A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO TRANSPORTATION.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that as fuel tax revenues 2 decrease, the department of transportation recommends the 3 adoption of a per-mile road usage charge system to provide sustainable funding for the State's road infrastructure. 4 The 5 legislature also finds that with its existing vehicle inspection 6 program, Hawaii is well-positioned to transition to a per-mile 7 road usage charge system at low administrative costs. The 8 legislature additionally finds that replacing the registration 9 surcharge on electric vehicles with a mileage-based road user 10 fee is a minimally disruptive first step to transition the State 11 to a per-mile road usage charge system as recommended by the 12 department of transportation. With the increase in public 13 support for fuel-efficient electric and alternative fuel vehicles, the shift to fees based on vehicle miles traveled is 14 15 fair to all drivers within the State and ensures that the owners of alternative fuel vehicles pay a fair share of Hawaii's 16 17 roadway maintenance costs.

1 benchmarks, and strategies to reduce vehicle miles 2 traveled and the cost of transportation. 3 SECTION 2. Chapter 249, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 4 amended by adding a new section to be appropriately designated 5 and to read as follows: 6 "§249- State mileage-based road usage charge. (a) 7 Beginning July 1, 2025, in addition to all other fees and taxes 8 levied by this chapter, vehicles defined in subsection (c) shall 9 be subject to a state mileage-based road usage charge. The 10 state mileage-based road usage charge shall be calculated by the 11 county director of finance at the rate of cents per 12 mile traveled, multiplied by the number of miles traveled, less 13 the estimated amount of paid state motor fuel taxes that 14 correspond with the number of miles traveled. This estimate 15 shall be determined by departmental administrative rulemaking 16 process. The number of miles traveled shall be calculated as 17 the difference between the vehicle's two most recent odometer 18 readings, as noted on the vehicle's certificate of inspection 19 pursuant to section 286-26(e). The state mileage-based road 20 usage charge shall not be less than zero dollars. For the first 21 registration renewal of new motor vehicles for which no



1	certificate of inspection is required, the state mileage-based
2	road usage charge assessed shall be \$70, and such amount once
3	paid shall be subtracted from the calculation of the state
4	mileage-based road usage charge upon that vehicle's second
5	registration renewal.
6	(b) The state mileage-based road usage charge shall be
7	paid each year following the vehicle's most recent inspection
8	together with all other taxes and fees levied by this chapter on
9	a staggered basis as established by each county as authorized by
10	section 286-51, and the state mileage-based road usage charge
11	shall likewise be staggered so that the state mileage-based road
12	usage charge is due and payable at the same time and shall be
13	collected together with the county registration fee. The state
14	mileage-based road usage charge shall be deemed delinquent if
15	not paid with the county registration fee. The respective
16	counties shall collect the state mileage-based road usage charge
17	together with the vehicle registration tax collected for the
18	county and shall transfer the moneys collected under this
19	section to the state director of finance for deposit into the
20	state highway fund established under section 248-8.

1	(c) Vehicles subject to the state mileage-based road usage
2	charge defined in subsection (a) shall include all electric
3	vehicles in the State except for vehicles that qualify for any
4	of the exemptions in sections 249-4, 249-5.5, 249-6, and 249-
5	6.5. For the purposes of this section, "electric vehicle" means
6	a vehicle, with four or more wheels, a gross vehicle weight
7	rating less than or equal to ten thousand pounds, and the
8	capability to operate legally at a speed of more than thirty-
9	five miles per hour, that draws propulsion energy exclusively
10	from a battery that can be recharged from an external source of
11	electricity.
12	(d) Until June 30, 2028, owners of electric vehicles as
13	defined in subsection (c) shall be offered a choice to pay a \$70
14	registration surcharge in lieu of the state mileage-based road
15	usage charge.
16	(e) The department of transportation shall develop a long-
17	term mileage-based road usage charge implementation plan that
18	includes findings, recommendations, implementation phase
19	schedules, and proposed legislation for deployment of a state
20	mileage-based road usage charge program to encompass all
21	passenger vehicles and light duty trucks by December 31, 2033.



1	This plan shall also include recommendations on how to ensure
2	compatibility with deployment of mileage-based road usage charge
3	by any county. This plan shall be completed and submitted to
4	the legislature no later than twenty days prior to the convening
5	of the regular session of 2026.
6	(f) Pursuant to its rulemaking authority, the department
7	of transportation shall develop rules for establishing and
8	administering the state mileage-based road usage charge."
9	SECTION 3. Chapter 286, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
10	amended by adding a new section to be appropriately designated
11	and to read as follows:
12	"§286- Hawaii highway safety and modernization council.
13	(a) There is established the Hawaii highway safety and
14	modernization council. The council shall be placed in the
15	department of transportation for administrative purposes. The
16	following or their designated representatives shall be members
17	of the council:
18	(1) The chairpersons of the senate and house of
19	representatives standing committees whose purview is
20	transportation, who shall serve as co-chairpersons;
21	(2) The chief justice;

1	(b) The members of the council shall serve without
2	compensation but shall be reimbursed for expenses, including
3	travel expenses, necessary for the performance of their duties.
4	(c) The Hawaii highway safety and modernization council
5	shall develop goals, metrics, benchmarks, and strategies to
6	reduce the cost of transportation and vehicle miles traveled,
7	improve safety, and achieve other state goals related to ground
8	transportation.
9	(d) The state highway safety council shall advise the
10	governor on matters relating to the programs and activities of
11	the State in the field of highway safety."
12	SECTION 4. Section 249-31, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
13	amended by amending subsection (a) to read as follows:
14	"(a) All vehicles and motor vehicles in the State as
15	defined in section 249-1, including antique motor vehicles,
16	except as otherwise provided in sections 249-4, 249-6, and
17	249-31.5, shall be subject to a \$46 annual vehicle registration
18	fee; provided that [electric vehicles and] alternative fuel
19	vehicles shall pay an annual vehicle registration surcharge fee
20	of \$50, which shall be assessed and collected beginning with the
21	first registration renewal for every [electric vehicle and]

1 alternative fuel vehicle and shall be deposited into the state 2 highway fund established under section 248-8. The fee shall be 3 paid each year together with all other taxes and fees levied by this chapter on a staggered basis as established by each county 4 5 as authorized by section 286-51, and the state registration for 6 that county shall likewise be staggered so that the state 7 registration fee is due and payable at the same time and shall 8 be collected together with the county fee. The state 9 registration fee shall be deemed delinquent if not paid with the 10 county registration fee. The respective counties shall collect 11 this fee together with the vehicle registration tax collected 12 for the county and shall transfer the moneys collected under 13 this section to the State. 14 For the purposes of this subsection, "alternative fuel

15 vehicle" means a vehicle equipped to be powered by a non-

16 petroleum-based fuel, but excludes an electric, electricity-

17 recharged, or hybrid electric motor vehicle."

18 SECTION 5. Section 286-26, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
19 amended by amending subsection (e) to read as follows:

20 "(e) Upon application for a certificate of inspection to
21 be issued for a vehicle or moped, an inspection as prescribed by

1 the director under subsection (q) shall be conducted on the 2 vehicle or moped, and if the vehicle or moped is found to be in 3 a safe operating condition, a certificate of inspection shall be 4 issued upon payment of a fee to be determined by the director. 5 The certificate shall state the effective date, the termination 6 date, the name of the issuing insurance carrier, and the policy 7 number of the motor vehicle insurance identification card for 8 the inspected motor vehicle as specified by section 431:10C-107 9 or state the information contained in the proof of insurance 10 card as specified by section 431:10G-106. For an electric 11 vehicle, the certificate shall also state the odometer reading 12 of the vehicle on the date that the vehicle was inspected. A 13 sticker, authorized by the director, shall be affixed to the 14 vehicle or moped at the time a certificate of inspection is 15 issued. An inspection sticker which has been lost, stolen, or 16 destroyed shall be replaced without reinspection by the 17 inspection station that issued the original inspection sticker 18 upon presentation of the current certificate of inspection; provided that the current certificate of inspection and 19 20 inspection sticker shall not have expired at the time the 21 replacement is requested. The director shall adopt rules to

determine the fee for replacement of lost, stolen, or destroyed
 inspection stickers.

As used in this subsection, "electric vehicle" means a
vehicle that draws propulsion energy from a battery with at
least four kilowatt hours of energy storage capacity that can be
recharged from an external source of electricity."

7 SECTION 6. Section 286-41, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
8 amended by amending subsection (b) to read as follows:

9 "(b) Application for the registration of a vehicle shall 10 be made upon the appropriate form furnished by the director of 11 finance and shall contain the name, occupation, and address of 12 the owner and legal owner; and, if the applicant is a member of 13 the United States naval or military forces, the applicant shall 14 give the organization and station. All applications shall also 15 contain a description of the vehicle, including the name of the 16 maker; the type of fuel for the use of which it is adapted, such 17 as gasoline, diesel oil, liquefied petroleum gas[+], or 18 electricity; the serial or motor number; the date first sold by 19 the manufacturer or dealer; a further description of the vehicle 20 as is called for in the form; and other information as may be 21 required by the director of finance, to establish legal

ownership. A person applying for initial registration of a
 neighborhood electric vehicle shall certify in writing that a
 notice of the operational restrictions applying to the vehicle
 as provided in section 291C-134 are contained on a permanent
 notice attached to or painted on the vehicle in a location that
 is in clear view of the driver."

7 SECTION 7. Section 286-5, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is8 repealed.

9 ["§286-5 State highway safety council. There-is 10 established the Hawaii highway safety council. The director of 11 transportation shall serve as its chairperson. The following or 12 their designated representatives shall be members of the 13 council: the chief justice, the attorney general, the director 14 of health, the superintendent of education, the president of 15 the University of Hawaii, the chairperson of each of the county 16 highway safety councils established under section 286-6, and not 17 more than twenty other persons who shall be appointed by the 18 governor on the basis of their interest in highway safety. 19 The state highway safety council shall advise the governor 20 on matters relating to the programs and activities of the State 21 in the field of highway safety.

2	shall be entitled to reimbursement for necessary expenses while
3	attending meetings and while in discharge of their duties."]
4	SECTION 8. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
5	and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.
6	SECTION 9. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2023;
7	provided that sections 2, 4, 5, and 6 of this Act shall take
8	effect on January 1, 2025.
