A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO EDUCATION.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that the school
- 2 facilities authority is tasked with an important mission to
- 3 ensure the development, planning, and construction of all public
- 4 schools in the State. By ensuring that each public school's
- 5 facilities provide students, educators, and communities with
- 6 high quality and healthy learning environments, the school
- 7 facilities authority actively supports public education.
- 8 However, for the school facilities authority to fulfill its
- 9 mission to support public education in the State, the school
- 10 facilities authority requires effective leadership.
- 11 The legislature further finds that other agencies
- 12 administratively attached to the department of education, such
- 13 as the executive office on early learning, the state public
- 14 charter school commission, and the state library system, require
- 15 their respective boards to appoint their executive director.
- 16 However, the school facilities authority executive director is
- 17 appointed by the governor, with the advice and consent of the



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- 1 senate. As a result, the selection of the executive director of
- 2 the school facilities authority is not consistent with other
- 3 similar agencies. To promote uniformity, the school facilities
- 4 authority executive director should be appointed by the
- 5 authority's board members.
- 6 Therefore, the purpose of this Act is to authorize the
- 7 school facilities authority board to appoint the executive
- 8 director of the school facility authority.
- 9 SECTION 2. Section 302A-1702, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 10 amended by amending subsection (b) to read as follows:
- "(b) The school facilities authority board shall [employ]
- 12 appoint an executive director exempt from chapters 76 and 89.
- 13 [The governor shall appoint the executive director in the manner
- 14 prescribed in section 26-34; provided that the executive
- 15 director's term shall be for six years, which shall commence on
- 16 the day the senate advises and consents to the executive
- 17 director's nomination and the executive director shall not be
- 18 limited in the number of terms served. If a vacancy occurs
- 19 during a term, the governor shall appoint an interim executive
- 20 director whose appointment shall expire if the senate does not
- 21 advise and consent to the nomination of an executive director at

- 1 the next regular session of the legislature after the vacancy
- 2 occurs.] The salary of the executive director shall be set by
- 3 the school facilities board and the executive director shall be
- 4 included in any benefit program generally applicable to the
- 5 officers and employees of the State."
- 6 SECTION 3. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
- 7 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.
- 8 SECTION 4. This Act shall take effect on June 30, 3000.
