A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO AGRICULTURE.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECT	ION 1. (a) There is established within the University
2	of Hawaii	's Leeward community college, in collaboration with the
3	Universit	y of Hawaii college of tropical agriculture and human
4	resources	, a farm succession pilot program, which shall be a
5	five-year	pilot program to further the knowledge and technical
6	skills of	young farmers.
7	(b)	The farm succession pilot program shall:
8	(1)	Encourage matchmaking between incoming and outgoing
9		farmers to ensure succession of agricultural lands and
10		productive resources;
11	(2)	Encourage matchmaking between recently trained farmers
12		and available jobs in agriculture and food systems;
13	(3)	Provide technical assistance and coordination to
14		assist prospective farmers with access to land,
15	·	financing, and counseling, and with developing
16		business planning, business management, and grant
17		writing skills;

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Offer and fund programs that provide education and 1 (4) 2 training to beginning farmers and ranchers and 3 socially disadvantaged farmers and ranchers, including agricultural rehabilitation and vocational training 4 5 programs; 6 Advance land partnerships, such as farm incubator (5) 7 programs and educational programs on commercial farms 8 that teach agricultural and business skills; and 9 (6) Encourage and advance native Hawaiian participation in

10 farming and ranching through partnerships with the11 office of Hawaiian affairs.

(c) Leeward community college may consult with any public or private entity, including the Hawaii Good Food Alliance, Hawaii Farm Bureau, Hawaii Farmers Union United, University of Hawaii's GoFarm Hawaii program, and office of Hawaiian affairs, and representatives therefrom, to carry out its duties under contract with the pilot program established pursuant to this Act.

19 (d) Leeward community college, in collaboration with the
20 University of Hawaii college of tropical agriculture and human
21 resources, shall submit a report of its findings and

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recommendations, including any proposed legislation, to the
 legislature no later than twenty days prior to the convening of
 the regular session of 2029.

SECTION 2. There is appropriated out of the general 4 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ or so 5 much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2023-2024 and 6 the same sum or so much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal 7 year 2024-2025 for the implementation of the farm succession 8 pilot program established under section 1 of this Act, which 9 shall include an allocation of \$ for the establishment 10 cf four full-time equivalent (4.0 FTE) staff positions for the 11 farm succession pilot program. 12

13 The sums appropriated shall be expended by Leeward14 community college for the purposes of this Act.

15 SECTION 3. There is appropriated out of the general 16 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ or so 17 much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2023-2024 and 18 the same sum or so much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal 19 year 2024-2025 for the extension of the farmer apprentice 20 mentoring program established by Act 304, Session Laws of Hawaii 2022.

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1	The sums appropriated shall be expended by the department
2	cf agriculture for the purposes of Act 304, Session Laws of
3	Hawaii 2022.

4 SECTION 4. This Act shall take effect on June 30, 3000.
