A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO CHILD WELFARE.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECT	ION 1. The purpose of this Act is to:
2	(1)	Require the department of human services to collect
3		and analyze data to determine the impact of expanding
4		post-permanency services to families receiving
5		benefits from the adoption assistance program and
6		report its findings and recommendation to the
7		legislature before the convening of the regular
8		session of 2025; and
9	(2)	Appropriate funds to the department of human services
10		for the procurement of contracted services to provide
11		additional support, resources, and monitoring of
12		families receiving benefits from the State's adoption
13		assistance program for the purposes of assisting with
14		family strengthening and the maintenance of a safe
15		home environment for adopted children.
16	SECTION 2. The department of human services shall collect	
17	7 and analyze data to determine the impact of expanding	

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post-permanency services to families receiving benefits from the adoption assistance program and shall submit a report of its findings and recommendations, including any proposed legislation, to the legislature no later than twenty days prior to the convening of the regular session of 2025.

6 SECTION 3. There is appropriated out of the general 7 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ or so 8 much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2023-2024 and 9 the same sum or so much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal 10 year 2024-2025 for the procurement of contracted services to 11 provide additional support, resources, and monitoring of 12 families receiving benefits from the State's adoption assistance 13 program for the purposes of assisting with family strengthening 14 and the maintenance of a safe home environment for adopted 15 children, to be expended as follows:

16 (1) \$ for the development and maintenance of
17 necessary information technology systems, including
18 the establishment of full time equivalent
19 (FTE) positions;
20 (2) \$ to increase compensation to fill vacancies
21 and retain employees in existing child welfare

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1 services branch investigator, case manager, and social 2 worker positions; provided that any increase in 3 compensation shall be subject to collective bargaining 4 with the objective of expeditiously filling all 5 vacancies;

(3) 6 Ŝ for the department of human services to 7 contract with a third party for enhanced permanency 8 support services, including additional training for 9 resource caregivers, wellness visits within a year of 10 adoption or guardianship of children formerly in 11 foster care, respite care, and enhanced supportive 12 services to assist with family strengthening and 13 maintenance of a safe home environment for adopted 14 children; and

15 (4) \$ for the establishment of full time
16 equivalent (FTE) planner or project specialist
17 position to administer and monitor additional service
18 contracts and assist with additional service
19 coordination, data collection, and analysis of the new
20 program.

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The sums appropriated shall be expended by the department
 of human services for the purposes of this Act.
 SECTION 4. This Act shall take effect on June 30, 3000;
 provided that section 3 of this Act shall take effect on July 1,
 2023.
