A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO THE HAWAII FARM TO FOOD BANK PROGRAM.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The purpose of this Act is to establish the
- 2 Hawaii farm to food bank program and provide a source of funding
- 3 for the program to fund state food banks to purchase, store, and
- 4 transport food grown or produced in Hawaii to local communities
- 5 for distribution. This program will serve the State's food
- 6 needs, provide local food producers with a market to support
- 7 their operations, and keep moneys circulating within the State
- 8 to boost the local economy.
- 9 SECTION 2. Chapter 371K, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 10 amended by adding a new part to be appropriately designated and
- 11 to read as follows:
- 12 "PART . HAWAII FARM TO FOOD BANK PROGRAM
- 13 §371K-A Hawaii farm to food bank program. (a) There is
- 14 established the Hawaii farm to food bank program to be
- 15 administered by the office of community services within the
- 16 department of labor and industrial relations to relieve food
- 17 shortages experienced by residents of the State, including low-

- 1 income and unemployed families and individuals, by distributing
- 2 fresh locally grown or produced food to those persons.
- 3 (b) The office of community services shall make moneys
- 4 available to food banks located in the State pursuant to
- 5 subsection (a) using moneys in the Hawaii food assistance
- 6 program special fund established pursuant to section 371K-B.
- 7 (c) Food banks that receive moneys pursuant to this
- 8 section shall use the moneys to purchase, store, and transport
- 9 food grown or produced in the State to be distributed to
- 10 recipients at no cost to the recipients.
- 11 (d) For the purposes of this section:
- "Food bank" has the same meaning as in title 7 United
- 13 States Code Section 7501(5).
- "Fresh locally grown or produced food" means fruits,
- 15 vegetables, nuts, coffee, eggs, poultry, and poultry products,
- 16 livestock products, milk and milk products, aquacultural, and
- 17 maricultural products, and horticultural products, one hundred
- 18 per cent grown, raised, and harvested in Hawaii.
- 19 §371K-B Hawaii food assistance program special fund. (a)
- 20 There is established in the state treasury the Hawaii food

- 1 assistance program special fund into which shall be deposited
- 2 the following:
- 3 (1) Appropriations by the legislature to the special fund;
- 4 (2) Gifts, donations, and grants from public agencies and
- 5 private persons; and
- 6 (3) Interest accrued from moneys in the special fund.
- 7 (b) Moneys in the special fund shall be used for programs
- 8 to provide hunger relief to those in need.
- 9 (c) Moneys deposited into the special fund shall not lapse
- 10 to the credit of the general fund.
- 11 (d) Expenditures from the special fund shall be authorized
- 12 and administered by the office of community services for
- 13 purposes of the Hawaii farm to food bank program.
- 14 (e) The special fund shall not be subject to section
- 15 36-27, 36-30, or 37-53.
- 16 (f) All procurements executed pursuant to this part shall
- 17 be exempt from the requirements of chapters 103D and 103F;
- 18 provided that the exemption shall not apply to goods, services,
- 19 or construction that directly benefit the office of community
- 20 services, such as office computers, supplies, furniture,

- 1 flooring construction, consulting services, and any other
- 2 administrative or operational needs."
- 3 SECTION 3. Section 36-27, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 4 amended by amending subsection (a) to read as follows:
- 5 "(a) Except as provided in this section, and
- 6 notwithstanding any other law to the contrary, from time to
- 7 time, the director of finance, for the purpose of defraying the
- 8 prorated estimate of central service expenses of government in
- 9 relation to all special funds, except the:
- 10 (1) Special out-of-school time instructional program fund
- under section 302A-1310;
- 12 (2) School cafeteria special funds of the department of
- 13 education;
- 14 (3) Special funds of the University of Hawaii;
- 15 (4) Convention center enterprise special fund under

- 1 SECTION 6. There is appropriated out of the Hawaii food
- 2 assistance special fund the sum of \$5,000,000 or so much thereof
- 3 as may be necessary for fiscal year 2023-2024, with such moneys
- 4 to be used consistent with the Hawaii food assistance program
- 5 special fund.
- 6 The sum appropriated shall be expended by the department of
- 7 labor and industrial relations; provided that the office of
- 8 community services may retain ten per cent of the appropriation
- 9 for its administrative costs in entering into and overseeing
- 10 contracts adopted pursuant to section 371K-A, Hawaii Revised
- 11 Statutes.
- 12 SECTION 7. In codifying the new sections added by section
- 13 2 of this Act, the revisor of statutes shall substitute
- 14 appropriate section numbers for the letters used in designating
- 15 the new sections in this Act.
- 16 SECTION 8. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
- 17 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.
- 18 SECTION 9. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2023.
