## A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO COMMERCIAL VEHICLES.

## BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

| 11 | (2) The commercial vehicle is in the process of overtaking      |
| 12 | and passing another vehicle proceeding in the same              |
| 13 | direction under the rules governing such movement.              |
| 14 | (b) This section shall not apply to commercial vehicles         |
| 15 | occupying the left lane for the purpose of turning left or      |
| 16 | exiting, or preparing to turn left or exit.                     |
| 17 | (c) For the purposes of this section, "commercial vehicle"      |
| 18 | shall have the same meaning as in section 291-11.5. "Commercial |

- 1 vehicle" does not include buses or van pools operated by the
- 2 counties."
- 3 SECTION 2. New statutory material is underscored.
- 4 SECTION 3. This Act shall take effect on January 1, 2024.

Oversized Commercial Vehicles; Left Lane; Prohibition

Prohibits certain oversized commercial vehicles from driving in the far left lane on roadways with three or more lanes for traffic moving in the same direction, subject to certain exceptions. Effective 1/1/2024. (CD1)
