advanced practice registered
7			nurse who is authorized to prescribe psychotropic
8			medication and is duly licensed pursuant to
9			chapter 457;
10		<u>(B)</u>	A physician duly licensed pursuant to chapter
11			453, with specialties in substance abuse and
12			psychiatry;
13		<u>(C)</u>	One representative from an organization that
14			advocates for the therapeutic use of plant-based
15			psychedelic modalities; and
16		<u>(D)</u>	One representative from an accredited research
17			institution providing certification and training
18		•	for professionals on the use of psychedelic
19			modalities.
20	(b)	The	members of the advisory council shall serve
21	without c	omper	sation but shall be reimbursed for expenses,



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1	including	travel expenses, necessary for the performance of			
2	their duties.				
3	(c)	The beneficial treatments advisory council shall:			
4	(1)	Examine federal, state, and local laws, regulations,			
5		administrative rules, and procedures regarding the			
6		treatment of mental health;			
7	(2)	Examine available medical, psychological, and			
8		scientific studies, research, and other information			
9	:	relating to the safety and efficacy of methods to			
10		treat mental health conditions;			
11	(3)	Examine requirements, specifications, and guidelines			
12		for a medical professional to prescribe and provide			
13		various treatments to patients in jurisdictions in			
14		which the treatment is used to treat mental health			
15		conditions;			
16	(4)	Develop a long-term strategic plan to ensure the			
17		availability of therapeutic psilocybin,			
18	· .	psilocybin-based products, and			
19		methylenedioxymethamphetamine that are safe,			
20		accessible, and affordable for adults twenty-one years			
21		of age or older; and			



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1	(5) Advise the department on new and revised mental h	ealth
2	treatment options."	
3	SECTION 3. New statutory material is underscored.	
4	SECTION 4. This Act shall take effect on December 31,	
5	2050.
