A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO CAREER AND TECHNICAL EDUCATION.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that low teacher pay adversely impacts the State's ability to recruit and retain 2 3 quality classroom leaders. A 2020 study conducted by Augenblick, Palaich, and Associates Consulting on behalf of the 4 5 department of education found that when compared with other high cost of living geographic locations, Hawaii teachers are paid 6 \$7,700 to \$26,000 less than their peers, depending on length of 7 service. 8

9 The legislature further finds that there is an increasing 10 demand for capable and qualified employees in Hawaii's business 11 and industry sectors to serve as teachers. Career and technical education teachers with professional industry knowledge and 12 experience provide authentic educational opportunities that 13 14 enable students to obtain industry-specific skills that position them as employable, attractive candidates for high-skill, high-15 wage careers in Hawaii. However, low teacher pay discourages 16 individuals from the business and industry sectors from becoming 17

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teachers. The inability of the department of education to
 recruit and retain teachers with professional industry knowledge
 and experience limits schools' ability to provide career and
 technical education courses.

5 The legislature further finds that instituting differential 6 pay increases led to significant progress in reducing 7 longstanding teacher shortages in other high-demand areas. 8 Providing shortage differential pay increases is critical to 9 strengthening the State's efforts to recruit and retain high-10 quality career and technical education teachers and sustain a 11 strong workforce pipeline in Hawaii.

12 The purpose of this Act is to facilitate statewide and 13 regional economic development, promote career and technical 14 education, address the State's career and technical education 15 teacher workforce shortage, and appropriate funds to support 16 career and technical education.

SECTION 2. Chapter 304A, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is amended by adding two new sections to part I, subpart c, to be appropriately designated and to read as follows:

20 "<u>\$304A-A</u> Board's power and authority; nonfederal funds. 21 The board may cooperate with the legislature to advise on

7		received, including through legislative appropriation,
8		for the annual statewide career and technical
9		education strategic and implementation plan, that in
10		the board's judgment and discretion will best serve
11		the interests of career and technical education in the
12		State and carry out the intent, purposes, and
13		provisions of any applicable federal and state
14		legislation;
15	(5)	Establish and determine, by general rule, the
16		qualifications to be possessed by persons teaching
17		agricultural, trade, industrial, and home economics
18		subjects in the colleges or schools coming under the
19		provisions of any federal and state law; and

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1	(6) Enforce rules and regulations concerning the granting
2	of certificates and licenses to teachers and to
3	certified teachers.
4	The board may delegate some of its responsibilities relating to
5	the establishment of qualifications for and certification or
6	licensing of career and technical teachers. The board shall
7	make an annual report to the governor and the legislature no
8	later than twenty days prior to the convening of each regular
9	session describing the conditions and progress of career and
10	technical education during the previous year and include therein
11	an itemized statement showing the receipts and expenditures of
12	all moneys used in connection with career and technical
13	education.
14	§304A-B Workforce development pathways. (a) The state
15	board for career and technical education, in collaboration with
16	the department of business, economic development, and tourism
17	and department of labor and industrial relations, shall develop
18	and implement workforce development pathways that align with
19	regional economic development, assets, and facilities and
20	address statewide initiatives and mandates.

SECTION 4. Section 304A-302, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
 amended to read as follows:

"[4]\$304A-302[4] Board's power and [authority.] authority;
federal funds. The board may cooperate with the United States
Department of Education in the administration of the provisions
of the Acts of Congress mentioned in section [4]304A-2403[4],
and may do all things necessary to entitle the State to receive
the benefits of each of the respective funds appropriated by the
Acts including:

10 Represent the State in any and all matters arising out (1)11 of or connected with the administration of the Acts of 12 Congress insofar as the same shall apply to the State; 13 (2) Represent the State in any or all matters in reference 14 to the expenditure, distribution, and disbursements of 15 moneys received from the Acts of Congress; Designate [such] colleges, schools, departments, or 16 (3) 17 classes as may be entitled to participate in the 18 benefits of moneys received from the appropriations 19 made in the Acts of Congress as in its judgment and 20 discretion will best subserve the interests of career

1 and technical education in the State and carry out the 2 spirit, purposes, and provisions of the Acts; 3 (4) Establish and determine, by general rule, the 4 qualifications to be possessed by persons teaching agricultural, trade, industrial, and home economics 5 6 subjects in the colleges or schools coming under the provisions of the Acts of Congress in the State; and 7 8 (5) Enforce rules and regulations concerning the granting of certificates and licenses to [such] teachers and to 9 10 certificate [such] teachers.

11 The board may delegate some of its responsibilities relating to 12 the establishment of qualifications for and certification or 13 licensing of career and technical teachers. The board shall 14 make an annual report to the governor and the legislature no 15 later than twenty days prior to the convening of each regular 16 session describing the conditions and progress of career and 17 technical education during the year and include therein an 18 itemized statement showing the receipts and expenditures of all 19 moneys used in connection with career and technical education." 20 SECTION 5. Section 304A-303, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 21 amended to read as follows:

There is appropriated out of the general 11 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ or so 12 much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2023-2024 and 13 the same sum or so much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal 14 year 2024-2025 for the development and implementation of career 15 and technical education workforce development pathways as 16 established in section 304A-B, Hawaii Revised Statutes, pursuant 17 to section 2 of this Act. 18 The sums appropriated shall be expended by the University 19 of Hawaii for the purposes of this Act. 20 SECTION 7. There is appropriated out of the general 21 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ or so

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much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2023-2024 and 1 2 the same sum or so much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2024-2025 for differential pay increases for career and 3 technical education teachers employed in special education, 4 hard-to-staff geographic locations, and the Hawaiian language 5 6 medium education program; provided that the teachers meet the requirements for a standard limited license in career and 7 8 technical education issued by the Hawaii teacher standards 9 board, as negotiated between the superintendent of education and 10 the exclusive representative of collective bargaining unit (5) 11 in a memorandum of understanding; provided further that no funds 12 shall be released until the memorandum of understanding between 13 the superintendent of education and the exclusive representative 14 of collective bargaining unit (5) is executed.

15 The sums appropriated shall be expended by the department 16 of education for the purposes of this Act.

SECTION 8. There is appropriated out of the general revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ or so much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2023-2024 and the same sum or so much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2024-2025 for differential pay increases for career and

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technical education teachers employed in special education, 1 hard-to-staff geographic locations, and the Hawaiian language 2 3 medium education program; provided that the teachers meet the requirements for a standard limited license in career and 4 technical education issued by the Hawaii teacher standards 5 board, as negotiated between the superintendent of education and 6 7 the exclusive representative of collective bargaining unit (5) 8 in a memorandum of understanding; provided further that no funds 9 shall be released until the memorandum of understanding between 10 the superintendent of education and the exclusive representative 11 of collective bargaining unit (5) is executed.

12 The sums appropriated shall be expended by the department 13 of education to the state public charter school commission for 14 the purposes of this Act.

15 SECTION 9. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed16 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.

Description:

Authorizes the State Board for Career and Technical Education to cooperate with the Legislature to advise on provisions of all nonfederal funds received that are earmarked for career and technical education. Requires the State Board for Career and Technical Education, in collaboration with the Department of Business, Economic Development, and Tourism and Department of Labor and Industrial Relations, to develop and implement workforce development pathways. Amends the membership composition of the Career and Technical Education Coordinating Advisory Council. Requires annual reports to the Legislature. Appropriates funds for the development and implementation of workforce development pathways and differential pay increases for certain career and technical education teachers.
