A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO AFFORDABLE HOUSING.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that the State is 2 suffering from an acute shortage of affordable housing, with the 3 rapidly rising cost of housing in the State consistently pricing 4 out local renters and homeowners. Resulting from barriers that hinder development of new housing such as geographic 5 6 limitations, lack of major infrastructure, and government 7 regulation, the legislature recognizes that the State's ongoing 8 housing crisis warrants a thorough examination of every 9 impediment to the development of affordable housing, including 10 access to potable water.

11 The legislature also finds that under article XI, section 12 VII, of the Hawaii State Constitution, "[t]he State has an 13 obligation to protect, control, and regulate the use of Hawaii's 14 water resources for the benefit of its people." Thus, the 15 Hawaii water plan, established under the state water code 16 pursuant to chapter 174C, Hawaii Revised Statutes, implements a

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1	comprehensive water resources plan to address supply and		
2	conservation of the State's water resources.		
3	The Hawaii water plan consists of four parts, with a		
4	different entity responsible for preparing each part, including:		
5	(1)	A water resource protection plan, prepared by the	
6		commission on water resource management;	
7	(2)	A water use and development plan, prepared by each	
8		county;	
9	(3)	A state water projects plan, prepared by the	
10		engineering division of the department of land and	
11		natural resources; and	
12	(4)	A water quality plan, prepared by the department of	
13		health.	
14	Each component considers the other aspects of the Hawaii water		
15	plan, the	refore requiring the cooperation amongst the various	
16	entities	involved.	
17	The	legislature additionally finds that in recent years,	
18	determinations made by the commission on water resource		
19	management have conflicted with the recommended water resource		
20	distribution determined in various counties' water use and		
21	development plans, which align future demand with the county's		

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land use plans, the community's priorities, climate change
 impacts, and other considerations. The legislature believes
 that the counties are well-equipped to determine water
 allocation to future land use, as prescribed by the Hawaii water
 plan, to maintain consistency with its respective county zoning
 and planning policies.

Accordingly, the purpose of this Act is to establish a
working group that will ascertain the State's available water
resources to further plan for the development of affordable
housing.

SECTION 2. (a) There is established a working group to ascertain and address state watershed management to enable the development and construction of affordable housing projects across the State.

15 The working group shall be placed in the department of land 16 and natural resources for administrative purposes.

17 (b) The working group shall conduct an inventory of all 18 available water resources statewide and identify appropriate 19 aquifer replenishment as it pertains to each county water use 20 and development plan, including the capacity for affordable 21 housing development.



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1	(c)	The working group shall address and make	
2	recommendations on:		
3	(1)	Mitigating impacts arising from affordable housing	
4		development;	
5	(2)	Projected water usage following the completion of	
6		affordable housing projects in each county;	
7	(3)	The adoption of rules for water allocation for each	
8		county;	
9	(4)	Defining the role of the commission on water resource	
10		management in relation to affordable housing	
11		development statewide; and	
12	(5)	The impact of federal government obligations on the	
13		development of new water sources for affordable	
14		housing.	
15	(d)	The working group shall consist of the following	
16	members:		
17	(1)	The chairs of the senate and house of representative	
18		standing committees on housing, who shall serve as	
19		co-chairpersons of the working group;	
20	(2)	The executive director of the Hawaii housing finance	
21		and development corporation, or their designee;	



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1	(3)	The chairperson of the commission on water resource
2		management, or their designee;
3	(4)	The chief of the department of health clean water
4		branch, or their designee;
5	(5)	The chief engineer of the department of land and
6		natural resources engineering division, or their
7		designee;
8	(6)	The directors of each county planning department, or
9		their designees;
10	(7)	The directors of each county housing department, or
11		their designees; and
12	(8)	The chief engineers of each county board of water
13		supply, or their designee.
14	(e)	The working group shall submit a report of its
15	findings a	and recommendations, including any proposed
16	legislati	on, to the legislature no later than twenty days prior
17	to the co	nvening of the regular session of 2024.
18	(f)	The task force shall dissolve on June 30, 2024.
19	SECT	ION 3. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.
