A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO VOTING MORE THAN ONCE DURING AN ELECTION.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that existing law
- 2 prohibits voters from voting again after having already voted.
- 3 However, the law does not expressly address the possibility that
- 4 a person could cast a single vote in Hawai'i and an additional
- 5 vote in another state or territory of the United States.
- 6 The purpose of this Act is to clarify the law by expressly
- 7 prohibiting voters from casting more than one vote during any
- 8 election, even if one of those votes is in a state or territory
- 9 of the United States other than Hawai'i.
- 10 SECTION 2. Section 19-3, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 11 amended to read as follows:
- 12 "\\$19-3 Election frauds. The following persons shall be
- 13 deemed guilty of an election fraud:
- 14 (1) Every person who, directly or indirectly, personally
- or through another, gives, procures, or lends, or
- 16 agrees or offers to give, procure, or lend, or who
- endeavors to procure, any money or office or place of

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1		employment or valuable consideration to or for any
2		elector, [or to or for any] person for an elector, [or
3		to or for any] person in order to induce any elector
4		to vote or refrain from voting, or to vote or refrain
5		from voting for any particular person or party, or who
6		does any such act on account of any person having
7		voted or refrained from voting for any particular
8		person at any election;
9	(2)	Every person who advances or pays, or causes to be
10		paid, any money to, or to the use of, any other
11	·	person, with the intent that the money, or any part
12		thereof, shall be expended in bribery at any election,
13		or for any purpose connected with or incidental to any
14	·	election; or who knowingly pays or causes to be paid
15		any money to any person in the discharge or repayment
16		of any money wholly or partly expended in bribery at
17		any election, or for any purpose connected with or
18		incidental to any election;
19	(3)	Every elector who, before, during, or after any
20		election, directly or indirectly, personally or
21		through another, receives, agrees, or contracts for

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	any money, gift, loan, or valuable consideration,
2	office, place, or employment for oneself or any other
3	person for voting or agreeing to vote, or for
4 .	refraining to vote or agreeing to refrain from voting,
5	or for voting or refraining to vote for any particular
5	person or party;

(4) Every person who, directly or indirectly, personally or through another, makes use of, or threatens to make use of, any force, violence, or restraint; or inflicts or threatens to inflict any injury, damage, or loss in any manner, or in any way practices intimidation upon or against any person in order to induce or compel the person to vote or refrain from voting, or to vote or refrain from voting for any particular person or party, at any election, or on account of the person having voted or refrained from voting, or voted or refrained from voting for any particular person or party; or who by abduction, distress, or any device or contrivance impedes, prevents, or otherwise interferes with the free exercise of the elective franchise;

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(5)	Every person who, at any election, votes or attempts
	to vote in the name of any other person, living or
,	dead, or in some fictitious name, or who[, having once
	voted, votes or attempts to vote [again,] more than
	once during any election, regardless of whether one of
	the elections is in a state or territory of the United
	States outside of Hawaii, or knowingly gives or
	attempts to give more than one ballot for the same
•	office at one time of voting; provided that a person
	does not commit an election fraud if the person votes
	once in Hawaii's primary election and also votes in
	the primary election of another state or territory
	during the same year, so long as the person was
	properly registered to vote in all such elections.
•	For the purposes of this paragraph, a person is
	properly registered to vote if the person's residence
	in the state in which they are currently voting was
	acquired with the intent to make that state their
	legal residence with all the accompanying obligations
	therein, and if, at the time of voting, that person is

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1		registered to vote with the office of elections of the
2		state in which they are voting;
3	(6)	Every person who, before or during an election,
4		knowingly publishes a false statement of the
5		withdrawal of any candidate at the election;
6	(7)	Every person who induces or procures any person to
7		withdraw from being a candidate at an election in
8		consideration of any payment or gift or valuable
9		consideration; or of any threat; and every candidate
10		who withdraws from being a candidate in pursuance of
11		such inducement or procurement;
12	(8)	Every public officer by law required to do or perform
13		any act or thing with reference to any of the
14		provisions in any law concerning elections who
15		wilfully fails, neglects, or refuses to do or perform
16		the same, or who is guilty of any wilful violation of
17	·	any of the provisions thereof;
18	(9)	Any person wilfully tampering or attempting to tamper
19		with, disarrange, deface, or impair in any manner
20	٠	whatsoever, or destroy, any voting machine while the
21		same is in use at any election, or who, after the

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1		machine is locked in order to preserve the
2	•	registration or record of any election made by the
3		same, tampers or attempts to tamper with any voting
4		machine;
5	(10)	Every person who, directly or indirectly, personally
6		or through another, wilfully designs, alters,
7		accesses, or programs any electronic voting system to
8		cause the system to inaccurately record, tally, or
9		report votes cast on the electronic voting system;
10	(11)	Every person who assists a voter in the completion of
11		a ballot in violation of section 11-139; and
12	(12)	Every person who knowingly broadcasts, televises,
13		circulates, publishes, distributes, or otherwise
14		communicates, including by electronic means or
15		advertisement, false information about the time, date,
16		place, or means of voting with the purpose of
17		impeding, preventing, or otherwise interfering with
18		the free exercise of the elective franchise."
19	SECT	ION 3. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
20	and stric	ken. New statutory material is underscored.

1 SECTION 4. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.
