## A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO DENTISTRY LICENSES.

#### BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 Section 447-1.5, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is SECTION 1. 2 amended by amending subsection (a) to read as follows: 3 "(a) The board of dentistry may issue, without 4 examination, a community service license to practice dental 5 hygiene in the employment of a federally qualified health 6 center, Native Hawaiian health care system, community health 7 center, rural health clinic, mobile dental outreach program, or 8 post-secondary dental auxiliary training program accredited by 9 the American Dental Association Commission on Dental 10 Accreditation. Community service licensees under this section 11 shall abide by the requirements and conditions placed upon those 12 fully licensed under this chapter. 13 Eligible candidates shall: 14 Provide copies of documentation and credentials that (1)include but are not limited to: 15 16 A diploma or certificate of graduation from a (A) dental hygiene college accredited by or that has 17





1		a reciprocal agreement with the American Dental

3		recognized and approved by the board; and
4		(B) Either of the following:
5		(i) A certificate or other evidence satisfactory
6		to the board of having passed the

10		(ii) Evidence of active clinical dental hygiene
11		practice of not less than one thousand hours
12		per year for the three years immediately

14	(2)	Provide a copy of an active, unrestricted dental
15		hygiene practice license from another state;
16	(3)	Disclose to the board of dentistry all previous and
17		pending legal or regulatory action relating to claims
18		of malpractice, personal, or professional misconduct;

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1	(4) Pay applicable registration fees, which shall be one
2	half of the prevailing biennial registration fee for
3	dental hygienists.
4	No person who after July 2, 2004, has failed to pass the license
5	examination administered under this chapter may be issued a
6	community service dental hygiene license."
7	SECTION 2. Section 448-9, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
8	amended to read as follows:
9	"§448-9 Application for licensure. Any person of eighteen
10	years or more shall be eligible for licensure upon submission
11	of:
12	(1) An application to the executive officer of the board
13	not later than forty-five days prior to the date of
14	the scheduled examination;
15	(2) Application and examination fees; and
16	(3) Documentation and credentials that shall include but
17	are not limited to the following:
18	(A) A diploma or certificate of graduation from a
19	dental college accredited by the American Dental
20	Association Commission on Dental Accreditation,
21	recognized and approved by the board; and



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1	(B) A certificate or other evidence satisfactory to
2	the board of having passed parts I and II of the
3	National Board Dental Examination $[+]$ or the
4	Integrated National Board Dental Examination."
5	SECTION 3. Section 448-9.6, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
6	amended by amending subsection (a) to read as follows:
7	"(a) The board of dentistry may issue, without
8	examination, a community service license to practice dentistry
9	in the employment of the department of health, a federally
10	qualified health center, Native Hawaiian health systems center,
11	community health center, rural health clinic, mobile dental
12	outreach program, or post-secondary dental auxiliary training
13	program accredited by the American Dental Association Commission
14	on Dental Accreditation. Community service licensees under this
15	section shall abide by the requirements and conditions placed
16	upon those fully licensed under this chapter.
17	Eligible candidates shall:
18	(1) Provide copies of documentation and credentials that
19	include but are not limited to:
20	(A) A diploma or certificate of graduation from a
21	dental college accredited by <u>or that has a</u>



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1		reciprocal agreement with the American Dental
2		Association Commission on Dental Accreditation,
3		recognized and approved by the board; and
4		(B) Either of the following:
5		(i) A certificate or other evidence satisfactory
6		to the board of having passed part II of the
7		National Board Dental Examination <u>or the</u>
8		Integrated National Board Dental Examination
9		within five years of the date of request; or
10		(ii) Evidence of active practice of clinical
11		dentistry of not less than one thousand
12		hours per year for the three years
13		immediately prior to the date of request;
14	(2)	Provide a copy of an active, unrestricted dental
15		practice license from another state;
16	(3)	Disclose to the board of dentistry all previous and
17		pending legal or regulatory action relating to claims
18		of malpractice, or personal or professional
19		misconduct; and



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1 (4) Pay applicable registration fees, which shall be one 2 half of the prevailing biennial registration fee for 3 dentistry. 4 No person who after July 2, 2004, has failed to pass the license 5 examination administered under this chapter shall have the 6 benefit of a community service dental license." 7 SECTION 4. Section 448-12, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 8 amended by amending subsection (b) to read as follows: 9 "[+](b)[+] The board of dentistry may issue a temporary 10 license without examination to any person otherwise qualified to 11 be examined, who is enrolled in a post-doctoral residency 12 program that is accredited and recognized by the American Dental 13 Association Commission on Dental Accreditation. Eligible 14 candidates include graduates from a dental college accredited 15 by, or that has a reciprocal agreement with, the American Dental 16 Association Commission on Dental Accreditation that is 17 recognized and approved by the board. The temporary license 18 shall authorize the person to whom the license is issued to 19 practice dentistry exclusively under the auspices of the dental 20 residency program and shall be in force until the earliest of 21 the following occurs:



1	(1) The date the person completes or leaves the residency
2	program; or
3	(2) The date on which the board revokes the temporary
4	license;
5	provided that the board may revoke the temporary license at any
6	time for cause."
7	SECTION 5. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
8	and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.
9	SECTION 6. This Act shall take effect on June 30, 3000.



#### Report Title:

Dentistry; Dental Hygiene; Community Health Centers; Rural Health Centers; Mobile Dental Outreach Programs; Community Service License; Temporary License; Licensure Requirements

#### Description:

Adds community health centers, rural health centers, and mobile dental outreach programs to the list of eligible organizations at which those with a community service license may practice. Allows dental hygiene and dental college graduates who have graduated from educational programs that have a reciprocal agreement with the American Dental Association Commission on Dental Accreditation to apply for temporary or community service licenses. Expands eligibility for a community service license to practice dentistry to those candidates who have passed the Integrated National Board Dental Examination within five years of the date of request. Allows an applicant for a licensure to practice dentistry to submit evidence to the board of dentistry that the applicant passed the Integrated National Board Dental Examination. Effective 6/30/3000. (HD1)
