A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO CAST BALLOTS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that voters eligible to
- 2 vote who cast their ballot and subsequently become ineligible to
- 3 vote due to death or other reasons should have their vote
- 4 counted. A person voting by mail expects their ballot to be
- 5 tabulated when they place it in the mail or deposit it at a
- 6 place of deposit. If the voter is eligible to vote at the time
- 7 the ballot is cast, subsequent events that may make the voter
- 8 ineligible are irrelevant.
- 9 The legislature further finds that Act 10, Session Laws of
- 10 Hawaii 2019 (Act 10), repealed the law that invalidated the cast
- 11 ballots of absentee voters who died before the opening of the
- 12 polls on election day. Act 10 also added language to the
- 13 absentee voter and military-overseas voter laws providing that
- 14 these voters' ballots would remain valid even if the voter
- 15 became ineligible to vote after casting their ballot. However,
- 16 the State's vote by mail process commenced with the 2020
- 17 election without similar language establishing procedures for

- 1 validating mail-in ballots cast by eligible voters who
- 2 thereafter became ineligible, including those who became
- 3 ineligible by death.
- 4 The purpose of this Act is to quarantee the vote of
- 5 eligible voters who cast their ballot and then subsequently die
- 6 or otherwise become ineligible before election day.
- 7 SECTION 2. Chapter 11, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is amended
- 8 by adding a new section to be appropriately designated and to
- 9 read as follows:
- 10 "§11- Validity of cast mail-in ballot where voter later
- 11 becomes ineligible. The mail-in ballot of any voter who was
- 12 eligible to vote at the time the ballot was cast shall not be
- 13 deemed invalid solely because the voter became ineligible to
- 14 vote, including by death of the voter, after casting the ballot.
- 15 For the purposes of this section, "cast" means that the voter
- 16 has:
- 17 (1) Returned the return identification envelope containing
- the optional secrecy envelope or secrecy sleeve with
- the marked ballot in any manner permitted pursuant to
- 20 section 11-104(c); or
- 21 (2) Completed voting in person at a voter service center."

1 SECTION 3. Section 15-13.5, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 2 amended to read as follows: 3 "§15-13.5 [Eligibility of voter after absentee ballot 4 cast.] Validity of cast absentee ballot where voter later 5 becomes ineligible. The absentee ballot of any voter who was 6 eligible to vote at the time the ballot was cast shall not be 7 deemed invalid solely because the voter became ineligible to vote, including by death of the voter, after casting the ballot. 8 9 For the purposes of this section, "cast" means that the voter 10 has: 11 Deposited the absentee ballot in the mail for ballots (1)12 mailed in accordance with section 15-9; 13 (2) Delivered the absentee ballot to the appropriate 14 county clerk or polling place in accordance with section 15-9; or 15 16 (3) Completed voting in person at an absentee polling 17 place." SECTION 4. Section 15D-10.5, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 18 19 amended to read as follows: 20 "[{]\$15D-10.5[} Eligibility of covered voter after ballot

cast.] Validity of cast military-overseas ballot where covered

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- 1 voter later becomes ineligible. The military-overseas ballot of
- 2 any covered voter who was eligible to vote at the time the
- 3 ballot was cast in accordance with this chapter shall not be
- 4 deemed invalid solely because the covered voter became
- 5 ineligible to vote, including by death of the voter, after
- 6 casting the ballot."
- 7 SECTION 5. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
- 8 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.
- 9 SECTION 6. This Act shall take effect on June 30, 3000.
